SPAL track roundup

Lennen leap sparks Scot win

Carlmont High's Jack Lennen became the Central Coast Sections leading pole vaulter while the Scots, Palo Alto and Gunn became the SPAL track and field leaders yesterday.

Lennen leaped 13-9 to better his own seasonal best of 13-6 to lead Carlmont to a lopsided 111-24 win over Carlmont while Paly was beating Cubberley 97-38 and Gunn downed Menlo-Atherton 84-52.

Lennen's showing was outstanding, but not that much better than the show put on by the Trojans' James Ragland, who went to Carlmont last year but did not compete, won the 100 in 10.1 and the long jump in 20-9—both the best marks in yesterday's three meets.

Gunn didn't have all its horses, but it didn't need them in its win over the Bears. Steve Crowley won the mile and two mile while teammates Tom Oberhelman (shot put and discus) and Lars Combs (long jump and triple) won a pair of field events.

Both M-A coach Plato Yanicks and Gunn's counterpart Dan Sarouhan had praise for the Bears' Don MacKenzie. MacKenzie, who Yanicks professes will be in the State Meet in Woodland in June, looked sharp in the 880 beating the Titans' Hank Lawson—

—one of the better half milers in the SPAL.

Paly mentor Forrest Jamieson gave his star hurdler Carl Florant the day off, but that didn't help Cubberley a bit. The Vikings still won both hurdlers and almost every other event except for the 880 and the mile which Stacy Geiken captured for the Cougs.

Woodside High, which hasn't had a league meet as yet, will face one of the league's best Tuesday when they open the SPAL campaign with a delayed opener at San Carlos.

fourth best among Central Coast Section vaulters. Although the Scots were not overly impressive, they still managed to keep their record unblemished and tied with Gunn after five league battles.

Kingery and Viking hurdle ace Carl Florant were in championship form in the Palo Alto-San Carlos confrontation. Kingery set a meet record in the two mile (9:19.0) and then doubled back in the mile ahead of teammate Matt Yeo at 4:24.9.

Florant, a state meet veteran, set a pair of meet standards in the hurdles, clocking a SPAL season best 14.6 in the highs and equalling his top time of the year in the lows at 19.9.

Sequoia's Marlon Murphy won the 100, 440, anchored the 440 relay team to victory and copped second in the high jump, but that still wasn't enough to keep M-A from becoming the first of the two schools to win on its home track in their last eight annual meetings.

Tuesday it's another classic SPAL confrontation — unbeaten Gunn at unbeaten Carlmont for the track title. It's winner take all — the end of Carlmont's dual season, while Gunn has only very weak Sequoia remaining.

Carlmont looks like the loser, something like 71-65 by our "dope" sheet. In fact, we have so much faith in it we made a friendly wager with Scot coach Loren Lansberry, who naturally doesn't see it that way.

Here's our reasoning:

Distances — Ironically, they'll cost Carlmont the meet, and the title. Gunn's two super stars — Steve Crowley and recently eligible Gordon MacMitchell — will likely place one-two in either the mile, two-mile or 880.

Only since each is excellent, they figure to go in only one race against the other. Titan coach Dan Sarouhan isn't talking, but that's the common-sense thing to do.

Along with dependable Hank Lawson and Jerry Emory, Gunn figures to score 22 points to Carlmont's five in those three events.

Sprints — Give Carlmont a 9-0 edge in both 100 and 220 (incredible, since the Scots are traditionally weak in the sprints and tough in the distances). Gunn claims a 6-3 edge in the 440 with Bob Murray (51.7) a cinch winner and Chris Morrow likely to place third behind Carlmont's Vince Ketchens.

The hurdles, conservatively, are Gunn's 12-6. William Watts should win both handily, but Carlmont's Eric Carlson and Gunn's Rick Sutphen are perhaps the meet's key figures. Here, we give Carlson the edge over Sutphen, even though Sutphen has slightly better times.

Carlmont will win the 440 relay and Gunn the mile pass, so that's a standoff. Gunn gets a 45-37 edge on the track.

In the field, Gunn figures to win the high jump behind consistent 6-4 leaper John Littleboy, but Carlmont should take second and third. The long jump is Carlmont's, 6-3 — fig-

uring Gunn's Lars Combs can finish between Mike Mullins and Kerry Jones.

