Kimball sets new distance double mark in state meet

Rich Kimball of DeLaSalle (Concord) recorded the fastest distance double in high school history and Muir of Pasadena captured the boys' team title in the 56th annual state high school track meet before 11,000 fans Saturday night at memorial Stadium.

Berkeley came away with the girls' championship, scoring 13 points, and the girls shattered the National Division for Girls and Women's Sports record book with seven new marks in the 11 events.

Muir tallied 23 points to win its third state championship, taking honors in 1934 and 1967. The Pasadena crew of Walter Opp dethroned Wilson of San Francisco, which finished second with 14 points.

Kimball set the only new boys' state meet record when he outkicked Laguna Beach sophomore Eric Hulst in the last 220

yards to time 8:46.5. It was the fourth fastest time ever run by an United States prep. Hulst became the greatest sophomore runner ever with his 8:50.5 clocking, which was also under the old state meet record of 8:52.3 by Curtis Beck of Santa Monica in 1972.

Kimball then came back to take the mile, the first time a California prep has accomplished this feat. The race turned into the most exciting of the night with Andy Clifford of Sunny Hills running at Kimball's side for the last 350 yards. Kimball outleaned Clifford at the tape in 4:06.6. His mile and two-mile times broke by four-tenths the double Kimball accomplished earlier in the year, 4:02.6 and 8:51.0.

Best placings for Bakersfield entrants in the meet was third, accomplished by Joel Andrews of West in the 100 and

Bakersfield's mile-relay team. South was fourth in the mile relay after Las Lomas was disqualified while Andrews took a fifth place in the 440.

Muir wrapped up the team title with a near state record in the mile relay, timing 3:13.8, a 1974 national best. Castlemont holds the state mark of 3:13.2.

Bakersfield was just edged by Long Beach Poly, 3:16.8 to 3:16.9. The Drillers had run 3:15.8 in Friday trials. Splits for the Drillers were Kervin Bennett (49.9), John Jansen (49.8), Raymond Fite (49.1) and John Greasham (48.1). South, timing 3:18.1, recorded the following splits. Ardes Gardner (49.7), Chuck Ray (50.4), Harlan Hunter (49.7) and Vinson Cotton (48.3).

The 100, run against a slight wind, went to Crawford of San Diego junior Elijah Jefferson for the second eight year

in a slow 9.8. Andrews was just edged by Mike Simmons of Carson, both timing 9.9.

In the 440, Andrews dropped behind in the first 220 and then turned on a strong stretch run for a 48.5, off the 48.0 he ran in Friday's heats. Rod Conners of Cordova (Sacramento) took first-place honors with a 47.7.

Willie Banks of Oceanside won his second straight state triple jump title with a 50-7 mark, only two inches off the state meet record he set in Friday's trials. Marvin Blackwell of East was a non-scoring sixth at 46-10¹/₂.

In addition to its mile-relay win, Muir earned first places in both hurdle events from Fred Shaw. He stepped off the highs in 13.7, just off the state meet record of 13.8, then came back to take the lows in 18.8.

