

Cal's Jumpers Provide A Psychological Lift

California assistant track coach Charlie Craig stood in the middle of Edwards Field and smiled reflectively. "It is the kind of meet," Craig said, "that helps build up a team's confidence. And boy do we need that."

"A lot of our kids have been worried about little aches and pains and have entered competition tight. There was always a bit of doubt that if they let go and gave a full effort that they'd get hurt."

California, by that time, was well on its way to a 96-48 victory over Washington State, and it was Craig's jumpers who had provided the biggest psychological lift. It was the jumpers of whom he spoke.

Leads Sweep

Although still somewhat weak from a stomach injury Jim Fraser led a sweep in the triple jump with a 51-9½ effort and finished second in the long jump to WSU's Norbert Payton.

Were it not for a 12 mph

aiding wind the triple jump mark would have advanced Fraser's own school record. Fraser went farther than 50 feet on four occasions, fouling once and twice getting off windy jumps. His fourth best effort of 50-2 still was good enough for a meet record.

On his last long jump turn, Fraser reached 25-7 with no wind reading at all but was

ruled to have started the jump an inch over the board. Foul. No jump.

Work Ahead

"I still have to get the hop-step segment of the event straightened out," Fraser said. "All three sections are supposed to be about equal in distance but today I finished with about a 21-foot jump."

"Charlie's been trying to help me. He's a great coach. He's developed a whole system of drills to get to me to concentrate on the hop-step segment, having me hop into the pit and extend myself to get out and exercising to increase my height."

There were other positive developments for California, including the return of Eddie Hart from a leg injury, the steady improvement of hurdler Ross Brosius and a sweep of the discus by Jim Penrose, Chris Adams and John Gledhill.

Easy Street

Hart took an easy start in the 100, then ran away from Payton in the middle section for a 9.5 victory. Earlier he had widened a half yard lead in the 440 relay to a final margin of five tenths.

Only a freshman, Brosius came from behind to beat teammate Roddy Lee in both hurdle races, posting a lifetime best of 14.3 in the 120 highs and coming within one tenth of his best in the intermediates.

Stars Missing, but Cal Routs Cougars, 96-48

BERKELEY (AP) — California won all but five events to trounce Washington State, 96-48, in Pacific 8 dual meet in cold windy weather Saturday.

Cal, competing without sprinter Isaac Curtis and flu-stricken miler John Drew, got great performances from hurdler Ross Brosius and long jumper Jim Fraser.

Brosius won both hurdle races with 14.3 for the 120 highs and 53.3 for the 440 intermediates. Fraser triple jumped 51-94, but the mark will not go in as a school record because it was wind-aided. He also was second in the long jump with a leap of 24-5 3/4 and had a foul of 25-7.
