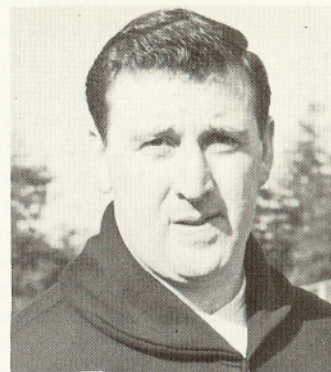
## HEAD COACH DAVE MAGGARD

California class of 1962, Dave Maggard becomes just the fourth head coach in the 70 year history of Track and field at the University.

Maggard 29, is the UC shot put record holder at 59-8 $\frac{3}{4}$ , and is the seventh longest shot putter in history with a best of 67-4 $\frac{1}{4}$ . He placed fifth in the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico City despite illness, after placing second in the U.S. Olympic Trials.

Maggard received his AB in Physical Education from Berkeley. He originally came to the University from Modesto Junior College after graduating from Turlock High School. In addition to three track letters Maggard also lettered in football at Cal.

Maggard served one year as Sam Bell's assistant coach after an outstanding four year



prep coaching career at Sunset HS (1965) and Los Altos HS (1966-68).

Personable, direct and intelligent Maggard appears to have many of the great qualities of his California coach Brutus Hamilton.

Born 1/12/40 Maggard and his wife, the former Carolyn Johnson, have two boys, David Jr., seven, and Darin, four.

## ASSISTANT COACH CHARLIE CRAIG

One of America's greatest triple jumpers, this Fresno State graduate was Cal's freshman coach last year. He came to Berkeley after coaching Fowler High School to three straight league championships.

Craig won the 1964 NCAA and 1967 NAAU triple jump championships. His best of 53-9 makes him the third longest American ever.

An Education major at Fresno State, Craig is an enthusiastic, and dedicated coach. Now 27, Craig is married to the former Mary Norman and has a one year old daughter.

## ASSISTANT COACH AL RAGAN

Assistant Coach Al Ragan has now served under all four Cal head coaches, and himself was a Bear head coach when Brutus Hamilton went into the Air Force during World War II.

Ragan started under Walter Christie upon graduation from Cal in 1927. He had come to Berkeley from Modesto Junior College and enjoyed a distinguished hurdle career for the Bears. Highly personable, careful and meticulous Ragan has enjoyed the respect of countless California trackmen through his 40-year career in Berkeley.

Under Ragan, in 1943, California won its last meet against perennially powerful Southern Cal, beating Dean Cromwell 89 $\frac{1}{2}$ % to 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ %.

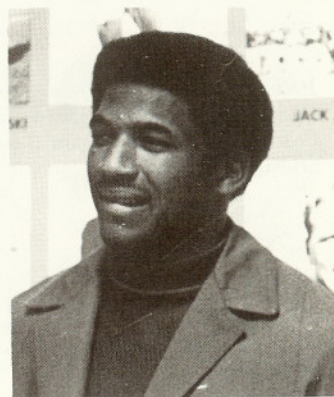

VINCE ANSLEY, 440 San Francisco...4th in state JC meet for CCSF last year...ran on 40.6 quartermile relay team which placed 5th in the state, also on 5th place mile relay team...51.3 prep at Poly HS...Biological Science major.

DENNIS BARLEY, mile, El Sobrante...4:10.1 is his fastest...two year letterman...North Coast Section mile champion as a prep at DeAnza HS.

ED BONNER, 220-440, Loomis...4th in state prep title meet in 47.9 last year...also clocked 21.4...two time North Section 440 champion and last year won a double adding the 220 title...frosh football numeral winner as a safetyman...Criminology major.

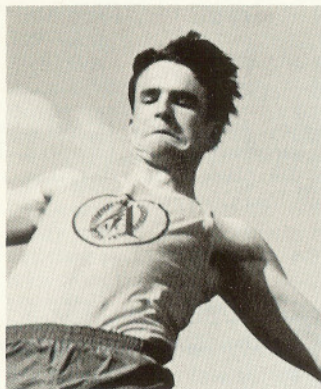
ISAAC CURTIS, hurdles, sprints, Santa Ana...frosh football MVP, outstanding in the grid sport...southern CIF low hurdle champion (18.6) as a junior at Santa Ana HS, where he also ran 14.0...qualified for the state meet in both as a junior but dislocated his shoulder, also led off Santa Ana's state qualifying 440 relay team...9.7 sprint clocking and 23-8 in the long jump, both as a junior...sat out all of last year with a hamstring pull.