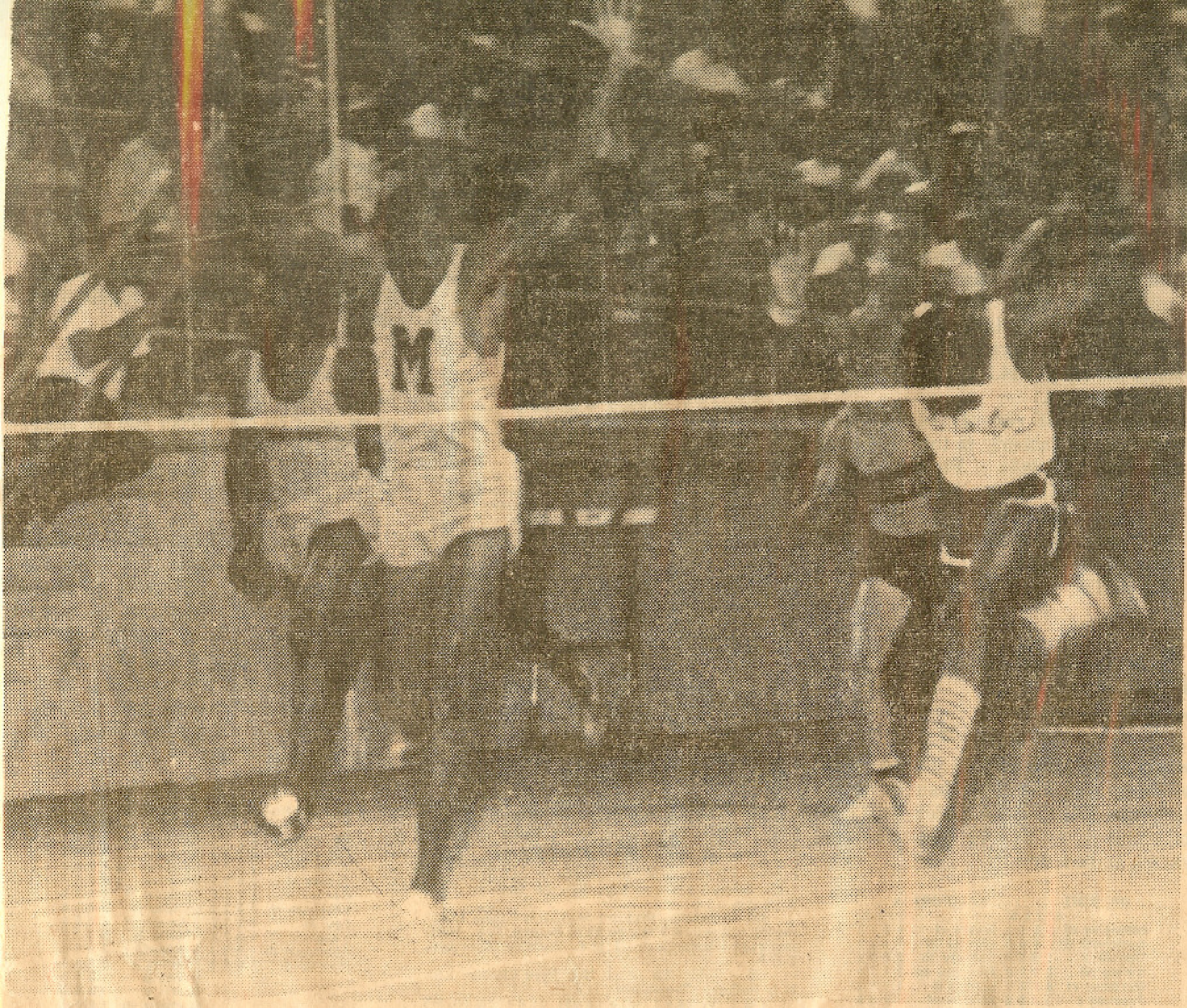

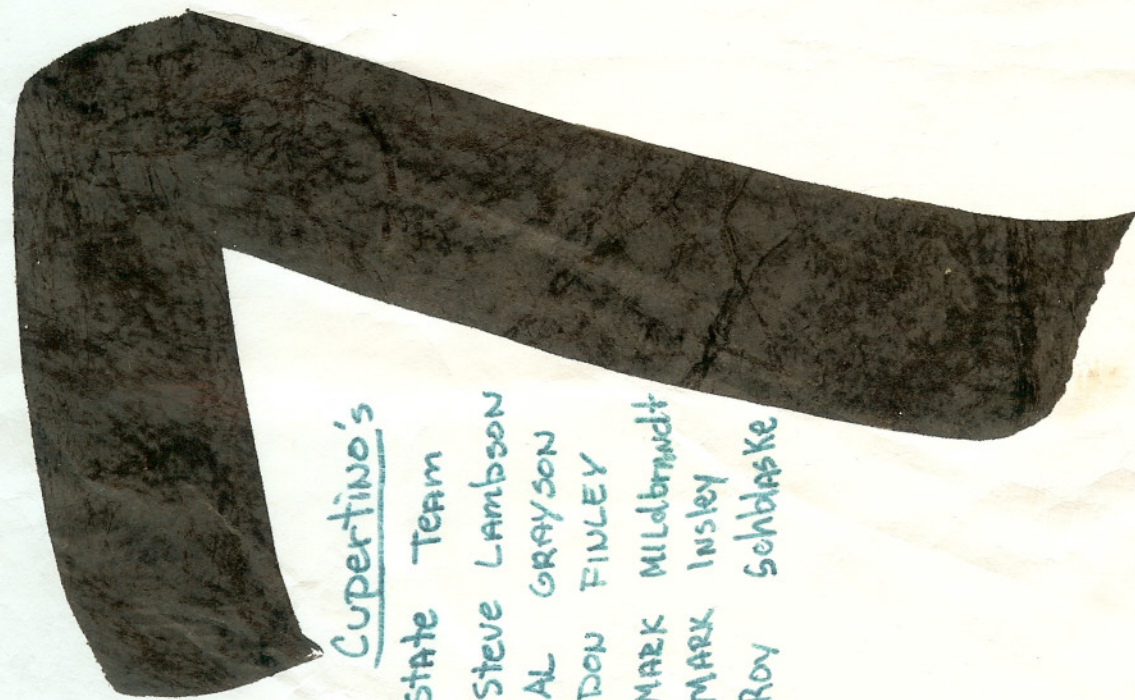

Cupertino guns for state

SAN JOSE — With surprise team champion Cupertino High pointing the way, a plethora of Midpeninsula track and field athletes found the road to Bakersfield in Friday night's Central Cost Section championships at San Jose City College.

The Pioneers scored 29 points in winning a rare back-to-back CCS crown, outdistancing Mt. Pleasant (21) and Los Altos (17) in the process.

Cupertino's title-winning performance highlighted an excellent combined Santa Clara Valley-South Peninsula Athletic League effort.

The two loops, which comprise Region II in the CCS, proved the class of the section by winning half the events in grabbing off 23 of the available 48 berths for the State Meet next weekend.

The SCVAL took 15 of the slots on

the strength of five first places with the SPAL producing three gold medalists among its eight state qualifiers.

Included among the SCVAL-SPAL highlights were sweeps (1-2-3) in the 440, low hurdles and two-mile, one-two finishes in the long and high jump and a one-three placing in the high hurdles.

Mark Mildbrandt spearheaded Cupertino's charge to the team crown. The consistent senior won the high hurdles in 14.4, anchored the mile relay team to a 3:21.2 victory — five seconds under the school record — and placed second to Los Altos' Dave Jakle in the low hurdles.

Another Mark, Insley, produced a third Pioneer victory with a 6-6 leap in the high jump while Don Finley picked up a second place in the log jump behind Woodside's Phil Robinson who leaped a lifetime best 23-2½.

Finley also ran the second leg on the mile relay.

Cupertino's biggest victory, which wasn't a win at all, was Roy Schablaske's third place shot put of 57-7.

"When he came through that really turned the meet around for us," said coach Norm Eliason.

Los Altos, one of the pre-meet favorites, fared poorly in the weights which severely hurt its chances. Rick Rossi did place fourth at 56-10 — more

than two feet off his best — but Brent Long did not place in the shot nor Kurt Vonagas in the discus.

Jakle's 19.7 around a turn in the lows was the Knights' only win, but Doug Hill ran well in taking thirds in both the 100 and 220 and anchored their 440 relay team to another third.

Silver Creek's Millard Hampton won both sprints easily, as expected, in 9.7 and 20.9, the latter time equalling his national best.

