#### Dons Impress In SJ Spikefest

SAN JOSE — San Carlos High, a first-time entrant, came up with what coach Jim Lutterell called a "very pleasant surprise" to place sixth in the 71-team Hill-Kiwanis track and field invitational Saturday at San Jose City College.

The Dons notched 16½ points, well behind prep super powers St. Ignatius (38), Los Altos (31) and Mount Pleasant (29), but barely trailing Washington (18) and Silver Creek (17). Gunn finished eighth with 15½ points and St. Francis was 13th with 10.

Bruce Veal, also outstanding in San Carlos' clutch SPAL dual victory over Gunn last week, led the Don surge with a tie for fourth in the 220 at 22.6 and fifth in the long jump at  $21-7\frac{1}{2}$ .

Veal also anchored San Carlos' fifth place mile relay team of Brad Weir, Matt Langley and Mike Grossman. The Dons' two-mile relay squad of Jim Scherba, John Pierog, Lee Shoop and Ron Cartmell was second in 8:23.9.

The third field standard to fall was in the high jump as Piedmont Hills' Al McCaskey leaped 6-8, breaking the old mark of 6-7 set by Awalt's Max Lowe in 1964.

Washington's (Fremont) Bob Grubbs ran off with the meet's outstanding

9:09.3 two-mile. Grubbs and Mount Pleasant's Steve Brooks locked in a tense dual over the eight laps with Brooks taking second in 9:11.3.
