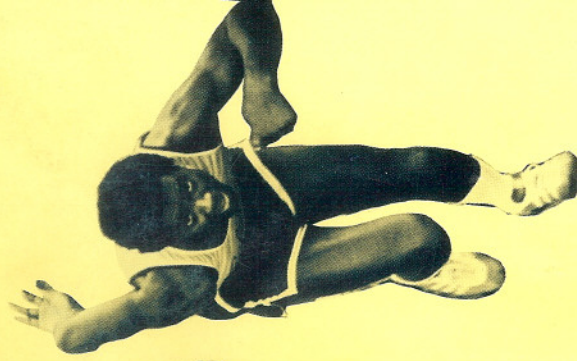
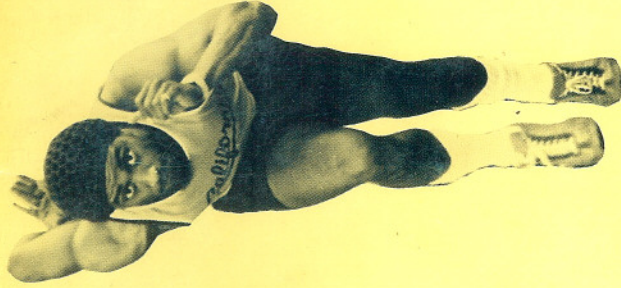

 Placed third in 1974 Pac-8 220 and sixth in the 100 . . . former LA City champ (1972) in both events is also the top deep threat on the Cal football squad . . . prepped at Carson HS, where he earned top honors in both football and track, and also played basketball . . . could also run the quarter . . . economics major . . . born 5-26-55 in San Bernardino.

McKINLEY MOSLEY 13.8
 Set the school record in the 120 HH with a win against USC . . . went undefeated in dual meets last season, then was runnerup to Kip Ngeno at the Pac-8 meet . . . versatile, all-around athlete has run 9.7, 52.8 in only attempt at 440IH, and 47.6 relay 440. 1973 state JC champion and '72 runnerup . . . prepped at Bakersfield HS, earning two seconds (LH) and two thirds (HH) in state HS meet . . . ran against USSR in 1972 junior meet . . . sociology major . . . born 4-8-53 in Fresno.



HOWARD STRICKLAND 9.6, 21.1
 Placed fourth in both the 100 and 220 at the 1974 Pac-8 meet . . . wound up his football career at Cal 8th all-time with 1365 yards in just two seasons, a 5.17 average . . . returned to track last spring for the first time since HS . . . as a prep won the state 100 and 220 at East Moline HS in Illinois . . . business major . . . wife Joyce and he has a son Jeremy . . . born 12-20-52 in Chicago.

SAMMY BURNS 9.5, 21.0
 Returns for his fourth season anchoring the sprint relay . . . ran lifetime best 220 time last year defeating Mike Shavers in SC meet . . . also began running the 440 in 1974 (47.3r, 48.4) . . . ran 9.5 at El Cerrito HS, anchoring 1971 state HS champions in record time . . . lettered in football in 1972 . . . political science major . . . born 1-28-53 in Oakland.

HEAD COACH ERV HUNT

Head coach Erv Hunt enters his third year at Cal with a 12-6 dual meet record. The youngest full-time head coach in Cal history at the time of his appointment, Hunt was Dave Maggard's assistant in 1972 before taking over for the 1973 season.

A "Little" All-American football player and all-around track star at Fresno State, Hunt coached at the junior and senior high school levels in Fresno and at Clovis HS before joining the Cal staff in 1972. A back injury had halted a football career after a year with the Green Bay Packers.

Born July 1, 1947, in Fresno, Hunt attended Edison HS and Fresno City College. He was the nation's leading JC hurdler, and ran in the state HS meet. At Fresno State, his honors included the Fellowship of Christian Athletes' "Scholar-Athlete of the Year" award.

He and his wife Jacquelyne have a son, Jamie.

ASSISTANT COACH BILL FROST

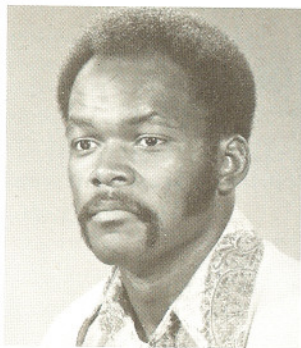
Bill Frost is California's assistant track and field coach and head cross country coach.

30 years old, Frost came to California in 1972 from Cupertino HS, where he had coached the 1971 Central Coast Section champions. His cross country squads have won the Pacific-8 Southern Division title the past two seasons.

In 1968 and 1969 he was an assistant coach for Dave Maggard at Los Altos HS.

