

# 7 MARKS FALL AT MT. SAC; FT. MCARTHUR TEAM 'FAILS'

Fourteen hours of competition in 105 events Friday produced seven meet records and set the stage for today's world-class portion of the 11th annual Mt. San Antonio Relays.

The setting was perfect Friday with barely a breath of air to stir the summer-like conditions.

Four milers from Valley JC set a national junior college record of 17:00.4 in

the seldom-run four-mile relay. Three of them, Mark Covert (4:17.1), Bob King (4:20.1) and Mike Wagenbach (4:11.1) ran their lifetime bests, while Jim Estes anchored with a 4:12.1.

Second place Pasadena ran 17:07.2, also well under the old national mark of 17:10.6, set last year by Golden West.

Cal Western set a college distance medley relay record but the U.S. Army team from Ft. MacArthur failed in its quest to regain the American record it lost last week to Kansas in the same event.

Slow early legs by Dave Adkins (48.6) and Jim Kemp (1:52.3) killed off any chance the soldiers had to threaten Kansas' 9:33.0, run last Saturday in the Kansas Relays. Tom Von Ruden, who was on the Ft. MacArthur team which ran 9:33.4 to set the U.S. record at Mt. San Antonio last year, went the 1,320 in 2:57.1 and Bob Day followed with a solo 4:04.4 mile. They finished in 9:42.4.

Kent Andersson, an exchange student from Sweden, ran the mile in 4:05.6 to anchor Cal Western's record-breaking unit, which was timed in 9:57.0. Andersson, who hopes to earn a spot on the Swedish national team, came back later to run a 1:51.9 half mile in the two-mile relay.

San Jose's John Powell broke his own year-old college discus mark with a spin of 179-11. It was exactly one foot better than his 1968 effort.

Fresno Pacific's team of Larry Salles, Jim Farmer, Reggie Davis and John Veal set a college 440 relay record of 41.1.

Two high school youngsters, two miler Fred Ritcherson of Salesian and Bill Sims of Whittier, outshone many of their elders.

Ritcherson, with a withering stretch kick, won the two mile in 9:05.8, the best prep time in the country this year. Defend-

Two fine doubles were by Compton's Gary O'Sullivan (54-8 1/2 and 164-9 in the weights) and an unusual 200-foot javelin throw and 48-5 triple jump by Mt. San Antonio's Rufus Scruggs.

Today the Olympic caliber athletes take over in the tidy little stadium on the Mt. San Antonio College campus in Walnut. Fifteen world records have been set in past meets here and today's cast may provide more.

Six Olympic gold medalists are in meet director Hilmer Lodge's program.

Entered today are Bill Toomey (decathlon), Bob Beamon (long jump), Al Oerter (discus), Willie Davenport (high hurdles), Lee Evans (400 meters) and Ronnie Ray Smith (400 meter relay).

Toomey will be in the two-day decathlon along with Olympians Rick Sloan and Paul Herman, plus John Warkentin, Dave Thoreson and John Dobroth. The decathlon will continue Sunday morning, starting at 10 a.m.

The meet opens at 11 a.m. with the decathlon 100 meters, with the first open event at 12:30 p.m.

# Hoosier Soph Goodrich Runs 9.2 at Drake

DES MOINES (AP)—Indiana University sophomore Mike Goodrich, with a near world record 9.2 clocking in the 100-yard dash, led a meet record-smashing opening of the 60th Drake Relays Friday.

Goodrich, a halfback in football, shattered the 13-year-old Drake mark of 9.4 in the preliminaries for today's finals. The wind was 3.99 m.p.h., under the allowable of 4.47 m.p.h. At other times the wind gust-ed as high as 20 to 35 m.p.h.
