# Track Survival Test

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Top five finishers in the Region II meet will advance to the Central Coast Section finals next Saturday at San Jose City College.

This means the SPAL contingent to the CCS finals may be fairly small — not because SPAL athletes are down, but because SCVAL is by far the strongest of the CCS leagues. The SPAL would hold its own with any other circuit.

Still, several SPAL individuals are expected to make SCVAL men a bit envious, particularly in the mile, two-mile, hurdles and pole vault.

Carlmont's junior mile sensation, Steve Miller, hopes to lead an SPAL sweep in that event, with Gunn's Steve Crowley, Carlmont's Chuck Oliver, Sequoia's Mark Daniel and San Carlos' Ken White all legitimately hopeful of qualifying for the CCS finals.

With Miller leading the way at 4:15.2, that quintet all ran at least 4:22.8 in last week's SPAL finals.

Carlmont's Carl Cattarin, Russ Black and Ed Barney appear to have good shots at two-mile qualification, as do Scot pole vaulters Paul Dempster, Jack Lennen, Chris Willett and Jim Katches.

Palo Alto hurdler Carl Florant (14.2 and 19.5) should challenge for first places, but Gunn's Bill Watts, Menlo-Atherton's Jim Watts and Sequoia's Marlon Murphy will have to be in top form to qualify.

Other top SPAL hopes include Woodside's Neil Barker in the 220 and Murphy in the 100, Woodside's Lamonte Wiley in the 440, Carlmont's Paul Brandow in the shot put and Ervin Brown in the high jump and M-A's Watts in the triple jump.

# Scots Win Two Events

CUPERTINO — Behind coach Loren Lansberry's stable of distance runners, Carlmont high finished a strong second and rising in the Region II Central Coast Section track and field meet Saturday night at Cupertino High.

The Santa Clara Valley Athletic League and the SPAL generally combine to produce some of the finest marks in Northern California during their annual affair, but a strong headwind ruined some hardfought victories in qualifying for this week's CCS finals at San Jose City College.

The Scots' Carl Cattarin and junior Steve Miller recorded impressive wins, while Carlmont's pole vaulters were felled by impressive winds.

Adverse weather conditions delayed an opportunity for Carlmont's four pole vaulters to qualify. Because of strong,

gusty winds, the meet director decided to switch the vault to this afternoon, hoping for better conditions.

Cattarin led a quartet of SPAL two-milers across the finish line as he recorded 9:30.0, followed by teammate Russ Black (9:31.3), Gunn's John Huggins (9:32.0) and the Scots' Ed Barney (9:38.8).

Miller "just ran to win" according to Lansberry as he nipped Gunn's Steve Crowley in the mile (4:19.1 to 4:19.4), while San Carlos' Ken White (4:24.4) finished in the fifth and final CCS qualifying spot.

Two of the finest individual efforts were turned in by Cubberley's Tom Morgan and Palo Alto's Carl Florant. Florant finished second in the high hurdles and won the 180 lows, and Morgan picked up a surprise double sprint victory (10.5, 23.3).

Other SPALers qualifying for the CCS finals included

M-A's Jim Watts in the high hurdles (third, 15.6); Carlmont's Bruce Sayre in the 880 (third, 1:59.3); Sequoia's Marlon Murphy in the 100 (third, 10.6) and Pat Purcell in the 880 (tie for fourth, 1:59.9); Woodside's Lamonte Wiley in the 440 (fourth, 51.5), and Neil Barker in the 220 (fifth 23.7) and Ravenswood's 440 relay team (fourth, 44.0).

In the field events, the SPAL could muster but three places, not counting the pole vault of course.

Carlmont's Paul Brandow finished behind Los Altos' super star Scott Overton in the shot (56-0) while San Carlos' Jeff Vetrovec took fifth (51-5), and Woodside's Jim Orr tied a school record with a fifth-place 6-2½ high jump.

Although the meet didn't call for an official team score, the temptation was too much (and too bad for the SPAL). While the SCVAL's Los Altos dominated the meet, Carlmont

was second followed by a large contingent of SCVAL schools.

M-A gave the SPAL a shot in the arm for the future when its young frosh-soph came through with an impressive second place behind Lynbrook.

Sophomore Don MacKenzie was responsible for most of M-A's points, taking wins in the 220 (24.1), 440 (50.7) and anchoring the Bears' winning mile relay team.

The SPAL faired a little bit better in the frosh-soph field events as Sequoia's Jim Data and Gunn's John Littleboy posted big wins.

Littleboy won the high jump with a leap of 6-4¾ — same as the varsity winning height — and Data took a first place ribbon in the shot with a heave of 55-5, almost three feet better than second place.

MacKenzie treated the frozen crowd to one of the finest individual efforts possible. His 440 win was equivalent to the varsity race, while his anchor leg in the relay was a major factor in M-A's win.

# Scot Vaulters Gain in CCS

CUPERTINO — Three of Carlmont High's four pole vaulting stars qualified for Saturday night's Central Coast Section track finals in Region II qualifying yesterday at Cupertino High.

Jim Katches, Chris Willett and Paul Dempster finished two-three-four at 13-10 behind Cupertino's Mike Jones, who won at the same height on fewer misses, 1½ feet better than his previous best.

Carlmont's Jack Lennen tied Mountain View's Harold Heintz at 13-7, but will only be

an alternate since he had more misses on the way up. Ironically, Lennen's leap would have won any of the other three regional crowns.

Katches and Willett both hit life bests.

The pole vault was held yesterday because high winds prevented it during Saturday night's program.

Carlmont's Paul Brandow was incorrectly listed in yesterday's Tribune as having put the shot an even 56 feet. Actually, his mark was a lifetime best 56-11.