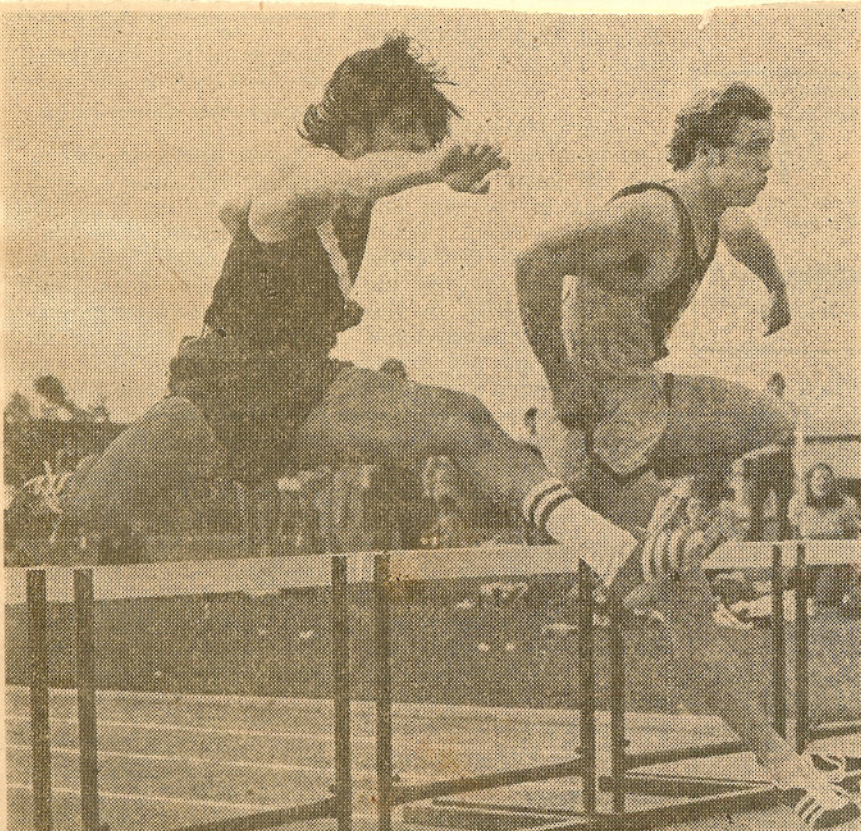
St. Francis' Mike Kasser won another trip to the State Meet but had

SAN DIEGO PREP RUNS 9.4 IN 100, TIES STATE MARK

BAKERSFIELD—One State meet record was set and another was equaled during highly competitive qualifying in the 56th annual California State High School track and field meet before 5,500 fans Friday night at Bakersfield College.

With many athletes getting their first competition on the super-swift Tartan track, times were outstanding.

The record-setter was Oceanside's Willie Banks, who triple-jumped 50-9 to break his own mark of 49-1 set in winning last year.

Another defending champion, San Diego Crawford junior Elijah Jefferson, blitzed the field in winning his 100 heat in 9.4, tying the mark set by Mel Gray of Montgo-

mery (Santa Rosa) in 1967.

The other two heats were won by Carson's Michael Simmons and West Bakersfield junior Joel Andrews, both 9.5. With SF Wilson's Mike Farmer and Silver Creek's Millard Hampton also advancing, tonight's final promises to be a scorcher.

Simmons, the City 100 and 200 champion, was outstanding again, winning his 220 heat in 21.1 and bringing the Colts from last place to a second-place finish in their 440 relay heat.

The qualifiers in the boys competition will be joined by the girls this evening for the finals with field events starting at 5:15 and running at 7 o'clock.

As for the team race, Muir and San Francisco Wilson each lost a key performer in one event but otherwise came through as expected.

Muir's Jim Austin, figured for third in the high hurdles, crashed into the fifth hurdle, spun around and didn't finish the race.

But SF Wilson's Mike Farmer, who was picked to finish second, was eliminated in his 220 heat as he was nipped at the wire by Chino sophomore Jason Law.

SF Wilson, which set a State record last year in the 440 relay in 41.0, again looked impressive in taking its heat in 41.2 after Kennedy of Richmond ran 41.8 and Muir 41.5.

Muir Wins State Track Crown; Kimball Runs 4:06.6 and 8:46.5

BAKERSFIELD—It was a night to remember for Muir High and especially Fred Shaw.

And, even as Rich Kimball of De La Salle High in Concord was turning in a superlative mile-two-mile double in the 56th annual California State high school championships, Muir and Shaw were just as much in the spotlight.

Shaw, using "fright" as his motivation, won the high hurdles in 13.7 seconds and the lows in 18.9 before a crowd of 11,000 Saturday night at Bakersfield College.

And then he turned in a 47.7 third leg as the Mustangs capped the evening with a national best 3:13.8 clocking in the mile relay.

The mile relay was just the frosting as Muir had already clinched its third State title. Muir finished with 23 points to 14 for defending champion San Francisco Wilson.

"Give the credit to (Alan) Sheats", Shaw said. Alan Sheats ran 48.2 on the second leg and pushed Muir to a

20-yard lead that Shaw and Jim Austin, 48.1, maintained the rest of the way.

Shaw and Austin, who swapped

wins in the Masters and 4-A CIF meets in the hurdles, finished 1-3 in the loss against some very stiff competition.

"I had some trouble with the curve in the loss but got it going after the curve. In the highs, I got a good jump and managed to stay ahead. You might say I was running scared," Shaw said.

Kimball, who had run 4:02.4 and 8:51.4 previously, came through with a State record 8:46.5 in taking the two-mile over Laguna Beach sophomore Eric Hulst and then bounced back one hour later to win the mile in 4:06.6 in a stirring stretch duel with Sunny Hills' Andy Clifford.

In the two-mile, Kimball and Hulst made it a private party almost immediately. Kimball was the leader for five laps, turning the first mile in 4:21.9. But Hulst, who had hung about 15 yards behind, made his move on the sixth lap and took a slim lead in 6:37.6.

