—Mike Tully of UCLA set a school record of 17-10 in the pole vault and came within a whisker of clearing 18-2 when the bar finally toppled after he had landed in the pit.

-Rory Kotinek of UCLA won the high jump at 7-31/4, breaking the school record of 7-3 he shared with the javelin with a seasonal best of 226-10. Dwight Stones. Kotinek earlier won

—James Gilkes of USC won the sprints in 9.3 and 20.4, his 220 mark moving him to No. 1 in the nation this year.

Tom Andrews of USC won the 440 hurdles in 50.2, equaling the meet record and handing UCLA's Lynnsey Guerrero his first defeat in four years of dual meet competition.
Guerrero fell over the last hurdle but Andrews already was long gone.

-USC ran a nation-leading 39.1 in

Track Notes

There was no wind aiding Banks in the triple jump. In fact, the wind was 2 m.p.h. against him. His previous best was 53-2. His previous best in the long jump was 24-5½, although his Saturday mark goes in the wind-aided category. Randy Williams, third at 25-3½, said, 'I just couldn't get my step. I hit the board only once and then I only got a couple of spikes on it. I guess it just wasn't meant for me to win this meet. I have no excuses. I know I can jump farther than the winning mark tojump farther than the winning mark to-day, but I didn't do it." In Randy's four losses to the Bruins, there have been four different Bruin winners—Finn Bendlxen, James McAlister, Jerry Herndon and Banks. "One thing," smiled William sardonically, "Tve set a record that will never be equaled."

In the 440, Randle grabbed a one-yard lead over Brown coming off the turn, then refused to give it away in a stirring bettle down the stretch. Brown was clocked in 45.2 but he was close enough to Randle that many thought he should have had the same time. "No excuses," said Brown. "He just ran a great race. I don't feel I lost it. He just won it. "Ill tell you this, though—it won't happen again." Brown later collapsed in the mile relay, falling to his knees 30 yards from the finish after the Trojans already had wrapped up the race. "I don't know what it is," he said later while clutching his stomach. "It just all of a sudden hit me," Bish said: "Benny was just physically and emotionally spent." Previously, besides running the 440, Brown had helped the Bruins run a season-best 39.5 for second in the 440 relay and had come out of the pack to get second in the 220 with a career-equaling 20.6.