Combs and Morrow give Gunn a 6-3 triple jump edge — it says here — but that's probably the most up-in-the-air event of the meet. Jones could bust that wide open.

In the pole vault, Carlmont gets a 6-3 edge. Jack Lennen (141½") should win and Larry Gullette (13-0) should take third behind Gunn's Al Bay (14-0). But, if Bay beats Lennen as he always has in direct competition, look out. Gunn's Jesse Gomez also has a 13-0

The shot put and discus are both Gunn's, 6-3, behind Tom Oberhelman, the 5-8 dynamo who's one of the grittiest, most competitive athletes ever to play in the SPAL. Bruce Jaffe of Gunn looks to finish third in both events, with Carlmont's Howie Avila second in the shot and Mike Weber in the discus.

Thus, Carlmont's 28-26 field edge won't be able to offset its distance woes. Now, all they have to do is hold the meet

Gunn clinches crucial SPAL track win early

but they did come to a mutual agreement during yesterday's crucial SPAL track and field meet on the Scot campus.

"That's it for us," said the veteran Carlmont coach after the two-mile finish. "It's all over," countered Sarouhan as the Titans crossed the finish line with the first two places in the two-mile to put the wraps on an 86½-49½ Gunn victory.

The victory gives Gunn a 7-0 mark compared to a final 7-1 log for the Scots to all but hand the Titans the dual meet crown. As the man from Allstate says, "everything is in good hands" (for Gunn) as it finishes with Sequoia tomorrow. It would take an act of God to pull off an upset in that meet.

In other less important

meets, Woodside beat Menlo-Atherton 94-41, San Carlos crushed Ravenswood 112-24 and Palo Alto downed Sequoia 80-56.

"I got up at 3 o'clock this morning and re-doped the meet," said Sarouhan. "I originally had us winning by a narrow margin, but then I doped it if we had everything going our way we would get 96." He was almost right.

The Titans started off on the right foot as they got half the points in the first event — a dead heat 440 relay—in which they were underdogs. From there it was all downhill for the Scots.

After William Watts followed the relay with a victorious 15.6 120 high hurdles, veteran Steve Crowley ran a 1:56.2 half mile for the second best time in the Central Coast Section this season.

And he didn't do it all alone. Teammate Gordon MacMitchell, whose specialties are the mile and two-mile, pushed his buddy to the finish, placing second in 1:56.9 — the third best mark in the CCS.

Three events later MacMitchell ran easy to win the two-mile and the Titans managed a second spot as Carlmont

knew it was all over after only the sixth running event on the 16-event log.

Other top marks included Lars Combs' 43-10½ long jump for Gunn; Titan John Littleboy's meet record 6-2 in the high jump and a dual between Gunn's Al Bay and Carlmont's Jack Lennen in the pole vault.

Bay and Lennen finished with 14-0 vaults, but the Scot senior won on fewer misses. Neither could clear 14-6.

Woodside sophomore Myrt Easley set a school record in the triple jump with a leap of 45-7¼ while teammates Bob Abbott and Connor Taylor had a pair of nifty doubles.

Taylor beat M-A's Don MacKenzie, one of the league's best, in the 880 — as did the Wildcats' Robert Sweet in the 220 — while Abbott had the league's best weight double with a 160-1 discus and 52-10¼ shot. Soph Jamie Totoritis posted a fine 21-0 long jump for Woodside.

San Carlos soph Greg Malveaux turned in an impressive double of 6-3 (high jump) and 43-6 (triple jump) while teammate Lee Shoop won the mile and two mile against Ravenswood. The Trojans' James Ragland won the 100 (10.2),

440 (55.2) and anchored the winning 440-yard relay team.

Palo Alto's Carl Florant continued to glow as he set a school record in the low hurdles with a 19.2 clocking after winning the highs in 14.3. Tom Dixon pole vaulted 13-3 for Sequoia while Marlon Murphy won the 440 and 220.

In final 3:15 dual meets tomorrow, Palo Alto is at Ravenswood, San Carlos at M-A, Woodside at Cubberley and of course, Sequoia gets to travel to Gunn.
