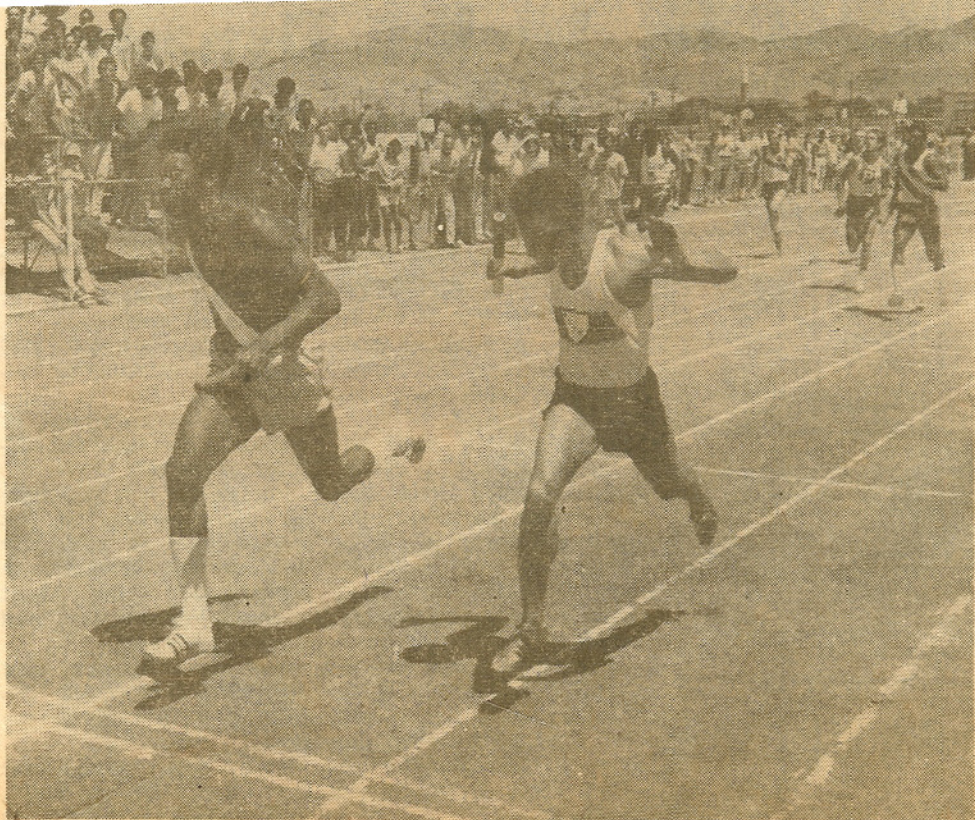

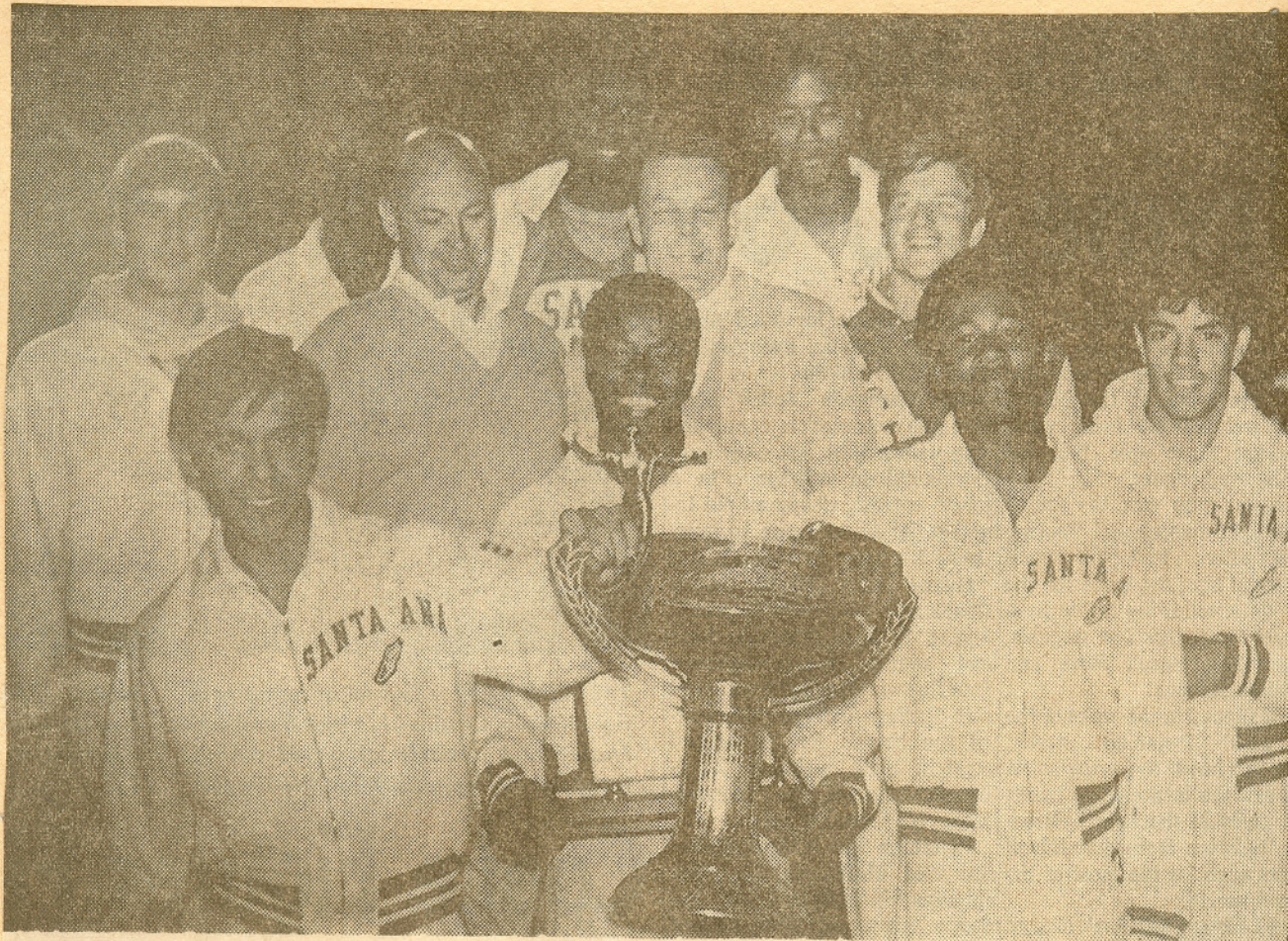

Anaheim, Santa Ana Bring Two CIF Spike Titles Back to County

For the first time in 16 years Orange County doesn't have to take a back seat to anyone in CIF track.

Santa Ana walked off with the varsity title and a highly-spirited Anaheim team captured the Bee competition Thursday night in the CIF track finals at Cerritos College, establishing the county as a prep spike contender now and in the future.

A near-capacity crowd of 11,101 watched as the Saints chalked up 24 points in varsity action compared to 22 for Blair, 17 for Morningside and 13½ for Long Beach Poly, giving Orange County its first varsity CIF spike title since 1954 when the Saints beat Compton.

The Colonists trailed Glen-

dora all night in the Bee competition but came back in the last race to overtake the Tartans, 21½-20. Glendora had leads of 10-7 and 16-13 over the Colonists but the 880 relay made the difference as Anaheim set a new meet record in winning the event with a clocking of 1:28.9.

Mike Black was the individual standout for the Colonists. He captured the 220 with a time of 22.1 and was also on the winning 880 relay squad. He came in third in the 100 with a 10.0 behind teammate Dave Wade who also clocked a 10.0.

Bob McQueen appeared to injure his left ankle in the 120 high hurdles and did not place but managed to come back and take a fifth in the 120 lows with a time of 13.2.

