Three Mile Saves Victory

A Mighty Scare for UCLA

Ruben Chappins took the lead on the last turn of the three mile run and moved away to 10-yard victory which provided UCLA a thrilling 78-76 victory over California, preserving the Bruins 17-meet win streak.

California led the meet three times, the last after 14 events, and needed only to win the three mile and mile relay for the biggest upset of the season.

Cal's Vic Cary lead for 11 laps and was holding off Chappins' early move with 330 to go, but the kick just wasn't there at the end.

Even a screaming crowd of

10,000 home fans and a world of courage can't fetch flat speed that isn't there.

If not for a recurrence of injuries to sprinters Eddie Hart and Isaac Curtis, the points in the three mile might not have been required. Each ran a brilliant leg on the winning 440 relay team and nothing else.

Curtis left with a throbbing right ankle. Then midway through the 100 yard dash Hart pulled up with what appeared to be hamstring damage. He had been leading.

With both men out the full load of pressure fell on Dave Masters and Masters responded with great style, placing second in the 100 and barely losing second to War-

ren Edmonson in the 220. It was simply too much to make up.

Disappointing

"Sure it was disappointing," coach Dave Maggard said, "but I have no complaints. Everyone competed well. You can throw around all the ifs and buts you want. We lost the meet and that's that."

"The only thing I'm really concerned with is the injury to Eddie. I'm just sick about it. It's the same leg he hurt against USC and there's no telling when he'll be ready."

There were great performances all over the field for California, the greatest of them by Jim Fraser, the senior captain who has had the

flu and injuries to the groin and heel in the last month.

Fraser pulled out victories on his last try in both the long jump and triple jump reaching 25-7 and a school record of 53¼ in the triple jump. It was also Pacific Eight Conference record, the best in the nation this season and the ninth longest by an American.

Suffice to say it was a heluva jump.

Coach Worried

"Coach Maggard didn't want me to take either of my last two turns," Fraser said. "He was worried that I might do further damage to my heel. I wanted to take another shot at getting off a good jump. I wasn't sure I

could catch (James) Butts but I thought I might be able to catch the school record."

Butts had led entering the final round with a 52-4½ effort and closed to 52-10½ on the last jump of the day. Third place went to Denny Rogers at 52-¾.

The first meeting of unbeaten teammates John Drew and Rick Brown brought Cal a 1-2 finish in the 880, Drew taking the lead on the last turn and holding off the persistent challenge of Brown. Time was 1:51.3.

Drew went out faster than he is accustomed, running a step behind UCLA's Paul Williams through a 55.5 first lap. "I thought I had to," Drew said. "I have great respect for Williams and I didn't want to lose contact."

"Rick and I had talked about the race quite a bit and had worked out strategy in case one of the other of us got boxed. We just wanted to run as well as we could to beat a good UCLA field." Drew is now the team's only unbeaten athlete.

Other valuable performances came from Roddy Lee and Ross Brosius, who brought Cal 1-2 finishes in both hurdles races, and field event athletes Jim Penrose (184-8 in the discus) and Bruce Kennedy (241-10 in the javelin).

BERKELEY, CALIF. (UPI)--UCLA TOOK ADVANTAGE OF INJURIES TO PREMIER SPRINTERS EDDIE HART AND ISAAC CURTIS PLUS A GRITTY COME-FROM-BEHIND VICTORY BY RUBEN CHAPPINS IN THE THREE-MILE SATURDAY TO NIP CALIFORNIA 76-76 IN A HOTLY CONTESTED TRACK AND FIELD MEET.

IT WAS THE BRUINS' NINTH STRAIGHT DUAL MEET WIN THIS SEASON AND 17 IN A ROW OVER THE PAST TWO SEASONS.

CAL'S TROUBLES BEGAN WHEN CURTIS, WHO FINISHED SECOND TO TEAMMATE HART IN THE NCAA 100 YARD DASH LAST YEAR, WAS KNOCKED OUT OF THE MEET AFTER GIVING THE BEARS THE LEAD ON THE SECOND LEG OF CAL'S WINNING 440 RELAY SQUAD. CURTIS AGGRAVATED A SORE ANKLE AND WAS SCRATCHED FROM THE REST OF THE COMPETITION AS CAL WON THE SHORT RELAY 1:40.7 SECONDS, BEATING UCLA BY THREE YARDS.

HART RAN THE ANCHOR LEG OF THE 440 RELAY BUT THEN PULLED SHORT WITH A HAMSTRING TEAR 30 YARDS INTO THE 100 YARD DASH WON BY UCLA'S WARREN EDMONSON IN 8.8. HART AND CURTIS WERE NOT ABLE TO RUN IN THE 200 YD BY JOHN SMITH OF THE BRUINS IN 21.4, WITH EDMONSON SECOND.

UCLA WAS LEADING 71-71 WHEN CHAPPINS PUT ON A BURST OVER THE FINAL 200 YARDS TO WIN THE THREE-MILE AND GIVE THE BRUINS AN INSURMOUNTABLE 78-71 LEAD. UCLA'S MILE RELAY TEAM DECIDED NOT TO RUN WHILE CAL RUNNERS FINISHED IN 3:15.8 FOR THE BEARS FINAL POINTS.

UCLA AND CAL EACH WON NINE EVENTS.

CAL'S JIM FRASER EMERGED AS THE MEET'S LONG DOUBLE WINNER BY TAKING THE TRIPLE JUMP IN 55 FEET, ONE-QUARTER INCH, A NEW PACIFIC-8 CONFERENCE RECORD, AND THE LONG JUMP IN 25-7. BOTH WINNING LEAPS CAME ON HIS FINAL EFFORT.

UCLA'S JAMES BUTTS ALSO EXCEEDED THE OLD PAC-8 RECORD OF 52-5 HELD BY MAHONEY SAMUELS OF USC IN THE TRIPLE JUMP WHEN HE CLEARED 52-10 1/2 FOR A BRUINS' SCHOOL RECORD.

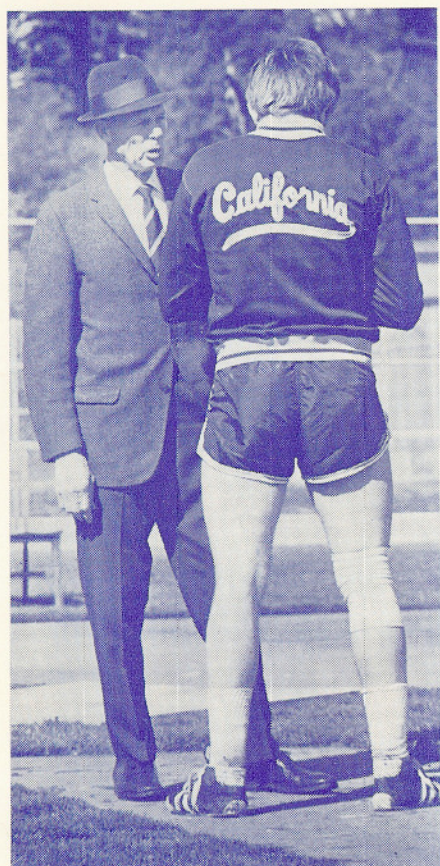
