Twenty-six year old Jerry Jobski, former Arizona State University distance runner, won the 3rd annual Arizona Admission's Day Marathon in the record time of 2:26.42. It was Jerry's first Marathon although he has much distance running experience.

Jerry's performance was truly an outstanding one. The official temperature for the day was 82° with no wind whatsoever. It was even warmer on the asphalt paved course mostly over city streets. As a result of the temperature, only 87 of the 201 starters finished the race.

Due to bridge construction over the Santa Cruz River, the course was re-aligned for this one year only. The temporary course measured 27.2 miles. Jerry's one mile time was 4:45.0 and his 15 mile time was a remarkable 1:17.30.0.
