# ROBINSON and STEWARD LEAD SAN DIEGO IN TRIANGULAR AND DUAL MEETS

San Diego, May 1/ cloudy 63°; Medalist rubber-asphalt track

Arnie Robinson and Eddie Steward each competed in four events to lead the San Diego Aztecs to a shaky win over Fullerton State and UC-Santa Barbara in triangular and double-dual meets at Choc Sportsman Oval.

The Aztecs won the triangular with 74 points, Fullerton was second with 67 and Santa Barbara trailed with 49. The Aztecs closed their dual meet season at 8-3 by squeaking by Fullerton 79-74 and beating Santa Barbara 82-64.

Robinson won the triple jump (49-6  $\frac{3}{4}$ ) captured the long jump with a wind-aided 24-6 $\frac{1}{4}$ , cleared 6'6" for second in the high jump and finished fourth in the 220 for a total of 14 points.

Speedster Steward anchored both Aztec relay teams and took both sprints. The San Diego mile relay team, however, was disqualified because the second Aztec runner, Tim Vincent, cut in too quickly after taking the baton.

Fullerton was leading the mile relay ~~an~~ when its third man dropped the baton rounding the final turn.

Aztec Jerry Culp high-jumped 7 feet but failed three times at 7-2.

Fullerton showed surprising strength by sweeping the shot put and the 880. San Diego did not score in either of these events. In fact, Steward's sprint wins were the only individual victories for the Aztecs on the track. Santa Barbara won the 440-I and Fullerton won the 880, mile, 2 mile, steeplechase and highs. The field events told a different story. The Aztecs won everything except the shot and discus.

San Diego missed out on some sure points when the coaches decided not to run Tim Danielson in the mile and two mile as he had a flu bug. The Aztec's top hurdler, Jim King, was scratched from further competition after complaining of stomach cramps when he finished second in the 440.

Rick Olander, leading Aztec pole vaulter, confined himself to the high hurdles finishing third.