They were dead even with 440 yards to go when Kimball sprinted out to a 20-yard lead around the first curve. He maintained that edge the rest of the way in breaking the record of 8:52.3 set by Santa Monica's Curtis Beck in 1972.

Kimball's time equals the fourth best in prep history (the national record is 8:41.0 by Craig Virgin of Lebanon, Ill. in 1973) and he becomes the third fastest individual.

Hulst, who said he ran the race strategically the way he wanted, was timed in 8:50.5, establishing national marks for a sophomore and a 16-year-old.

In the mile, Kimball was content to stay back for the first half, which was run in 2:05.9. Kimball took the lead on the third lap, passed the three-quarters in 3:09.8, then really showed his stuff.

Clifford, who had been biding his time, moved up to challenge with about 220 to go and from then to the wire, it was an all-out sprint with Kimball just holding on as Clifford was only one-tenth back at the finish.

The first girls' state championships, held in conjunction with the boys' meet, produced seven national girls' records, including a 19-7 long jump by Washington's Jodi Anderson and a 5:02.2 mile by Jill Caldwell of Westminster.

Berkeley took the team title with 13 points (Washington was third with nine) while La Jolla's Janice Wiser was an impressive double winner, taking the 100 in 10.8 and the 220 in 24.2. Berkeley won the 440 relay (47.5) and the 880 medley relay (1:46.4).

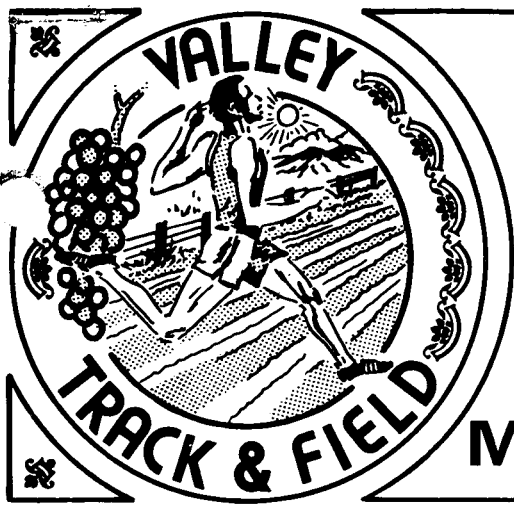

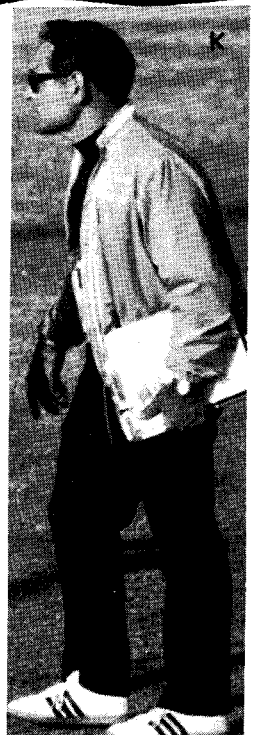
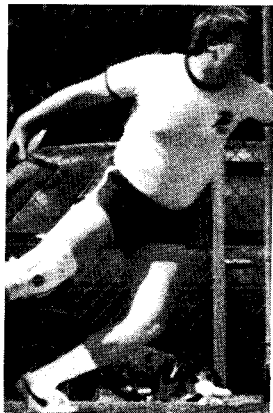

BAKERSFIELD — Avenal High School runner John Avila set a new school record in the two-mile run, but girls from Corcoran and Coalinga grabbed higher placings in the state high school track and field championships Saturday.

Avila ran the two-mile in an unofficial time of 9:07.8 — his personal best — to finish 10th in the event. Rich Kimball of De La Salle of Concord, who also won the mile race, ran the two-mile in the state record time of 8:46.5 — the fourth best in prep history.

Muir High School of Pasadena won the team championship behind hurdler-sprinter Fred Shaw, who captured the high hurdles in 13.7, low hurdles in 18.9, then ran a 47.7 third leg on his team's winning mile relay which had a national best clocking of 3:13.8.

Stealing the thunder from the local area were Patsy Cervantes of Corcoran, who finished second in the mile run in 5:08.9 behind a record-setting pace, and Alice Trumbly of Coalinga, third in the 880 in 2:13.7.

Both Miss Cervantes and Miss Trumbly set valley records during the Central Section championship track meet May 25 in Clovis.

The first girls' state champions were held in conjunction with the boys' meet, producing seven national girls' records, including a 5:02.2 mile by Jill Caldwell of Westminster. Berkeley took the girls' team title.

Scott Fairley Hits State Track Mark

Scott Fairley took aim on the state track and field pole vault finals Friday night in Bakersfield, fired and hit his mark.

Fairley, a vaulter on the Las Plumas High School track and field team who qualified for the state meet on May 24 in Oroville with a 13 foot, 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch vault, easily cleared 13-9 on his first attempt Friday night to move into the state finals on Saturday night with 13 other vaulters.

He vaulted 13-6 on Saturday night, according to his coach at Las Plumas, Norm Mac Kenzie, but his pole followed him through and he didn't make the mark on his second attempt.

CIF meet exciting, productive as well

Invariably, the California Interscholastic Federation's track and field championship meet is one of the most exciting and productive events of its sort in the United States.

Rarely does a year go by when at least one national prep record isn't either broken or tied. National best times and distances a common place during both the Friday trials and Saturday finals.

This year's CIF meet at Bakersfield College in the valley failed to produce any boys' American records, but the girls, participating officially for the first time, more than made up for that with seven Division for Girls' and Women's Sports national marks, one by Pleasant Hill High's Kathy Costello.

Costello, a junior, ran away from the field in the half-mile for a 2:10.4 win, breaking her own pending national mark by nearly three full seconds. She had been shooting for a 2:08, but without anyone pushing wasn't able to accomplish that.

Berkeley High, the girls' team champion, established two of the national girls' records, winning the 440 relay in 47.5 and the 880 medley relay in 1:46.4.

