'Great tracky b meet' promised

Veteran Carlmont High track coach Loren Lansberry promises "a great meet, one of the best of the season" to-morrow on the Scot oval in the 11th annual Carlmont Invitational.

Lansberry has lined up the toughest dual meet teams he can find for the all-relay classic, co-sponsored by Carlmont and the Belmont Rotary Club. 9 a.m. Field events begin at and track events at 10.

Carlmont, unbeaten in the SPAL at 5-0, figures to finish last for the second straight year. Such is the quality of its competition — Berkeley, El Cerrito, St. Ignatius, Los Altos and Cupertino.

Berkeley and El Cerrito, loaded with fine sprinters and jumpers, are vying for the Alameda County Athletic League-North crown. St. Ignatius is the overwhelming power in the West Catholic

Athletic League and Los Altos and Cupertino are tops in the tough Santa Clara Valley Athletic League.

All events will be relays — 480 high hurdles, 720 low hurdles, 440, 880, mile, two-mile, four-mile and eight-mile plus the six field events. Four men will compose each relay team, placing a premium on depth.

Lansberry figures the competition will be so close that no favonite can be established. SI nipped Los Altos by a point in s i m i l a r circumstances last

The lone event Carlmont figures to win — its usual distance depth is depleted this year, though the Scots should still be a factor - is the pole vault.

Led by Jack Lennen (14-0) the Scots have a top-notch crew including Larry Gullette, Dean Roberts and Scott Hazel-

Carlmont hosts top competition

Six of Northern California's finest prep track and field teams gather today for the 11th annual Carlmont High Relays on the Scots' Belmont

Action in the all-relay classic, co-sponsored by Carlmont and the Belmont Rotary Club, begins at 9 a.m. with field events. Track action starts at

Defending champion St. Ig-natius, Los Altos, Berkeley, El Cerrito and Cupertino will join the host Scots in the 21/2-hour extravaganza.

Because of the caliber of competition, no favorite has been established. Carlmont, however, will be hard-pressed to avoid finishing last for the second straight season.

Lennen vaults 14-11/2, but Scots finish last

Though the hosts finished a distant last Saturday in a tight, talent-filled Carlmont High Relay Invitational track and field meet, the Scots had a couple of bright spots.

The brightest was senior Jack Lennen's life best 14-1½ pole vault to help Carlmont win its only event.

Only last Thursday Lennen leaped 14-0 in a dual meet; his best last season was 14-1. Scot coach Loren Lansberry thinks Lennen can successfully challenge Paul Dempster's school record of 14-63/4 set last year.

The other top Scot effort was a 1:59.3 leadoff leg by senior Bruce Sayre in the twomile relay, Sayre's season topper and only three-tenths off his life best.

El Cerrito won the classic with 50 points, but not without spirited competition from St. Ignatius (48), Berkeley (47) and Los Altos (46½). Cupertino followed with 42 and Carlmont local 201/ mont had 321/2.

Top individual efforts cluded a 181-8 discus throw by Los Altos' Jay Pushkin (third best in the Central Coast Section); 47-5 triple jump by Cupertino's Kevin McCarthy (he leads the CCS at 48-4) and shot puts of 54-2½ by Berkeley's Bob Johnson and 54-½ by SI's Alex Karakozoff.

Lennen teammed with Larry Gullette (13-0), Dean Roberts (11-6) and Scott Hazelton (11-6) to win the pole vault relay. Gullette tied his life best.
