American record and the 56-7 effort yesterday moved the mark up 51/2 inches. A graduate of Tufts University in Massachusetts, Maren moved to San Jose this year to concentrate on her training and has been working out with Al Feuerbach. She has been making a small salary, stenciling T-shirts.

"I kind of hoped I'd throw a little better today," she said, "but I guess you cannot complain about a record. From warmups, I thought I'd throw farther, but my other throws didn't feel that good."

Maren's teacher-friend Feuerbach, scored his second victory over George Woods in as many days in the men's shot, going 69-11 to win by nine inches. In Wichita Friday night, Big Al beat him, 70-10 to 70-3.

"I'm satisfied under the circumstan-ces," Feuerbach said. "I had to fly from Wichita to Denver to get some sleep and get here this morning. I was in Europe for nine days before that, then went from Lon-don to Chicago to Wichita. The airlines lost my baggage and it's been a hassle . . . but I love to compete, so I put up with it."

Even tired, Feuerbach managed an excellent series — 68-3½, foul, 69-6½, 67-8½, 69-11, 69-10½ — and had three puts better than Woods' best. It was the ninth meet this year Al has been over 69 feet.

The only meet record in the men's open division was John Powell's 215-0 effort in

the discus, breaking Tim Vollmer's yearold standard by nearly six feet.

"After getting off the big throw last week (223-4) in Modesto, I kind of slacked off in training this week," Powell said. "I figured on that. I wanted to ease off and then build up again for the AAU meet later.

"All I wanted here today was to get close to the meet record and since I broke it so easily I would have to say it was an awfully good throw. A lot better throwers than me have come here and nobody's done any better."

Certainly the popular result with the Berkeley crowd was the Cal sprint relay team's 40.0 upset of the Philadelphia Pioneers with Crockett and Hasley Crawford.
