

THE ALL TIME WEST BAY TRACK AND FIELD HONOR ROLL

For the past decade the Oakland Tribune has conducted an East Bay High School Track & Field Honor Roll. It is the purpose of this survey to establish a similar All Time Honor Roll for the West Bay.

The term West Bay means all high schools from San Francisco to San Jose on the West side of the bay. The leagues represented are the AAA, CAL, NPL, MPL, SPAL, SCVAL, MHL, WVAL, and STAL. Schools south of San Jose were not included in this survey.

Los Altos dominates the All Time West Bay Honor Roll with 14 selections, over 3 times as many selections as several runner-up schools.

The team includes San Francisco prep great Ollie Matson who received a bronze and a gold medal in the 1952 olympics, Lee Evans Olympic 400 meter champion in 1968, and NCAA champions: Don Bowden (Cal), Bob Stoecker (Stanford), Mike Ryan (Air Force), and Bill Fosdick (USC).

Other West Bay athletes listed who have had successful college careers are: Brad Lyman (UCLA), John Radetich (OSC), Jim Penrose (Cal), Steve Wilhelm (Kansas), Don Castle (USC), and Denny Rogers (UCLA).

The past four years indicate that track athletes are getting better than ever, as athletes from 1967 to 1970 dominate the team. The 1970 season has been the best in West Bay prep history with 18 athletes represented on the squad. 1969 has 13, 1968 has 12, and 1967 has 8 men represented.

The West Bay has taken a back seat to the East Bay in terms of producing great track men until the last 5 years. However the top marks of the West Bay stars ^{now} exceeds that of the East in nine of sixteen events. The state championship for Los Altos High this season was a fitting climax to the forging ahead of the West Bay as the track capitol of the USA

Knights rewrite West Bay track

The 1970 Los Altos High track and field squad made a significant contribution to the all time west bay track and field honor role.

Four Los Altos athletes were responsible for six individual entries and the Knight mile relay team was also honored.

Rick Brown has the all time best in the 880 with a 1:50.6

clocking and is third in the 440 with a 47.1 mark.

Chris Adams has the best in the discus at 201-3, also a national best, and is the fifth best shot putter with a 62-9 1/2 toss.

Jim Andrew qualified fifth in the 440 with a 47.8 time and Larry Davis was fifth in the 880 with a 1:52.7 mark.

Other area 1970 qualifiers were Cupertino's 440 relay team (42.5), Cupertino's Craig Conway in the triple jump (49-9 1/2)

and Serra's Lynn Swann in the long jump (24-10).

Midpeninsula athletes hold the best all time marks in the 880 (Los Altos' Brown), the mile relay (Los Altos), the 440 relay (Cupertino), the high jump (Awalt's Max Lowe), the long jump (Homestead's Phil Quinet), the triple jump (Santa Clara's Harry Freeman), the shot put (Fremont's Steve Wilhelm) and the discus (Los Altos' Adams).

Plato's Project Proves Revealing

Plato Yanicks, the meticulous and amiable statistics freak who also coaches track at Menlo-Atherton High School, has found new revelation out of his penchant for pouring over the back issues of old newspapers.

Plato's research has generated an All-Time Track and Field Honor Roll for high school athletes in the West Bay—that area south from San Francisco to San Jose—on the earthquake side of San Francisco Bay, as you might have guessed.

Leagues represented in the list include the AAA; West Catholic; North, Mid and South Peninsula; Mt. Hamilton and three

others from the Santa Clara Valley - San Jose Area.

None too surprisingly, Los Altos High School ranks as the primary producer of track talent within the region. The Knights, who currently rank as the State CIF champion, made the list in 14 different slots, more than three times as many as several runner-up schools.

One interesting aspect of the list is the statistical evidence that prep trackmen are getting better all the time, no matter what the oldtimers tell you. Athletes from 1967 to the present dominate the Honor Roll and the year 1970, the best in West Bay history, added no less than 18 to the spiked shoe

elite. The all-time rankings also include 13 athletes from the year 1969, a dozen from 1968, and eight from 1967.

San Mateo High School topped the Mid Peninsula League with three slots on the history squad. They included Ralph Lee, a 1:52.1 half-miler from 1960, Jim Lydon, whose 15-6 vault from 1969 ranks as the all-time best, and Carl Goldstone, another vaulter who cleared 14-10 this year.

Plato also pointed out that the West Bay is catching up, if not surpassing, the East Bay in track prowess. Until the last five years, teams from Berkeley, Pittsburg, El Cerrito, et al, had no peer in Northern California.

The top marks of the West Bay athletes, however, now surpass the East in nine of 16 events, phenomena that reached an obvious climax when Los Altos won the state championship.

The most noteworthy names on the All-time Honor Roll are headed by Ollie Matson, Washington of San Francisco '48, who won two medals in the '52 Olympics, and Lee Evans, Overfelt '65, who won the 400 meter gold medal in the '68 Games, when he also anchored the 1600-meter relay team to victory.

NCAA champions sprung from this area include Don Bowden, Bob Stoecker, Mike Ryan and Bill Fosdick.