A Los Altos HS graduate himself, Frost received his BS degree in physical education from UCLA, and MA in education from Stanford.

He was born on October 12, 1944, in Los Angeles.

ASSISTANT COACHES

AL RAGAN — This will be Alva Ragan's 48th year coaching California track and field men. Every Bear head coach, Walter Christie, Brutus Hamilton, Sam Bell, Dave Maggard and now Erv Hunt, has been aided immeasurably by this man. At the age of 72, there is little or no difference between the man now helping part time and the man who began his career in 1928. A former Bear hurdle great, Ragan assumed Cal's head coaching position for three years during World War II and his 1943 Bear squad defeated Southern Cal and were the NCAA and PCC runners-up.

EDDIE HART — This will be world record holder Eddie Hart's third season as a Cal assistant coach. A former state JC 100 and 220 champion for Contra Costa College, the Pittsburg High School graduate was the 1970 NCAA 100 king, and a double collegiate All-American in 1971. Hart, now 25, equalled the world record for 100 meters (9.9) in the 1972 American Olympic Trials, and in Munich, he anchored the U.S. 400 meter relay team to a gold medal-winning and world record-equalling (38.2) clocking. He will work with Cal sprinters and the 440 relay team.

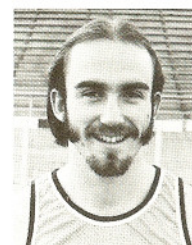

On the mile relay, newcomers James Robinson and Grasha join Dave Alexander, Cirilo Morgan, Burns, Walker, Mosley, and Alexander on the list of leading candidates.

The Bears would also appear to have the ingredients for other less frequently run relays, with possibly a fine 2-mile team.

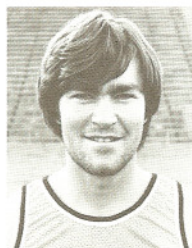

EDWARDS STADIUM

Finished in 1932, and at the time the only purely "Track" Stadium in the World, Edwards Stadium has been the site of seven National Collegiate Championship Meets, one National AAU Championship Meet, All-American Invitational in 1966, and the 1932 IC4A Meet, the only time this meet had been held away from the East.

This Stadium is named after Col. George C. Edwards, as is the field adjoining it to the East.

In 1957 the oval itself was dedicated in the name of Walter Christie, California's first track coach, 1900-32, and in the early sixties "the friends of California track," raised funds to build the Walter Christie bench which stands just outside the running track on the West side of the infield.

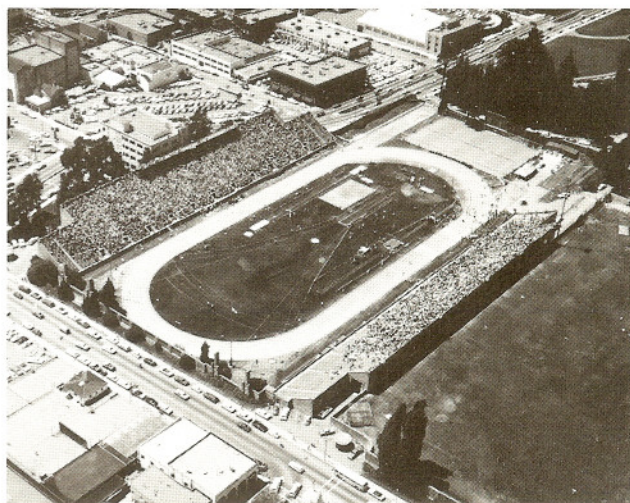
With funds that remained after the bench was built the electric clock that stands atop the coreboard to the North was purchased.

The track in the 22,000 seat Stadium was completely redone in 1965 and is a composite of Fresno clay and cinders and is reddish in color.

Ten world records, 16 American records and at least 18 collegiate records have been set in this Stadium.

