He returned Friday night to win the century in 9.6, but fell off to 22.4 for fifth in the 220. Colorado City's Stan Bracy won the 220 in 21.7.

Crosby, the Greater Houston area's best shot at a state title this year when talent is scattered in most areas, saw its chances diminish in the sprint relay. The Buffalos, banking on two relays and two individual events, didn't even place in the short relay and their 27 total points were seven shy of regional rival Caldwell.

In addition, Mike Walker,

Crosby's main threat in the half could only manage a sixth-place finish in his specialty. He had a 1:59.0 in the event won by Klein's Mike McCall with a 1:56.9.

THE BUFFALOS triumphed in the mile relay with a tremendous effort on the part of Walker, the anchorman. Walker shook off what appeared to be a collision with runnerup Lufkin Dunbar's Kenneth Hill just before they started the final turn, and the Buffalo star brought Crosby home in 3:21.4. Tommy Braden, Mike White and Joe Thomae did the early work.

Relay-blessed Estacado tied the class record of 41.3 in the 440-yard event and coasted to a 3:20.1 in the mile relay for the bulk of its championship points. Gainesville was second with 32 points, followed by Dickinson (30), Colorado City (28) and Wharton and Belton (24 each).

Ronnie Jenkins successfully defended his half mile title and tallied 10 points for the Dickinson Gators with his 1:55.9 run.

MACK DICKEY provided the Gators a runnerup spot by clearing 140 in the pole vault, won by Azle's Terry Porter with 14-3.
