AFTER THOUGHTS:

1. The Long Jump, Triple Jump, Shot Put, Discus, and Javelin should be measured until there are eight (8) competitors measured. Then use that eighth mark as a standard for minimum measured marks. This would guarantee eight competitors in the finals. (Bob Fries' suggestion.)
2. The method of running the Pole Vault worked out great, except that some of the vaulters were not psychologically ready to vault so early. Vaulters should be aware that this method is going to be used. I suggest that it be used any time the field is over 15 vaulters. (Bob Rush's suggestion.)
3. The Shuttle Hurdle crew should be trained. (George Larson's suggestion.)
4. The coaches should read all the advanced material so that the weight men would know when the weights and measure station closes.
5. If the large college division remains separate, we should do away with team scoring and use the trophy money for individual events like:

100 Yard Dash

440 IH

6 Mile

Steeplechase

Etc.

(Bob Rush's suggestion.)

Pushkin wins in relay meet

Jay Pushkin of Foothill College won the discus throw with a mark of 161 feet 7 inches during Saturday's Northern California Junior College Track and Field Relays held at College of San Mateo.

The younger Gordien won the junior college discus throw with a toss of 184-7½. His father, who competed in the Olympic Games in 1948, 1952 and 1956, won the masters competition with 160-9.

Fortune is the head track coach at San Bernardino Valley College, a two-year school his son attends.

Spartans win with 28-7 javelin throw

SAN JOSE — Somehow it seems only fitting that the latest installment of that increasingly crazy rivalry between San Jose State and the University of Washington should be decided by a 28 foot 7 inch javelin throw.

And it was, sort of, as the Spartans' Bob Mitre came out to compete with an injured shoulder and scored a point with little more than his appearance at Bud Winter Field, leading to a 73-72 San Jose State victory.

Now, it is unfair to both sides to dwell on that aspect of the meet since there were so many excellent performances on both sides but the fact remains: without Mitre it is a tie.

Over the last three years such twists of plot have become commonplace as the Spartans have won all three but by a combined margin of seven points. When San Jose won at Seattle last year by five it was considered a positive rout.

It was decided once and

for all with Marc Genet's heroic 8:57.8 victory in the two mile, Genet coming from third place on the last lap to run under 30 seconds for the last 220 and beat Scott Holmes of Washington by a full second.

With Genet first and teammate Dan Gruber finishing third, the Spartans had the 73 points they needed to win without taking it to the mile relay, a prospect San Jose State had been dreading all day.

"This race and the one last year against Washington were the most satisfying of my life," Genet said. "Holmes ran an 8:51 steeplechase and a 13:36 three mile last week so I knew how good he is. I knew it would take my very best to win."

And if Genet closed it out, it was the come through performance of Dan Carter in the triple jump that set it up. There was never much doubt that Ron Livers would win the event — he's unbeaten this year — but Carter figured no better than third and was no sure bet there.

His 50-1 effort on his final attempt shot him past both John Triplett and Wayne Hinkley of UW and into second behind Livers' 53-5. It was wind-legal and was Carter's life best by nearly three feet.

"Until I got here I had no style, no feel for the event," Carter said. "Even now I'm not real consistent. A week ago I jumped only 45 feet. But I knew how important it was for me to do well here and I was really up for it. I'm used to pressure and I operate better under pressure."

Livers, who also got his best jump on his final turn,
