Wind was rather gusty, up and down all day, at Pullman — Don't have exact reading on Payton's jump but was right there at time and it was in calm period.... *have it now: 3.15 riding*

Dave Rorem, frosh who won 100 against Oregon, has had a few hamstring twinges (old injury) so ran only 100 against Washington....

Bill Smart had some flu on week of meet, never challenged Riley, which is unfortunate, because ~~when~~ Rick was ready for sub-four. But he had to lead all way, got no "help" on third lap and ~~the~~ last lap really was a solo (58.5)....

That broke Lindgren's school record of 4:02.4, set in 1967 behind Dave Roberts' 4:01.7....

Riley will run mile at Pacific-8, try for NCAA qualifying standard in  
 3-mile at Modesto, then run a 3-mile at Des Moines.....

Van Reenen's mother was in Pullman Saturday, starting three-week stay. Consequently, he really pressed, never looking good on any discus throw and missed chance to take advantage of fairly good wind.....

Peter Wright had no misses until first at 7-0 $\frac{1}{4}$ , then cleared on second. He promptly moved bar to 7-2 $\frac{1}{4}$  -- his reasoning that he needed that to get ahead of Peckham in Australian consideration for Empire Games team.....

Jim Voss, as last year, is looking better as weather warms and ~~am~~  
definitely is candidate to ~~he~~ get 7-0 by end of year. His school  
record of 7-0 $\frac{1}{2}$  held up ~~in~~ partly because of Wright's  
decision to go to 7-2 $\frac{1}{4}$ .....

Wright's jump, incidentally, was first 7-footer ever at Rogers Field, which previously has defied such as Fosbury, Johnson, Kelly, Radetich, Hoyt, Keppel, Voss, Boyce, Stuber, etc. -- all on two or more occasions.