Although the boys didn't break any national marks, they came up with a number of national bests during the weekend, with De La Salle High's Rich Kimball's 8:46.5 two-mile performance one of the more outstanding efforts.

Kimball later won the mile in 4:06.6 to become one of two double winners in this year's meet, the 56th annual one. Fred Shaw of Pasadena's Muir High, the boys' team champion, was the other, capturing both hurdle races.

Shaw defeated Las Lomas High's Rich Graybehl in the 180 lows by the barest of margins. Graybehl was timed in 18.9, the same as Shaw, after his block slipped "about six inches. They didn't call us back."

The same thing happened to another Knight, Steve Herrmann, during Friday night's low hurdle trials.

Graybehl turned in the best quarter of the boys' mile relay Saturday, only to find out his 47.2 was for naught when the Knights were disqualified. Leadoff man Dan Watts, said meet officials, ran out of his lane on the first turn of the initial lap to draw the disqualification.

Graybehl's fine 440 had moved the Knights from seventh to fourth with a 3:17.9. In addition to his split, Watts ran a 50.6, Jay Hardy a 50.3, and Herrmann a 49.8.

Piedmont's Mike Bartlett had a little trouble with the officials, too, regarding the same rule. In Friday's 440 trials he was almost disqualified for running out of his lane — one judge was under the impression that if a runner's right foot touches the inside lane marker, he should be disqualified. The rule states that disqualification can come only after a competitor has taken three consecutive steps in another runner's lane.

Although the 48.3 Bartlett ran in the finals is his lifetime best, he still claimed, "I didn't feel good. I'm sore from yesterday (Friday), and I didn't get out fast enough."

He wasn't too disappointed by his overall performance, however, noting he'd only been running the half-mile for two months. He ran his first 440 in the Highlanders' fourth meet of the year.

Another relative newcomer to success is Monte Vista high jumper Mark Wilson, second at state with a 6-10 jump. He experienced a host of problems Friday getting his steps right, and Saturday he claimed, "I still had my steps up too close."

"I'm so inexperienced," he explained, referring to the fact he's only recently become a good high jumper. A year ago the best Wilson could do was finish eighth in the East Bay Athletic League meet.

Until Charles Hatch of Wilson High in San Francisco cleared 7-0 on his final jump, it seemed as if the Monte Vista jumper would win the title because he had fewer misses than the SF prep.

"I'm glad he got it," Wilson emphasized, "he's been jumping a lot longer than I have."

Obviously, Wilson wasn't too disappointed. Things have happened so fast this spring, he really hasn't had a chance to become jaded, too used to winning.

Another surprising placer at the state meet was freshman Suzy Boehner of Clayton Valley. Boehner captured third in the high jump at 5-4 after having long jumped a non-scoring 15-8½ for eighth.

High jumpers are among the more individualistic of track and field competitors, often wearing two separate shoe types while jumping. They also utilize innumerable stances while psyching themselves up.

Wilson, for instance, places his arm in front of his face, as if to shade his eyes from the sun, and then gives a backwards leap before making his approach to the cross bar.

Boehner is no different in this respect. She stands almost as if preparing to start a race, left leg about two feet behind the right, staring intently at the bar. Before starting her run to the pit, she moves the left leg forward several inches and rocks back and forth.

The whole time, Suzy clutches a red rabbit's foot. "I wouldn't think of jumping without it," she commented Saturday between jumps. She raises rabbits and "I have a lot of faith in my rabbit's foot."

The third-place finish didn't disappoint her, either: "As long as I did better than the last time, I'm satisfied."

Antioch High's Pat Zech was the only other local

athlete scoring points at state this year, putting together a 59-10 for a fourth in the shot put.

Unplacing finalists included Graybehl in the 120 highs, San Ramon's Roy Kissin in the two-mile, and Antioch's Bob Pfaffenberger in the pole vault.

Graybehl was seventh in the highs, exactly where he should have been, if Kennedy High's Robert Gaines is to be believed. Gaines, fourth in that race, has been quoted as saying, "I never think of Graybehl as a factor in a race."

San Ramon's Kissin, a junior, was practically awed by the final results in his race. "It's unreal," he exclaimed after running a personal best of 9:08.0 for ninth.

Everyone of the first five finishers was under nine minutes, with Kimball the winner in a state-meet record 8:46.5, only five seconds off the national record held by Steve Prefontaine.

Since he wasn't running with the leaders, Kissin lost contact with the pace. This happens frequently to the runners in the middle of the pack. They don't want to — or can't — keep up with the front-runners, yet don't want to run way back with the stragglers.

It's difficult under those circumstances to establish a fast pace.

The mile field was nearly as strong as the two-mile aggregation. The nine-man group, timed from Kimball's winning 4:06.6 to the ninth-place 4:11.4, was the fastest such race ever run in high school competition.

It was so fast, in fact, the last-place time matched last year's winning clocking.

Next year's CIF championship meet has been scheduled for San Diego, with the 1976 meeting to be held at the University of California in Berkeley.

And they're as likely spots to produce records as Bakersfield.

Hoover Qualifies Five, Eyes State Title

FAKESFIELD—Hoover High School's hopes for a state track and field championship are still alive. So, however, are those of at least four other teams.

Despite a couple of setbacks in Friday's qualifying events, Hoover remains in the thick of the team race at the 38th annual California Interscholastic Federation state carnival at Memorial Stadium.

Today's finals, starting with the pole vault at 3:35 p.m., and running events at 7 p.m., offer plenty of excitement. There are some excellent competitive pairs. The first girls' events in the history of the meet and a wide open team race.

Two athletes from California's "demon under" provided the headline-grabbers Friday. Willie Banks of Riverside smashed the meet record in the triple jump with a

50.4 effort and junior Elgin Jefferson of Crawford High in Los Angeles equaled the meet record in the 100 with a 9.4 clocking.

Tonight's biggest battle, however, will be for the team title. It very well could go down to the final event.