In the pole vault, Wayne Gro-

man tied for third with a vault of 13-6½ which helped the Colony cause.

Despite being beaten by Bonita's Allen Carter in the 100, Jackie White came back to pace the Saints to their victory. Both Carter and White ran 9.7 in the 100 but Carter nipped the Santa Ana ace at the wire for the win.

White, however, returned later in the night to capture the 220 with a clocking of 21.7. He also ran the anchor on Santa Ana's winning 440 relay team.

Blair's Jim McAlister was a double winner but it was not enough to push the Vikings past Santa Ana. McAlister took the 180 lows with a time of 18.9 and easily captured the long jump with a leap of 24-7½.

In the most exciting race of the night Jim Chaffin of Long

Beach Poly took the measure of El Modena's Dave White in the rugged two-mile run. Chaffin won the race in the same fashion as in the semi-finals. He let White take a slight lead and in the last lap overtook the Vanguard distance King. Chaffin's winning time was 9:01.0.

Loara did well in varsity competition, qualifying three for the State meet next week in Berkeley. Jim Beyers finished third behind Carter and White in the 100 with a time of 9.9. Steve Baxter took a fourth in the long jump with a leap of 23-2 and the Saxon 440 relay team ran a 42.2, good enough for third place and a state berth.

Mark Davenport of El Dorado took a fourth in the Bee shot put with a toss of 53-9½.
