11th Hour Gaucho NCS Win; Black Hospitalized

Faced with a situation where it had to win an event to win the meet, El Cerrito High School came through in the mile relay and pushed its point total to 29 to capture the 55th North Coast Section track and field championship yesterday at California State College in Hayward.

lege in Hayward.

Berkeley, which probably lost the title by dropping the baton during morning trials for the 440 relay, finished one point back despite Kirk Davis leading a one-two low hurdle finish in 18.9, John Dean's 4:17.5 mile victory and the eighth 14-foot pole vault by Sam Hampton.

With non-finishing miler

With non-finishing miler Buck Black hospitalized by a stomach disorder and thereby unable to run in the final event, Pittsburg wound up third with 25 points.

The Pirates, with 220-winner Ralph Ligons turning in a great anchor leg, accounted for the only meet record with a 42.2 clocking in the 440 relay. It is the third fastest time in history by an Eastbay prep quartet.

Evencio Hurtado of Tennyson equaled the area's fifth best two-mile time in 9:22.4, and runnerup Bill Rice of El

and runnerup Bill Rice of El Cerrito tied for eighth on the all-time list at 9:24.5.

The Gauchos, who trailed throughout the competition, also missed a first place in the 880 when Clayton Valley's Bill Boze out-legged Dave Wood in 1:54.5. It was one-tenth of a second off the Eagle's career best.

El Cerrito coach Hale Roach, whose teams now have

Roach, whose teams now have won four North Coast titles and two in three years, credited Mike Palomino's 4:20.9 fifth place in the mile as "the point that did it."

The big surprise came in the high jump where Dave Larson of Monte Vista won at 6-61/4, two inches higher than

his previous best.

Another upset was Roger
McGill of Richmond's Kennedy beating Ligons in the 100, which finally got under way after two jumps and three false starts, and the 23-foot, three quarter-inch long jump triumph by Dan Ferrario of San Lorenzo.

Bill Hammett of Castro Valley, who seems to improve with each race, got off to a beautiful start and held his lead for a 14.3 high hurdles decision.

Jon Gledhill of Pacific got back out to the 170-foot range in the discus, Menlo standout Kirk Hatfield took the quarter mile in 49.2 and consistent Marc Pence of Marina won

the shot put at 57-734.

Black, who had run 4:13.6 this season and was fifth in the state at 4:13.3 last year, had been in bed with a cold and chest congestion the past three days according to Buc coach Bert Bonanno.

Karpenko Awarded 3rd In NCS 2 Century

An angered Vic Karpenko had some of the sting of a fourth place finish in the varsity 100 yard dash at the North Coast Section II track finals eased Tuesday when it was learned he was moved into the No. 3 spot after official viewing of race films.

KEITH DAWSON, meet director and head track coach at Liberty High in Brentwood, site of this year's NCS II meeting, in dicated to the Times Tuesday morning that the shift involving San Ramon High's Karpenko was only one of four such final place rever-

Other changes came in the varsity 120 high hurdles, the class B 70 highs, and the class B 100.

Originally, Karpenko had been tabbed as the fourth place finisher with a 10.1 seconds clocking behind winner Ralph Ligons of Pittsburg (9.7 seconds), runnerup Dan Davis, also Pittsburg (9.9), and Miramonte's Mike Payne (10.0). Campolindo's John Haley was placed in the fifth spot (10.3).

IMMEDIATELY AFTER the finish of the race, Karpenko had declared he felt he had finished second. But the judges' decision went against him, and irked him to no end.

However, the meet films substantiated Karpenko's plea somewhat, even though Davis was still the No.2 finisher.

The angered Karpenko later went on to turn in one of the fastest East Bay 220 yard dash clockings of the season when he won that race in 21.9, upsetting Ligons, who was second in 20.0.

IN THE VARSITY highs, Acalanes' Glen Nelson was given a repreive when moved up from sixth to fifth. Finish judges at the meet had originally placed George Scott of Pittsburg in the No. 5 slot.

Importance of the changes is reflected on the fact that only the top five finishers in

each event — in both the varsity and class B divisions — qualify for the North Coast Section finals this Saturday at Cal State, Hayward.

Minor varsity team standing shifts occurred with the individual changes as Pittsburg lost one point, but still won the meet with 73 markers.

CAMPOLINDO GAINED one point to 16, but still finished fifth in the team standings. San Ramon's one more point gave the Lobos 14 tallies, but they still finished seventh. Miramonte lost two points and fell to a tie for 15th place at three points.

Previously, the Matadors had been in a tie for 11th.