Hoover's sophomore Patrons have as good a shot at the title as any team, gaining five spots in the finals. Gardena, Mar of Pasadena, defending champion Wilson of San Francisco and Kennedy of Redwood also have five finalists.

The scoring capabilities of the five team challengers range from 13 to 17 points. Eighteen points would win the meet going away.

Hoover's hopes rely with long jumper-triple jumper Dave Williams, shotputter Russ Brown, and discus thrower Mark McNaughton. The Patrons also qualified their 400 relay team.

McNaughton, suffering from a

throat infection, had to drop out of the shot put and had only one legal throw in the discus. Williams, who runs on the relay team as well as his jumping, did not go in the 220.

Including three two-strikes, the relay has 22 hurdles in tonight's finals.

Typically, the meet started off with a bang—just intended. None in California this year.

Kennedy won the first heat in 41.8 but Mar jumped that with a 41.5 in the second heat. Then Wilson equaled the fastest time in the nation

with a 41.2 in the final heat.

Hoover was the only valley team to make the final, getting a third behind Wilson with a 42.4. Valley champion Nelson was fourth in the heat with a 42.7 and Rosemead went unplaced with a 43.8.

The first heat of the 800 also produced a state-leading mark, a 1:51.2 by John Smith of Burbank. In that same race, Mike Edwards of East Los Angeles took four seconds off his best time with a 1:52.7 to move to the No. 2 spot on the valley's all-time

list—and did not qualify for the finals.

Jon Harbner of Ballard qualified by improving to 1:51.4, now No. 4 on the valley all-time list. Exeter freshman Larry Gonzalez was well off the pace with a 2:01.6.

Jefferson was not the only standout in the 160 trials. The other two heats were won in 2.5 by Michael Simmons of Los Angeles' Canyon and Joel Anderson of West Hollywood. Andrews, the West Coast Bolero champion, equaled the valley's best ever mark.

The valley's two other 100 entries, Virgil Furman of El Paso and Vince Walker of Dos Palos, both timed 9.9 but failed to qualify.

The valley placed all three teams however in the finals. The top mark of the three was by Sage Alexander of Tulare Western with a personal best of 172-11, the second best throw of the competition. McNaughton struggled, but smacked 277.5, to earn

qualify and San Grant of Thousand Oaks made the finals with a 162.6.

Terry Brown of Melrose and Bill Scarborough of Clovis both made the high jump finals by clearing 6'4". Twenty-one jumpers made 6'4 but Taylor's Willard Sage went out after clearing 6'2.

With McNaughton scratched in the shot put, much of Hoover's hopes rely with Brown, who has thrown 62.3 this year but reached only 59.6 on Friday. Alexander failed to qualify despite a good 56.2.

The high hurdles' finals might be as competitive as the century. With champion Dale Cooper of Harry Ellie in Redwood, Mike Harris of Indio and Fred Hays of Moorpark started 1:17 and three others came in at 1:2.8.

The only valley high hurdler in the final is Bakersfield's Mike Harper, who ran 14.1. Bonache's Phil Strasser led after setting several hurdles and

Ridge Nabs Third

BAKERSFIELD — Mark Ridge of Merced soared 6-10 Saturday night to place third in the high jump during the state high school track and field championships at Bakersfield Memorial Stadium.

Charles Hatch of Wilson of San Francisco notched a dramatic victory by clearing seven feet for the first time in his career.

"Hatch missed twice at seven feet," said Merced High track coach Jerry McClenaghan. "He was the last jumper and he made it on his last try."

Mark Wilson of Monte Vista (Danville), who set a national interscholastic prep record with a 7-1 $\frac{3}{4}$ effort last month at the West Coast Relays in Fresno, settled for 6-10 and second place over Ridge on the basis of one fewer miss.

Record Falls

Merced's Richard Bega, competing in the two mile, was clocked in 9:28.0 and did not place. In that race Richard Kimball of Concord's De La Salle High School set a state prep record of 8:46.5.

"It was just a fantastic race," said McClenaghan. "The second guy (Eric Hulst of Laguna Beach) was a sophomore and he set a national record (8:50.5) for his age group."

Kimball also took the mile, edging Andy Clifford of Sunny Hills (Fullerton) with a 4:06.6 clocking.

Muir High of Pasadena won the team title with 23 points. Defending champion Wilson was second with 13, followed by De La Salle (12) and John F. Kennedy (10) of Richmond and Gardena (10) in fourth.

Regains Form

Ridge, who qualified for last year's state meet but did not place, approached the early-season form which enabled him to clear seven feet at the Smith-Iverson Relays in Modesto.

He's been hampered in recent weeks by a nagging injury to his right foot, a cracked bone in his big toe, but it wasn't apparent Saturday night.

"He jumped real well," said McClenaghan. "That's the best he's looked since he got hurt."

Clark Beedle of La Sierra in Sacramento, who has done seven feet and has dueled with Ridge on several occasions, was somewhat of a disappointment Saturday night and went out at 6-8.

Merced's Mike Dobbins and Atwater's Rich LaVelle made it to the state meet in the triple jump and 440, respectively, but were eliminated in Friday night's qualifying.

Prestigious Meet

Ridge and teammate Charles Wheeler, who ranks among the top triple jumpers in the nation with a 48-8 best, have been invited to compete in the prestigious Chicago National Prep Invitational track meet Saturday.

"They try to get the best 10 people in the nation in all events," noted McClenaghan. "I think Beedle will be there, and I think Hatch will go."

Ridge will definitely compete, but it's not yet certain whether or not Wheeler will go.

Wheeler has an off-day at the Sac Joaquin Sub-Section finals and was eliminated.

Muir Wins State Track Crown; Kimball Runs 4:06.6 and 8:46.5

BAKERSFIELD—It was a night to remember for Muir High and especially Fred Shaw.

And, even as Rich Kimball of De La Salle High in Concord was turning in a superlative mile-two-mile double in the 56th annual California State high school championships, Muir and Shaw were just as much in the spotlight.

