Silvester Sails Discus 220-4 in Season's Bow

Nobody enjoys a wind at a track meet except a discus thrower.

While a biting cold 25 m.p.h. breeze was all but ruining the 13th annual Mt. San Antonio Relays for most of the athletes and 8,650 fans, it proved a boon to world record holder Jay Silvester and the rest of an outstanding discus cast.

Silvester, competing in his first meet this season, uncorked a line drive throw which was carried along on a quartering wind for 220 feet, 4 inches. It would have gone even farther had it not smacked into a white wooded barricade protecting the run-

Not 'Ready' Yet

Silvester's discus hit the barrier about eight inches above the ground, leaving a gouge a half-inch deep. Discus officials estimated it may have cut six inches from his throw.

"It's a shame these conditions (the 25 m.p.h. wind) came so early in the year, because I have some refining to do on my technique," said the 33-year-old Brigham Young physical education instructor. "I don't really feel confident in the ring yet, and as a re-sult I didn't throw today what I think I can throw when I'm ready.

"It was a good wind, though, and it was coming from the right direction.

Five other throwers also surpassed 200 feet in the ideal—for the discus only -conditions.

Kvalheim Runs 13:52

Although Silvester's throw was short of his own world record of 224-5 made three years ago in Reno, it shattered Al Oerter's meet mark of 206-6 made in 1964. At that time, Oerter's mark was the world record.

Silvester and Norwegian distance runner Arne Kvalheim were selected as athletes of the meet. It was the second such honor for Silvester, who was named in 1965 when he scored a weight double of 62-2½ in the shot and 202-11 in the discus.

Considering the weather, Kvalheim's 13-minute, 52-second victory in the 5,-000-meter run may have been the day's finest performance. Despite bucking a bitter backstretch wind for 12 laps) the former University of Oregon star missed Tracy Smith's re-cord by only .02 seconds. Conrad Nightingale and Bob Price and then came back to win the mile in 4:10.9.

White, a physical education administrator at Valley State, upset Olympic champion Willie Davenport in a wind-blown 13.5 high hurdle race which was the fastest ever run here. Another fine mark which won't make the record book because of excessive winds was a 26-8 long jump by NCAA champion Arne Robinson of San Diego State.

'Duel' Fizzles

George Young, running in his first race since the San Diego indoor games in February, led all the way in the 5,000 until Kvalheim burst past him in the final lap.

The heralded 100-yard duel between two-time Olympian Mel Pender and Madagascar's Jean-Louis Ravelomanantsoa proved a flop when Pender was disqualified after two false

disqualified after two laise starts and Jean-Louis failed to show up. Former Occidental sprinter Chuck Smith won in 9.3, although he was pushed along by a wind of 17 m.p.h. at the time. His 9.3 was equaled in another heat by Don Quarrie, the ineligible USC sprinter who won the British Commonwealth Games while running for Jamaica last

Five meet records were set, in addition to Silvester's discus throw. FRED LUKE -- JAVELIN WINNER (Husky Spike Club, Hometown, Seattle, Wash.)

"In the first flight I was warming up and feeling pretty good, and then we had to wait for the second flight. And by the time we got to the finals it got too cold and I just ran out of steam. I don't think the wind affected it (the throwing), too much. I did quite poorly against Skinner and Covelli last year in the AAU (did not make the top 15). It's rewarding to come back this year and beat them....I graduated from Washington in '68. Best throw last year was 264. I've been working real hard this winter, on weights and throwing an iron ball, a 3 lb. ball. Coach Shannon (Ken Shannon, Wash.) has been helping me also.

I thought I would have to run on the outside lane and run blind, but at least I got lane 6 although I was still out in front of some of them. All of my coaching is done by myself, and I just practice when I can. I'm an assistant coach at Patrick Henry High (San Diego) and I don't usually get to work out until 7 or 8 at night. My best time this year is 50.5. I'm pleased with today's time considering it's cold and the wind. I've never ran good in cold weather. I have a tendency xxxxxxxxxxxxxxx to tie up when it's cold. I'll be looking forward to meet—Lee in the Kennedy Games. Right now it looks like Ralph Mann is the leading US contender for Munich.

LEE EVANS -- 440 INVITATIONAL

"Coming into the home stretch the wind was blowing pretty hard. It held the time down. It helped out on the kxxx back stretch. I'd rather have no wind than have help on the back stretch. It's hard coming into that wind at the finish when you're tired. I run better when it's warm. (As to why he scratched from the hurdles) I just didn't feel like doubling up today.
