





Cal Coach Was Right-Much to His Regret

They laughed when Cal coach Dave Maggard said his track team, first in the NCAA finals last year, would have a close meet with Stanford, winless in its Pacific-8 dual matches.

Well, Maggard had the last laugh, although a hollow one, yesterday at Stanford Stadium where everything in the 77th renewal of The Big Meet was close, even the weather.

Stanford is winless no more.

Indians, many of The whom were painted up in the tradition of real Indian war parties, upset Cal, 76-69, before approximately 8000 people.

Surprise Events

"Everything went about the way I figured it would," said Maggard. "The mile and the 880 did surprise me a little, however." Stanford took first and second in both those events.

Everyone was alerted to a possible upset early in the meet when Stanford led all the way in the 440 relay and won in a season's best of 41.0. Stanford sprinter Chuck Francis, who won both the 100 and 220, gave anchor man Rick Tipton a two-yard lead on Cal's Isaac Curtis.

Curtis closed hard at the tape and Cal also finished in But Curtis pulled up 41.0. limping after he hit the tape.

"My ankle hurt again," said Curtis, who was listed as only a possible participant in the Big Meet because of tendonitis in his left ankle. "I couldn't tell how bad it was until I went all out and I didn't want to go all out until the meet for fear of injuring myself.

'So Curtis joined Cal's other super sprinter, Eddie Hart, the sidelines for the rest on of the day. Hart, bothered by hamstring injury, didn't a suit up at all

That helped pave the way for Francis, who took the 100-yard dash in 9.6 and the 220 in 21.3.

Stanford clinched the meet when Don Kardong doubled back, after winning the mile with a life time best of 4:03, to take the two - mile in 8:56.6. His mile time was one of three meet record performances.

Cal's Terry Lewis turned in the first meet standard of the afternoon when he put the shot 59-31/2 just after Stanford's Steve Davis had gone into first place with a best of life 54-61/4.

Randy White came through with a stadium equaling and meet record for Stanford when he was clocked in 51.0 in the 440 intermediate hurdles. He has failed to set a meet record in only one league matchup this season. Stanford's Rick Tipton equaled the meet record with a 14.2 in the 120 high hurdles.

Lost Strategy

But the meet was clinched one event before the mile relay, which Cal won anyway, in 3:11.1.

The victory gave Stanford a 40-35 edge in The Big Meet series, which dates back to 1897.
