American two-mile relay mark falls in twilight meet

Lowell Paul's unofficial 1:48.2 anchor leg carried four Olympic preparation camp half-milers to a new American record of 7:16.2 in the two-mile relay Saturday night in a twilight track meet at Hayward Field.

The bearded Paul, who did his undergraduate running for the University of Kansas and since has graduated from Chicago Law School, and Marcel Philippe of Fordham, Dean Bjerke of Army and Ralph Schultz of the Chicago Track Club combined to better the listed American mark of 7:17.4 set by a University of Southern California quartet in 1966.

The twilight meet climaxed the three-week Olympic preparation camp for middle distance runners, steeplechasers and intermediate hurdlers held at the University of Oregon under U.S. Olympic Committee auspices.

Paul, who now runs for the Chicago Track Club and is scheduled to leave soon for Germany to begin a study of German law on a fellowship, had a five-yard lead on Denis Flood of Tennessee at the outset of the anchor leg and poured it on for the final two laps. The runner-up team of half-milers from the Olympic camp finished in 7:22.5.

"I was getting tired, but I'm in as good shape as I ever was," Paul said afterwards.

Paul said he thought the world record of 7:12.6 (held by West Germany) was out of reach, but knew well he had a chance at the U.S. mark.

Among other things, the meet featured a swift steeplechase event and program-ending mile run that ended in a tie.

Mike McClendon, a sophomore-to-be (athletically) at Oregon, ended the hectic mile in a 4:00.7 dead heat with Dennis Savage of Westmont (Calif.) College.

McClendon, only 18, was a Duck sophomore last spring, but was redshirted because of a knee injury.

Steve Savage, UO steeplechase star and no relation to the runnerup, led after 2½ laps and was still in front as they passed the three-quarter mark in 3:03.

At this point, Dennis Savage burst into the lead, but McClendon, moving fast from third place on the backstretch, caught first Steve and then Dennis. As they came off the final turn, McClendon moved a few inches in front, but Dennis Savage pulled even in the last few yards to the tape.

McClendon had figured earlier the two- or three-mile was his best race. "That's what I thought before tonight," he grinned. "But with Prefontaine there, I might be a miler." His previous personal best for the mile was 4:11.2.

Dennis Savage praised McClendon's performance afterwards.

"Everybody was scared of him (McClendon) all week," the Californian said. "He was running us into the ground. He's really doing well."

Bill Norris of the U. S. Army and 1969 AAU champion Mike Manley gave the estimated crowd of 2,000 its first batch of excitement with a rousing battle in the steeplechase.

Manley spurred to an early 25-30 yard lead, but Norris cut the deficit in half with about two laps to go.

At the gun lap, the two were neck-and-neck, but Norris caught Manley with about 220 yards to go and won by 10 yards.

"Warming up I had a bad cramp in my side," Norris noted later, "but I felt all right during the race."

Norris said he almost gave up track after a disappointing sickness at the AAU championships in Bakersfield, Calif., earlier this summer.

"I was fed up with track," he recounted, "but you just have to bounce back."

He cited the Olympic camp as the force that kept him around. "There was no real pressure here and the video tape machine really helped me."

Norris will complete his tour of Army duty in December and hopes to return to finish graduate work on a business degree at the UO, as well as continue running.

In the high jump, Marty Hill of the UO topped 6-10 and beat a field of high school jumpers, led by Salem's Mike Fleer at 6-8.

Other highlights:

Larry Kreider of the Navy breezed to a win in the 440 intermediate hurdles in 52.2, while Tim Bishop of Churchill claimed the 330 intermediates with a 42.3 clocking.

It is not my policy to announce decisions regarding the rejection or acceptance of records, prior to the formal meeting of the A.A.U. Track and Field Committee.

However, the rules regarding an American Relay record (all U. S. citizens) provide that all are members of and represent a single athletic club, college, university, or school. Records are also recognized for Olympic, Pan American, or National teams (Rule LVIII-4-(i).

A world record is claimed "after the performance shall first have been accepted as an American record." (4-(d)(i).