JOHN DREW, 880, Houston, Texas...Golden West Invitational champion in 1968 in 1:49.5...1:51.0 last year, 2nd fastest ever by a Cal frosh...Texas state 880 champion...national age group mile record holder with 4:15.7 as a 15-year old.

RICH DUNN, long jump-triple jump, San Jose...2nd in state JC championships in triple jump last year...best of 49-10½ windy, 49-4½ legal...has long jumped 22-7½...22-1, 47-11 jumper at Leigh High School before attending West Valley...P.E. major.



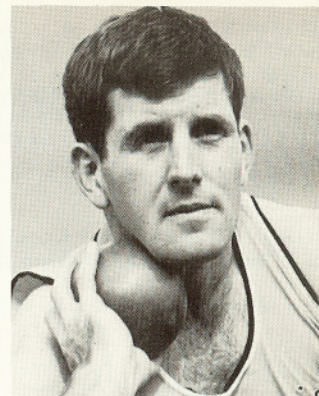
JIM FRASER, long-jump-triple jump, West Covina...5th in LJ and 4th in TJ in PAC-8 championships last year with best of 24-10 and 49-1½...ranks in top 10 Cal LJ and 3rd in TJ...transfer from Air Force Academy...2nd leading Cal pass receiver in football last year...attended Edgewood HS where he was a 23-3 prep jumper.

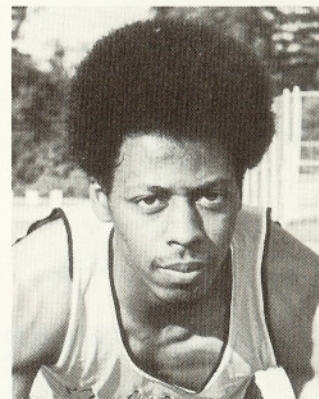

CLARENCE JOHNSON, high jump, San Antonio, Texas...one time national prep record holder at 6-11½...best mark at St. Peter Claver Academy was 7-¼...Cal and national frosh record holder at 7-3¼, the 6th greatest performance in high jump history...three year basketball letterwinner ... twice voted Cal's "most outstanding" trackman ... Economics major.



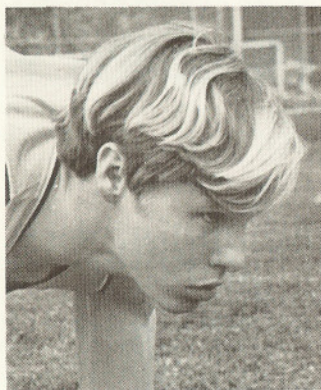

ROLIN LUKA, shot put, Walnut Creek...set Cal frosh mark at 56-1 last year...put the HS shot 63- $\frac{1}{2}$  for 2nd place in the Cal prep championship meet...working on strength, reduced weight from 285 to 252 this season...Business Administration major.

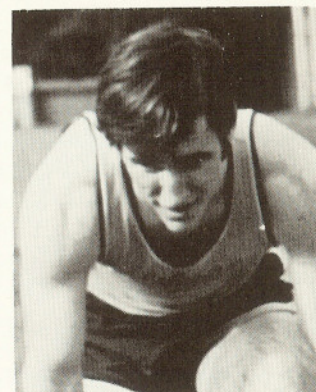
BOB MC LENNAN, hurdles, San Rafael...biggest surprise of the year for Cal, clocked 14.2 and 52.2, second best times ever by a Bear...was a 15.2 prep hurdler at San Rafael ...ran with a full cast on a broken arm last year and clocked astonishingly good times...won "Most Inspirational" award last year...placed 6th in PAC-8 title meet...Political Science major with a 3.3 gpa. Team co-captain.

JORGE PENA, javelin, Santiago, Chile...all-time best of 231-10 which he did in 1968 when he was a scorer in the PAC-8 meet-- 2nd longest thrower in Cal history...married.

JIM PENROSE, discus, Belmont...2nd in state championships and 1st in Golden West as a Carlmont HS senior...threw prep discus 193-0, the top mark in the U.S. and the then 5th longest prep mark ever...ineligible last year due to transfer from Air Force Academy...did get 179-8 to unofficially better Cal frosh record...sophomore...Economics major.

