Discus Men Spark SJS

San Jose State field men, led by co-captain Chuck Sundsten and Gary O'Sullivan, and two visiting athletes stole most of the attention as the Spartans opened their outdoor track and field season under perfect weather conditions at Bud Winter Field Saturday.

Sundsten, programmed for vital roles for the Spartans

this season, won the long jump with an impressive early season 24-7½, while the muscular O'Sullivan took the discus with 174-6½ and placed second in the shot put at 52-0½.

"Chuck's jump is excellent considering the fact he didn't have any aiding wind at all," assessed coach Ernie Bullard.

Two new Spartan discus throwers, Greg Born and Tom Wilson, added considerable footage to their previous competitive bests. Born, the 1970 J.C. shot put champion from American River, threw the discus 170-9 as compared to his previous best of 157-11, while Wilson, a recruit from Chabot, went from 158-0 to 167-6. Born also came within a quarter-inch of his lifetime best in winning the shot put with 55-9½.

The Spartans had two men over 16 feet in the pole vault, Vic Dias and Bob Richards, and Bill Crawford won the high jump at 6-7.

Cal State Hayward's Kermit Bayless zipped through the 440 in 46.9 to upset the Spartans' Elmo Dees, who was clocked in 47.5, and Ed Haver of UC-Davis won the two mile in an impressive 9:04.2.

Track standouts for the Spartans were hurdlers George Carty and Len Gaskill, miler Maury Greer and halfmilers Buck Black and Lee Marshall.

Carty won the high hurdles in 14.2, while Gaskill took the 440 yard intermediates in 53.0 with no one pressing him and was second in the high sticks in 14.7.

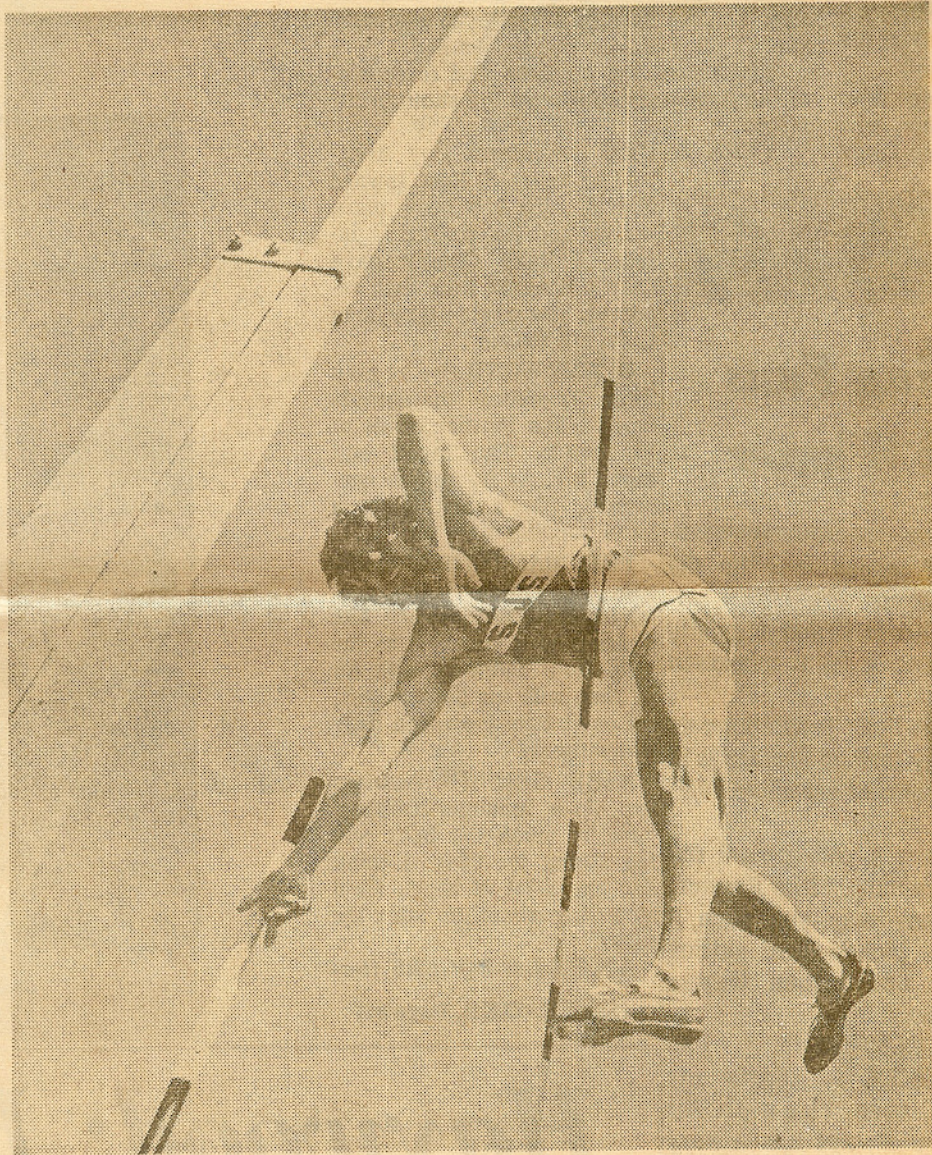
After a slow 2:09 half-mile pace, Greer came on strong to easily win the mile in 4:14.6, with teammates Mark Evans, 4:18.0, and Gary Rezowalli, 4:18.8, finishing second and third. Rezowalli clipped 10 seconds off his previous best.

