COACHING STAFF



DICK HILL
Aztec Head Coach

In his fourth year as head track coach for San Diego State University, Dick Hill has brought to the Aztecs his background of professional success, including coaching athletes to 30 world records and three individual Olympic gold medals.

Hill came to San Diego State in 1973 from Southern University, where he had coached from 1965 to 1969 and in 1971 and 1972. A 1960 alumnus of the school, with a B.S. in physical education, his teams there won five NAIA national titles in three years, and Hill was named National Track Coach of the Year.

Southern won NAIA championships outdoors in 1966, 1967, and 1968, as well as the 1966 and 1967 indoor titles. After a year's leave of absence in 1970 to complete his Ed.D. (doctoral) degree at the State University of New York (Buffalo), Hill returned to Southern, and in 1972, a five-man team placed fifth at the NAIA Nationals.

Hill began his collegiate coaching career at Florida A&M University, where he was head track coach and head basketball coach from 1962 to 1964.


A fine athlete himself, Hill played basketball and competed in track while a student at Southern. After graduation, he entered the University of Buffalo, where he completed his Ed.M. (master's) degree in 1961. While at Buffalo, Hill won the New York state AAU decathlon title with 7250 points in 1962, after finishing second in 1961. He also played on the Western New York AAU champion basketball team both years, and was a member of the New York State National AAU team each season.

Hill's coaching success has been remarkable, to say the least. In addition to the five national titles at Southern, his teams have

won seven conference championships (five at Southern, two at Florida A&M). Since coming to San Diego, Hill has been building the team slowly, with a sixth place in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association in 1973 and a fourth last year.

Perhaps even more phenomenal has been his success with individual athletes. At Florida A&M, Hill coached Bob Hayes to world records at 100-yards and 100-meters, as well as to the 1964 Olympic gold medal. At Southern University, Hill coached high hurdlers Willie Davenport, the 1968 Olympic champion, and Rod Milburn, who won the 1972 Olympic gold medal. Both athletes tied and broke numerous indoor and outdoor world records in the hurdles. Also at Southern, members of Hill's teams broke the world records in the 440-yard, 880-yard, and mile relays for two years at San Diego State, Hill coached Steve Williams, who tied both the 100-yard and 100-meter world records.

BOB WHEELER Assistant Track Coach



Bob Wheeler, one of the finest milers in United States collegiate history, begins his first year as assistant track and field coach at San Diego State.

Wheeler will be working primarily with the distance runners this season, many of whom were on his Aztec cross country team.

This is Wheeler's first coaching assignment after receiving a bachelor's degree in management science and economics at Duke University in 1974.

Bob has had some outstanding personal performances as a distance man with 1972 being a banner year. In that season Wheeler ran 11 consecutive miles or 1500 meter races in times equivalent to a sub-four minute mile and was selected as a member of the United States Olympic team in the 1500 meters.

Wheeler, 23, was a two-time outdoor track and field All-America at Duke as well as All-America indoors in 1971. Bob won the NCAA indoor title in the 1000 in 1971. He was runner-up in the NCAA outdoor mile that season.

Wheeler twice won the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletics in America (IC4A) cross country championship and won Atlantic Coast Conference titles in cross country, indoor and outdoor track nine times.

In high school, Wheeler was All-America in the 880 and mile and is the present record holder in the high school indoor 600-yard run.

He also holds the record for the NCAA indoor 1000-yard run and was a member of the AAU national team in 1971 and 1972.

Bob is single and lives now in San Diego.

GREG BAER — Weights — 6-1 — 210 — 20 — Junior



in San Bernardino but calls La Mesa home now . . . single . . . physical education major.