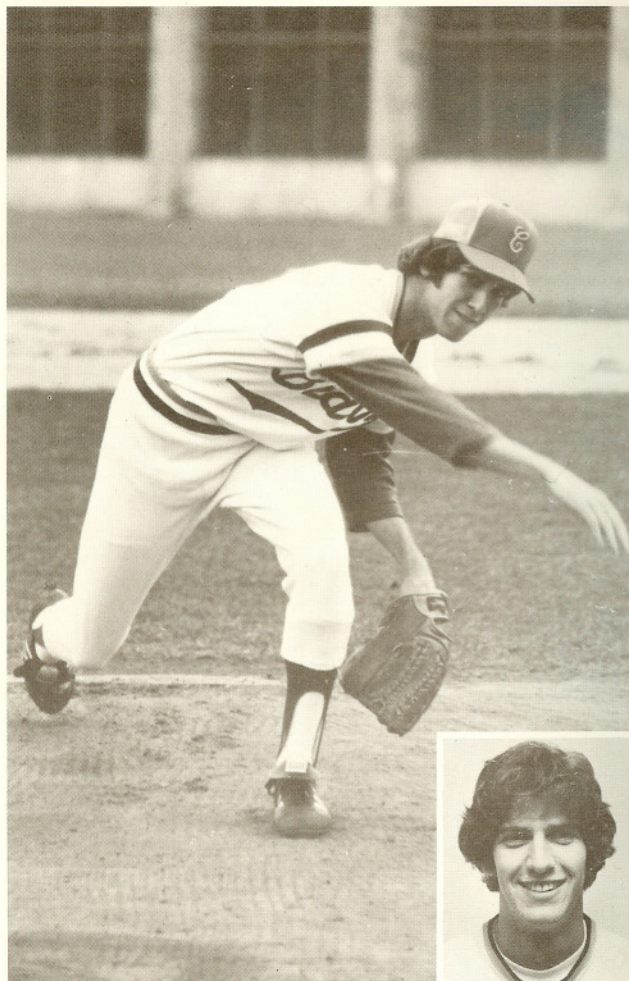

HEAD COACH JACKIE JENSEN

California welcomed back one of the all-time Bear greats in the summer of 1973 when Jackie Jensen was named the eighth baseball coach in Cal history, succeeding George Wolfman. He returned to the East Bay from the University of Nevada, where he had served as baseball coach and then an administrator.

Jensen was a two-sport star for the Bears in 1947 through 1949, earning 1948 All-American honors in football and 1947 and 1949 national honors in baseball. He established the current season rushing record for football with 1080 yards in 1948, and probably would lead in career statistics instead of being second with 1703 yards, had he played his senior year.

He passed that up for opportunities in professional baseball. As a freshman, he saw occasional outfield duty and pitched in key relief roles, posting an 0.95 ERA in the league season as Cal won the CIBA and went on to win the first-ever NCAA tourney held. He did not play his sophomore year, but came back in 1949, this time as an outfielder and part-time pitcher, batting .326 with a then record 8 HR's and signed with the Oakland Oaks after the college season was over.

Jensen then went on to become one of the American League's top outfielders. Breaking in with the New York Yankees, he played two years there and two years with the Washington Senators before being traded to the Boston Red Sox in 1954. In seven seasons with the Sox, he drove in over 100 runs five years and 97 another, hitting over 20 homers six times. Jensen was the American League MVP in 1958, batting .281 with 31 doubles, 35 homers, and a league-leading 122 RBI. He posted his highest average in 1956, with a .315 mark, and again lead the AL in RBI with 112 in 1959. In 1954 he led the league in stolen bases with 22, and throughout his career had the reputation of having one of the finest throwing arms in baseball.

Batting and the outfield will naturally be two of Jensen's priorities in splitting duties with assistant Bob Milano, as well as the overall team offense.

ASSISTANT COACH BOB MILANO

Former Bear catcher Bob Milano returned to Berkeley in the summer of 1973, taking a post as assistant athletic director and assistant baseball coach. Particularly during the spring, the dual roles leave little time to breathe, but Milano manages to squeeze in academic supervision, eligibility, awards, and scheduling problems along with baseball practice.

A firm believer in fundamentals, Milano was a highly successful prep coach at Burlingame HS from 1966-73, finishing under .500 only once and winning the MPL three times. He was voted MPL Coach of the Year four times—in 1967 (9-13), 1968 (18-9), 1972 (21-6), and 1973 (20-5).

At Cal, he made all-CIBA in 1960, as the Bears tied for the league title, and co-captained the 1961 team. He came to Cal from Bishop O'Dowd in the East Bay.

Now 35, he and his wife Carol have four children, Bobby, Paula, Laura, and Audrey.

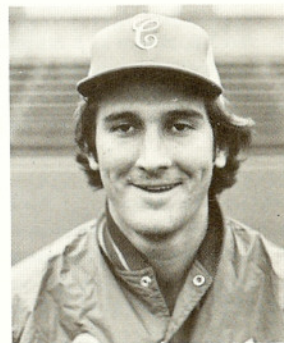
JUNIOR VARSITY COACH GREG WARZECKA

EVANS DIAMOND

Evans Diamond, the home of the Bears, is a part of Edwards Field, dedicated in memory of Col. George C. Edwards in 1933. The diamond itself is officially named after Clint Evans, head coach of the Bears for 25 years from 1930 to 1954. Seating capacity is 3000.

The park's playing field dimensions are 338 down the left field line, 322 down the right field line, and 385 to dead center. Rightfield is enclosed by the high track stadium wall, over which few balls have ever been hit, while the left-field temporary fence curves out to about 365 in straightaway left.