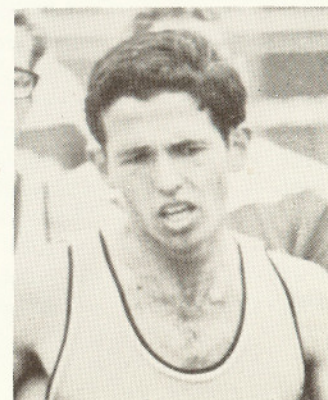

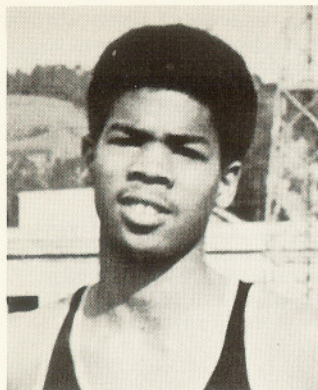

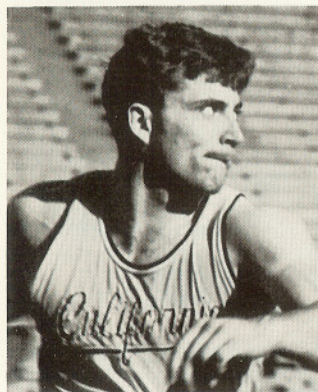

## EDWARDS STADIUM

Finished in 1932, and at the time the only purely "Track" Stadium in the World, Edwards Stadium has been the site of seven National Collegiate Championship Meets, one National AAU Championship Meet, All-American Invitational in 1966, and the 1932 IC4A Meet, the only time this meet had been held away from the East.

This Stadium is named after Col. George C. Edwards, as is the field adjoining it to the East.

In 1957 the oval itself was dedicated in the name of Walter Christie, California's first track coach, 1900-32, and in the early sixties "the friends of California track," raised funds to build the Walter Christie bench which stands just outside the running track on the West side of the infield.

With funds that remained after the bench was built the electric clock that stands atop the scoreboard to the North was purchased.

The track in the 22,000 seat Stadium was completely redone in 1965 and is a composite of Fresno clay and cinders and is reddish in color.

Nine world records have been set in this Stadium, including Cornelius Warmerdam's historic first 15-foot vault, April 13, 1940.

The last world record set in this Stadium was Jim Ryun's fabulous 3:51.3 mile in 1966.

**THE STAFF****HEAD COACH GEORGE WOLFMAN**

George Wolfman, starting his 16th season as California's head baseball coach, regained his winning form last year after a two-year drought. The Bears won 31 of 50 games, giving Wolfman a 61% career record.

Wolfman met instant success after taking over the Bear squad in 1955. Cal finished 25-9 in 1956, then won the CIBA, District 8, and NCAA championships in 1957. The Bears won five consecutive games in the College World Series, and Wolfman was named "Collegiate Coach of the Year." Since then, he has tutored seven All-Americans and won two more CIBA titles.

The 58-year old Bear mentor has had a lengthy and prolific career in baseball. In 1933, he captained the Bear squad that won the CIBA crown. After graduating, he signed with the Mission Reds of the Pacific Coast League as a catcher, and played through the 1935 season.

In 1936, George quit as an active player and became head coach at Mission H.S. in San Francisco. He remained there until 1953, except for a four year hitch in the Navy (1942-46). Wolfman's Mission teams won five city titles in 11 seasons. Wolfman returned to Cal in 1954 to serve as Clint Evans' assistant. After Evans retired that season, Wolfman became head man.

George and his wife Jean have three sons--Ronald, Tommy, and Richard.

**ODELL YOUNGBLOOD****ASSISTANT COACH**

Wolfman's new assistant is a 10 year veteran of coaching, his last post being at St. Mary's College, where he was head coach for two seasons. He first distinguished himself as a player. In the service, he participated in the worldwide Air Force tournament in 1957. At Fresno State, he played second base-shortstop on the Bulldogs' third place team in the College World Series. Youngblood began his coaching career in Fresno high schools from 1961-67. Two of his American Legion teams went to the state finals, and he was called on to assist Pete Beiden at Fresno State. He moved on to the head job at St. Mary's.

Youngblood has already been active at Cal, having organized a highly successful winter league team. The Stolte Bears, champions of the Abe Rose semi-pro league, consisted of prospects for this year's Cal team. Odell now resides in Lafayette with his wife Shirley and two sons, Mike and Bret.

**RODGER GRAY****FRESHMAN-SOPHOMORE COACH**

Gray, who won "most inspirational" trophies in football and baseball for the Bears, takes over the frosh-soph team after a year as Wolfman's assistant. Gray, 22, has put in two years coaching frosh football, and is an expert on physical conditioning.

