Dear Garry,

I think that in order to make any sense out of the NCAA mile-relay situation, one must first come to grips with the question of what happens with equal times in a time-based final. On that issue, my ~~ax~~ analysis runs as follows:

- A) The ~~the~~ situation is not covered by the NCAA rules
- B) There are three precedents:
 - 1) NCAA 440- 1965. Despite the confused account in the Newsletter, I surmise that the places were resolved by phototimer times, using hundredths.
 - 2) 1966 - 440. Either they changed their rule, or the hundredths were even. First place was a tie between guys in different sections.
 - 3) 1970 - 600. Bruggeman and Brown were in different sections and the tie was broken so they must have used hundredths.
- C) It is absolutely inconceivable that placing in section could ever be a factor. That's just absurd.
- D) The phototimer was not being used at the mile-relay finish line at Detroit, so they could ~~xxx~~ not have used hundredths.
- E) From all of the above, I infer that they would have split the point.

Next, the question of knowledge of first section results.

At the NCAA, they follow the salutary practice of not announcing any results in trials or finals run on time basis until all heats or sections are over. Thus Villanova could not have known precisely what it had to run.

ABC did get the times flashed to it by ~~x~~ a friendly timer before the second section. But they were not told of the DQ. So that it would have seemed to ABC that Villanova could clinch by running no worse than ~~third~~ second in their section (That, of course, ~~xxx~~ assumes that ~~x~~ they could have run a 3:23.9 or faster—a reasonable assumption for them to make.) Of course there was another winning possibility for Villanova. They could have run 3:17.8 ~~x~~ or better and finished no worse ~~6~~ than third in their section (disregarding the DQ, of course). Then they would have split the point—all they needed—with SI. With the DQ, however, all they really needed to do was run a 3:23.9 and finish no worse than third. Had they done that they would have beat KS out for third in the section and thus tied ~~OK~~ Okla St for fifth overall at 3:23.9. (KS presumed 7th, SI DQ).

All this means, really, is that when KS dropped way off the leaders early in the race, it was ~~x~~ obvious that Villanova had clinched (obvious, that ~~x~~ is, to anybody who either knew about the DQ or thought it obvious that Villanova would run ~~xxxxxxx~~ 3:17.8 or better.)

Now then, why on earth did you ask? I hope you're not contemplating a hatchet job on ~~ABC~~ ABC. I personally ~~xxx~~ couldn't care less about your doing so, but a certain Eastern editor of yours, who was sitting there telling McKay and Toomey what was going on, might never talk ~~xxx~~ to you again if you did.

Speaking of Dunaway, he had the three-mile of the AAU on ~~xxxx~~ cassette and gave you what he transcribed. You, in turn, reported it correctly as given (I checked that). My own notes were slightly confused, and I remember distinctly sitting down with Jim after the meet to ~~xxxx~~ pool results and times and agreeing at that time that he had the correct order. Did you say that Harrison thinks he was higher in the order? Well, Jim has some rather ~~xxx~~ snippy words for him if he does. Sorry, but I have no ~~xxxx~~ further info. I'll ask around and see if anyone else has a different order, but I'd be very inclined to believe you got it right the first time.