Shaw, using "fright" as his motivation, won the high hurdles in 13.7 seconds and the lows in 18.9 before a crowd of 11,000 Saturday night at Bakersfield College.

And then he turned in a 47.7 third leg as the Mustangs capped the evening with a national best 3:13.8 clocking in the mile relay.

The mile relay was just the frosting as Muir had already clinched its third State title. Muir finished with 23 points to 14 for defending champion San Francisco Wilson.

"Give the credit to (Alan) Sheats", Shaw said. Alan Sheats ran 48.2 on the second leg and pushed Muir to a

20-yard lead that Shaw and Jim Austin, 48.1, maintained the rest of the way.

Shaw and Austin, who swapped

wins in the Masters and 4-A CIF meets in the hurdles, finished 1-3 in the loss against some very stiff competition.

"I had some trouble with the curve in the loss but got it going after the curve. In the highs, I got a good jump and managed to stay ahead. You might say I was running scared," Shaw said.

Kimball, who had run 4:02.4 and 8:51.4 previously, came through with a State record 8:46.5 in taking the two-mile over Laguna Beach sophomore Eric Hulst and then bounced back one hour later to win the mile in 4:06.6 in a stirring stretch duel with Sunny Hills' Andy Clifford.

In the two-mile, Kimball and Hulst made it a private party almost immediately. Kimball was the leader for five laps, turning the first mile in 4:21.9. But Hulst, who had hung about 15 yards behind, made his move on the sixth lap and took a slim lead in 6:37.6.

They were dead even with 440 yards to go when Kimball sprinted out to a 20-yard lead around the first curve. He maintained that edge the rest of the way in breaking the record of 8:52.3 set by Santa Monica's Curtis Beck in 1972.

Kimball's time equals the fourth best in prep history (the national record is 8:41.0 by Craig Virgin of Lebanon, Ill. in 1973) and he becomes the third fastest individual.

Hulst, who said he ran the race strategically the way he wanted, was timed in 8:50.5, establishing national marks for a sophomore and a 16-year-old.

In the mile, Kimball was content to stay back for the first half, which was run in 2:05.9. Kimball took the lead on the third lap, passed the three-quarters in 3:09.8, then really showed his stuff.

Clifford, who had been biding his time, moved up to challenge with about 220 to go and from then to the wire, it was an all-out sprint with Kimball just holding on as Clifford was only one-tenth back at the finish.

The first girls' state championships, held in conjunction with the boys' meet, produced seven national girls' records, including a 19-7 long jump by Washington's Jodi Anderson and a 5:02.2 mile by Jill Caldwell of Westminster.

Berkeley took the team title with 13 points (Washington was third with nine) while La Jolla's Janice Wiser was an impressive double winner, taking the 100 in 10.8 and the 220 in 24.2. Berkeley won the 440 relay (47.5) and the 880 medley relay (1:46.4).

Kimball Wins Twice

BAKERSFIELD—Even the most casual fan knew something special had happened. There was De La Salle's Rich Kimball circling the Bakersfield Community College track, receiving a standing ovation from 11,000 fans.

Kimball, shin splints and all, last night clocked the fastest ever mile, two-mile double at the 56th annual State Meet, won by Muir of Pasadena with 23 points. Defending champion Wilson of San Francisco was second with 14.

Kimball personally led his team to third, scoring all 12 points, while Kennedy of Richmond was fourth with 10. Berkeley High won the first-ever girls' meet with 13 points, with La Jolla second at 10.

Kimball won the two-mile with an 8:46.5 and turned in a brilliant final 220 yards to win the mile at 4:06.7. Last year's track Athlete of the Year, Craig Virgin, tried the double and won the two-mile at 8:42.6 and finished second in the mile at 4:12.2.

After winning the two-mile, Kimball admitted he wasn't sure of the mile.

"I wanted to run the two-mile—definitely. It was the first time I've ever been able to run it without having to run the mile first," he said.

"My coach and I talked for the entire time about the mile. I think I'd have run it, even if he had said no." Kimball gained the lead at the end of the third lap and turned in a 56.8 final 440 split to hold off Andy Clifford of Sunny Hills-Pullerton.

Oakland's highest finisher was triple jumper Don Jackson with a second-place 47.8.

"I'm out-of-shape," complained the Wildcat. "I've been in the hospital with appendicitis and will have it taken out next week. I feel almost bad about this. Don Bryson (who finished out of the running in the long jump) taught me to triple jump."

Kennedy's strength was shown early when the team of Charles Johnson, Robert Gaines, Archie Barnes and Paul Jackson started the boys running events with a 41.4 first-place time in the 440 relay.

"Handoffs were the key," said sprinter Jackson, who came back to claim fourth in the 100. "We tried to make them almost out of the lane so we could get more speed. We thought all along we could win it. (Kennedy had the fourth best qualifying time, a 41.8)."

Monte Vista's Mark Wilson, pending national high jump record holder at 7-1 3/4, had to settle for second place with a 6-10 jump. Wilson's Charles Hatch won the event with a 7-0 and then missed three tries at 7-2.

Harry Ellis Dedy Cooper, one of the favorites in the 120 highs and the 440, had to settle for seconds in both events. He lost the 120 highs to Muir's Fred Shaw, who also forced Las Lomas' Rich Graybehl into second in the lows.

Cooper clocked a 13.8 to

Shaw's 13.7. "I hit the last hurdle," explained Cooper. "I thought I had him until that point." Cooper's 440 time was 48.2, while Graybehl was 18.9 in the lows.

Oakland was well represented in the first girls' State Meet when Fremont's Yvonne Boone won the first-ever event — the 80 hurdles. "I'm shocked," exclaimed Miss Boone. "I didn't think I had a chance."

Berkeley's 440 relay team of Sharon White, Annette Robinson, Marie Nickson and Terry Knight set a national prep mark with a 47.5. The past record of 47.8 was set in 1966 by Lebanon, Ore.

