# Nothing Slows Seaside En Route To Region IV Track Title

win the Region IV track and field crown Saturday at Hartnell College.

Seaside, qualifying 12 individuals in 11 events plus two relay teams, clearly outclassed the rest of the field as the team scores indicated.

The nearest competitor was Monterey with 35 and the point totals dropped off drastically thereafter. Alisal was third, Soquel fourth, Carmel fifth and Watsonville sixth.

More important than team points was the number of qualifiers for Friday's Central

Coast Section finals on San Jose City College's all-weather track.

Only the top three finishers Saturday advanced to the CCS championships. Monterey ended the day with six individual qualifiers plus a 440 relay foursome while Carmel had three as did Soquel. The Knights also will send their mile relay quintet.

Soquel's 880 artist Mark Wagner, with a 1:55.8 time, was one of three Santa Cruz County winners in the Region IV meet.

Wagner turned in a 1:54.9

clocking the week before for the best yet in the CCS ranks but the Knight senior just wasn't pushed enough Saturday to better his time.

San Lorenzo Valley's Bill Gervasi, already with the first MBL title for the Cougars in his grasp, broke a school record in the pole vault with a 13-8 effort. Last week Gervasi added the first MBL crown to the Cougar trophy case with a 13-0 vault.

Soquel vaulter Andy Munoz finished second, going 12-6 and Richard Munoz of Watsonville was third at 12-0.

The Valley's weightman Joe Krasny garnered the third first-place honor by heaving the shot put 50-8 3/4. Watsonville's Kevin Markoe nabbed third (48-4 3/4) after winning the event a week earlier.

A new Soquel record was set when Jim Fox finished third in the 180 yard low hurdles in 19.9 behind the speedy winning time of David Dew of Alisal at 19.6.

The Soquel mile relay team of Marty Capron, John Thomas, Mark Wagner and Scott Meyer established a new mark in 3:28.2. Seaside won the event in

3:27.9.

Joining Markoe and Munoz from Watsonville will be John Beacom with a second place finish in the 120 yard high hurdles (15.2) and Rudy Munoz with a second place effort in the two mile (9:34.5). Only a tenth of a second separated Munoz and winner Andy Jones of Carmel.

Santa Cruz' lone qualifier to the CCS finals will be Allen Sandretti with a 9:47.6 time for third in the two mile.

Only one Region IV record tumbled when Carlos Jacobo let

loose with a 171-1 measurement in the discus, breaking the old standard set by Gary Kelly of Carmel of 162-0 in 1960.

The 440 had the most controversy. Monterey's Kirk Collins, holder of the top CCS time for the year, scratched from the race Saturday in order to put more concentration into the high jump. On the same token, Mike Morga with a previous time of 50.9, was scratched for failing to show and he would have easily gone on to the CCS finals.

Perry Cockerham of Seaside, the meet's only double winner, went on to capture the 440 (51.5) and pulled the Spartans to their first in the mile relay with a tremendous final leg.

Non qualifiers included Capron in the 120 high (15.5, fifth), Eric Stakkstad of Aptos in the 880 (1:58.2, fourth), Bill Dykstra of Marelo Prep in the shot put (48-2, fourth) and Barry Lesman of Harbor with a 8-0 leap in the high jump, good for fourth.

Aptos, Harbor and Marelo Prep failed to qualify anyone for the CCS finale.