Black and Marshall finished one-two in the 880 in 1:52.8 and 1:53.9. Black, who is normally a miler, had a previous best of 1:53.6.

The Spartans missed the first handoff between Billie Gaines and Carty in the 440 yard relay, and Bullard didn't enter Gaines or co-captain Kirk Clayton in the sprints as he didn't want them running out of the blocks this early in the season.

Chuck Sundsten and Vic Dias jumped off to a successful start during the opening of San Jose State's outdoor track season Saturday at Bud Winter Field, soaring to first place finishes in the long jump and pole vault. Sundsten, co-captain of the Spartans' powerful aggregation, sailed 24-7½ in the long jump and Dias cleared 16-0 in the vault, although he scrapes off the bar in this attempt at 16-6.

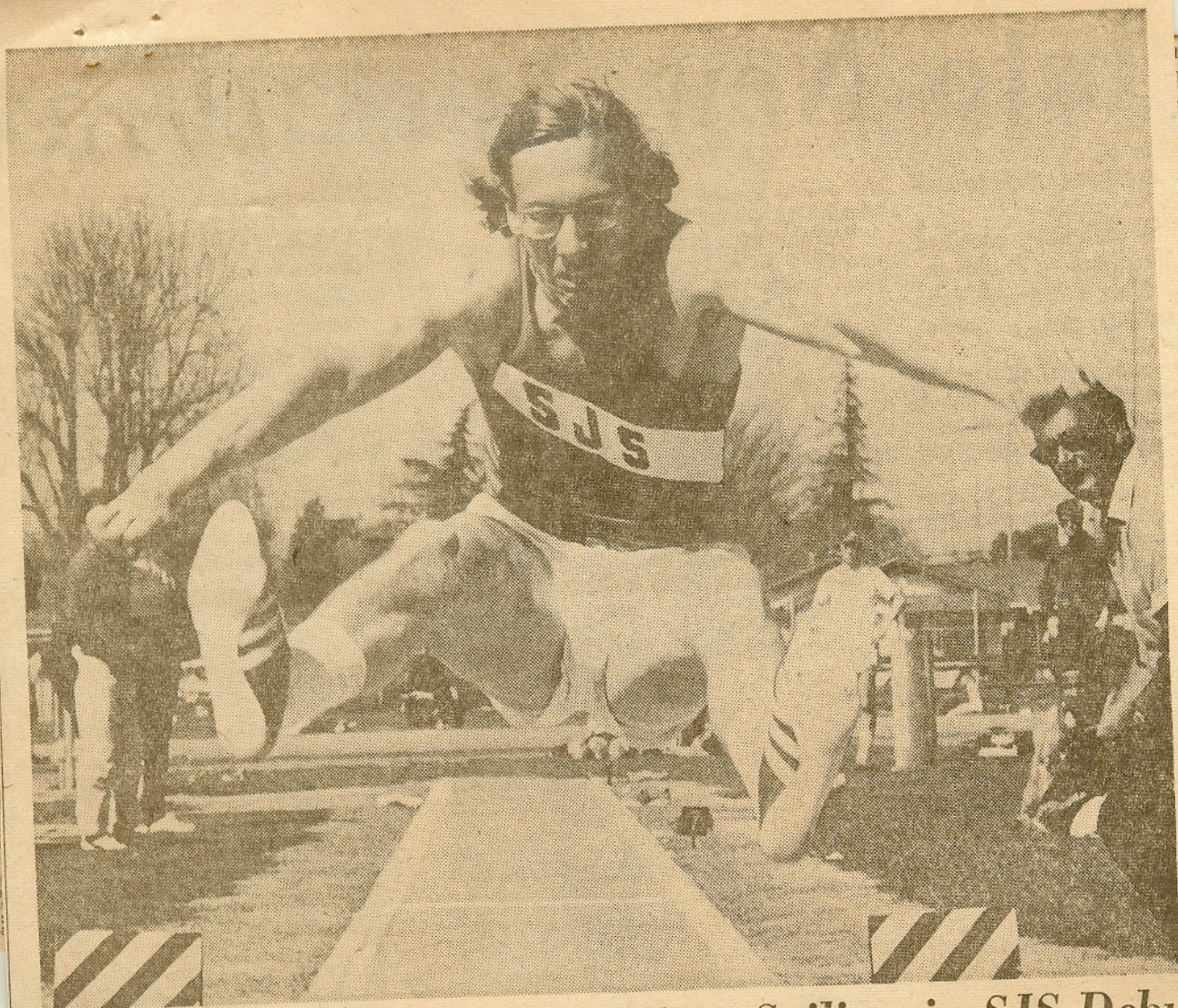