Pleasant Hill junior Kathy Costello broke her own pending national record of 2:13.3 as she ran away from the field in the 880 with a time of 2:10.4.

Berkeley's team title came down to the final event, with Marie Nickson running the 440 anchor on the winning 880 medley relay team. Robinson, White and Shirley Parker joined Nickson as the Jackets again set a national mark. Their time was 1:46.4.

Kimball steals show in state track

BAKERSFIELD — Rich Kimball is so good he almost seems inhuman.

Pam Blackburn doesn't realize just how very good she is already.

Sharon Nichols isn't sure she wants to find out how good she can be.

Mitch Kingery is mighty good, but not good enough to be happy.

The state high school track and field finals here Saturday were indeed a good show,

though not for most Central Coast Section boys.

They were astounding, fantastic, incredible, unbelievable show — choose any and all adjectives you want — for Kimball, the DeLaSalle (Concord) tow-head whose historic distance double triumph, first in state meet history, ranks among the great feats in all prep sports annals.

It was one for Ripley's Believe It or Not as Kimball gutted out a state record 8:46.5 two-mile (fourth best prep clocking anywhere) and sur-

vived a furious neck-and-neck 200-yard kick by Sunny Hills' Andy Clifford for a 4:06.6 mile triumph. This, with 80 minutes, and with painful shin-splints, yet!

Kimball had limped badly in Friday's mile trials because his bad leg had been taped wrong. If ever an athlete stole the heart and captured the imagination of a crowd it was Kimball as 11,000 people screamed their heads off in support on his amazing kick which nipped Clifford by a tenth-second.

One doubting Thomas in the stands, who simply refused to believe Kimball could win the mile too, lost more than \$50 in small bets. The crowd had faith in Kimball; the ovation he received during his victory lap was both heart-warming and thunderous, similar to the one Los Altos' Rick Brown got in 1970 when he won both the 440 and 880.

Kimball's mind-blowing performance overshadowed everyone and everything else, including seven national prep division of girls' and women's

sports records broken in the first California femme finals.

One of those was by Cubberley High's Blackburn, a 15-year-old sophomore surprise whose 5-8 high jump snapped the national standard of 5-7.

The only other Peninsula consolation was Nichols' third place 58.4 girls' 440 for Menlo-Atherton, John Bell's fourth-place 14-6 pole vault for Lynbrook (the Santa Clara Valley Athletic League's lone medal) and Kingery's 9:05.0 eighth place two-mile (the South Peninsula Athletic League's top

effort).

Blackburn was "overjoyed" at winning, but "disappointed" because I didn't clear 5-10. I'd already done 5-8 this season.

"It's still kind of a shock," said the attractive, leggy 5-0 blonde. "I was kind of uptight about Cindy (second placer Cynthia Gilbert of San Diego's San Luis Rey, youngest member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic team). But my coach (Jay Vierra) had told me I had a chance.

"I won't know till next year if I'm really serious about

track, but people have said things to me. I think I'd like to go on, to try for the 1976 Olympics (in Montreal). I think I'd be willing to train for it."

This young lady, though modest and unassuming, has stamped herself a potential world class performer, whether she knows it or not.

Just one thing bothered Pam.

"This new state girls meet is great. But I hope they'll qualify for girls (only section champs went) and give more awards (three went to girls

and the usual five to boys) next year."

Nichols, on the other hand, is no track fanatic. The personable blonde junior runs "for exercise."

"Before the meet, I'd decided not to come out for track next year," said Sharon, who admits she runs "only a few laps" in workouts.

"Now, I'm not so sure. I'll wait and see. I'm flattered I got this far — I never dreamed I would. But track's (Please turn to Pg. 14, Col. 5)

Kimball Shatters

Prep 2-Mile Mark

Rich Kimball of Concord's De La Salle high school set a State prep record of 8:46.5 with a two-mile victory Saturday night in the California Track and Field championships in Bakersfield, after winning the mile in 4:06.6.

Muir High of Pasadena won the team title with 23 points, with defending champion Wilson of San Francisco second with 13, De La Salle third with 12, and John F. Kennedy (Richmond) tied for fourth with 10.

Wilson's Charles Hatch won the high jump at 7-0; the Warriors' 440 relay team, which had won the state title two years in a row, finished third behind Kennedy and Gardena.

Muir's Fred Shaw won the high hurdles in 13.7, followed by Dedy Cooper of Ells (Richmond) in 13.8 and Wilson's Mike Kirtman, 14.0. Kirtman also contributed to Wilson's overall second place by taking fourth at 19.3 in the low hurdles, won by Shaw in 18.9.

Hatch's victory was especially impressive, since he had to outleap Mark Wilson from Monte Vista of Danville. Wilson, who set the national interscholastic record of 7-1 $\frac{3}{4}$ in the West Coast Relays, was second to Hatch at Bakersfield at 6-10.

Kimball, who had complained of leg problems earlier in the week, ran three tough races in two days. He was required to run a mile heat Friday night, and Saturday he received a good battle in the mile before edging Andy Clifford of Sunny Hills, Fullerton.

Not long thereafter, he overtook Laguna Beach's Eric Hulst on the gun lap for the

victory which erased Curtis Beck's two-mile record of 8:52.3.

Wilson had been co-favored in the meet along with Muir of Pasadena. Hatch's victory helped the cause, but the third place in the 440 relay and Michael Farmer's failure to place in the 100 hurt the Warriors. Farmer didn't qualify in the 220.

The Wilson relay team had the fastest time of 41.2 in Friday's qualifying but clocked 41.6 in the finals, behind the 41.4 by Kennedy and 41.5 by Gardena.

Berkeley won the title in the first girls' state championships, scoring 13 points to 12 for La Jolla and Washington of Los Angeles. Jodi Anderson of LA Washington set a national girls record of 19-7 in the long jump.