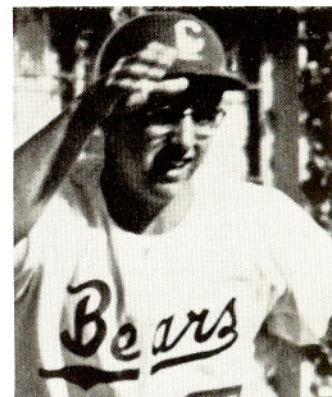

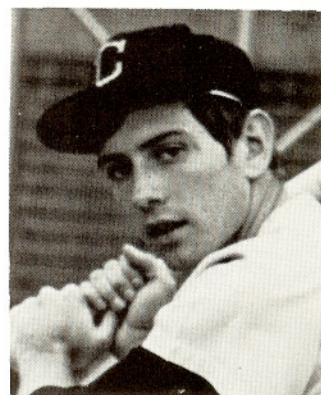

## 1970 OUTLOOK

Although over a half dozen starters have either signed or graduated, Cal coach George Wolfman looks for a better team than his '69 squad that went 31-19-1.

"There's a lot of competition at every spot, which is a good sign," said Wolfman. "We'll be a versatile team, with more speed and power than last year. Our only problem is a lack of returning pitchers."

The Bears lost their ace hurler when junior Mike Baldwin signed with the Chicago White Sox. But Wolfman expects good things from returnees Tony Murray and Bill Schofield. Murray is coming off a 5-1 junior year, while Schofield, 2-2 in his varsity year, enjoyed a spectacular season in winter ball.

Other pitching help should come from Greg Tellis, Ron Wayne, sophomore Neil Ernst, and JC transfer Alan Newman.

The outfield is loaded with prospects, although last year's leading hitter, Dave Texdahl (.331), has graduated. Power hitters Don Wilcox and Wayne Burd return, as do Garry Reagan, Norm Brown, and Greg Patton. Among the newcomers, Laney College transfer Jim Franklin rates an excellent chance to start.

The infield will be anchored by junior Jim Corcoran, a gifted athlete who played center field during the Pac-8 season. Corcoran will probably play shortstop, while fellow junior Don Moresco has the inside track at second base. Other players to watch are JC transfer Chuck Kurkjian and sophomores Mike Koski and Gene Tate. At first base, a good battle looms between transfers Jerry Vitatoe (Laney) and Steve Ohland (Santa Monica).

Irv Baker, a .306 hitter, will probably catch.

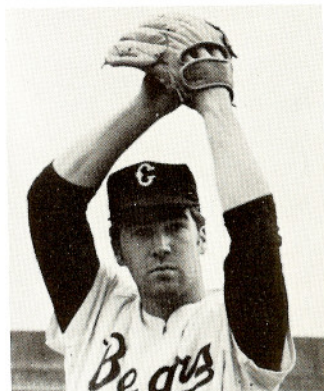

## NEW LOOK IN '70

The arrival of a new decade brings a new look to California baseball in many respects. The fences at Evans Diamond will be moved in, frosh baseball has given way to a freshman-sophomore team, and the Pacific-8 has inaugurated a playoff schedule at the season's end.

For the fans, the most significant change is the new fence alignment. For years, the measurements on Evans virtually eliminated the home run. Last year, for example, the Bears managed just one homer on Evans, and belted 20 on the road.

The left field line, previously 350 feet, will be shortened to 335 feet. The power alley in left (390) and dead center (420) will be reduced to 370 and 400, respectively. Due to the presence of Edwards track stadium, right center and the right field line will remain the same.

This year will also be the first for frosh-sophomore baseball, to be coached by Rodger Gray. Because first-year players are now eligible for varsity ball, the freshman team has been eliminated. The frosh-soph team will play a 33-game schedule, and compete in the Bay Area Collegiate Baseball League with Stanford, Santa Clara, San Jose State, and USF. Under the rules of the league, no varsity player may be switched to the frosh-soph team after April 25--the stretch run of the season.

The Pacific-8 has tightened its schedule from 21 games to 17, but will conduct a three-day, double elimination playoff May 21-23 to decide the conference representative. The playoffs will involve the top two teams from the northern and southern divisions.

Finally, Cal has added a new face to its coaching staff. He is Odell Youngblood, who arrives from St. Mary's College to assist George Wolfman.