Transfer from Grossmont College in La Mesa . . . won All-Mission Conference honors last year in the shot put and discus . . . also threw the javelin part-time . . . lifetime bests are 54-10 $\frac{3}{4}$ (16-lbs. shot put), 160-7 (discus) and 187-8 (javelin) . . . prepped at Grossmont High where he won 1973 field event man of the year honors . . . born May 26, 1955

JEAN BEAUDRY — Weights — 6-1 — 225 — 21 — Sophomore

An outstanding redshirt prospect in the shot put and discus . . . has career bests of 55-7 $\frac{1}{2}$ (shot put) and 154-1 (discus) . . . prepped at Crespi High School where he made the first-team All-CIF Southern Section in 1973 . . . also participated in the state meet that year . . . was on honor roll for four years and played football . . . born January 3, 1955 in Santa Monica but calls Woodland Hills home now . . . single . . . journalism major.



TOM BUSH — Triple Jump — 6-0 — 160 — 19 — Sophomore



but calls San Diego home now . . . single . . . accounting major.

Returning letterman who took third in the PCAA Championships last season with a career best of 48-10 $\frac{1}{4}$. . . had a foul jump in that meet of over 50' . . . prepped at Kearny High School where he won All-Western League honors . . . also lettered in soccer . . . on commended list of National Merit Scholarship . . . born November 9, 1956 in Chicago, Ill.

JAMES GEDDES — High Jump — 6-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ — 165 — 20 — Junior



High School . . . set school record at 6-7 $\frac{1}{4}$. . . first team Western League and second best in the county . . . placed second in state meet . . . born September 24, 1955 in Santa Ana but calls La Jolla home now . . . single . . . recreation major.

A super leaper who could be the best high jumper in the school's history . . . transfer from Mesa College . . . broke Arnie Robinson's record with a 6-8 $\frac{1}{4}$ jump at Mesa . . . won the 1975 San Diego Relays . . . second in 1974 Southern Cal finals and fifth in the state . . . best jump of 6-9 $\frac{1}{4}$ recorded at Stockholm, Sweden in 1973 . . . prepped at La Jolla

ALLEN HAZARD — Distances — 6-0 — 150 — 22 — Senior

Returning letterman who placed fifth in last year's PCAA mile championships . . . posted a lifetime best of 4:07.7 last year as an Aztec . . . transferred from Southwestern College in Chula Vista where he was team captain . . . ran lifetime best of 14:20 in the 3-mile for a cross country win last year . . . prepped at Sweetwater High in National City . . . born June 9, 1953 in San Diego but calls National City home now . . . single . . . on Dean's list as a physical education/history major.



DAVE HOOVER — Hurdles — 6-2 — 160 — 21 — Senior



Returning letterman who posted a career best of 53.3 in the 440 intermediate hurdles last year, good enough for 8th place on the all-time Aztec list . . . also ranked 9th in the PCAA . . . transferred from Southwestern College where he won the Mission Conference 440 IH title . . . prepped at Mar Vista High School Imperial Beach where he placed second in the league in all three hurdle events . . . born May 23, 1954 in Mesa, Ariz. but lives now in San Diego . . . married (Susie) . . . physical education major.

Returning letterman who posted a career best of 53.3 in the 440 intermediate hurdles last year, good enough for 8th place on the all-time Aztec list . . . also ranked 9th in the PCAA . . . transferred from Southwestern College where he won the Mission Conference 440 IH title . . . prepped at Mar Vista High School Imperial Beach where he placed second in the league in all three hurdle events . . . born May 23, 1954 in Mesa, Ariz. but lives now in San Diego . . . married (Susie) . . . physical education major.

ODIE HUFFMAN — Middle Distances — 5-11 — 154 — 20 — Sophomore

Half-mile is his specialty . . . ran the third fastest 880 in Aztec history last year—twice in 1:50.6—to place third in the PCAA championships . . . also ran the anchor leg on the 2-mile relay team that eclipsed the school record in 7:33.6 . . . placed third in 1974's International Prep meet . . . ran on fastest high school sprint medley team in U.S. two years ago . . . one of two Aztecs from Monmouth Regional High School in New Shrewsbury, New Jersey . . . won seven letters there (including cross country and indoor track) in three years . . . born November 19, 1955 in Ft. TOM LUX — Distances — 5-9 — 135 — 23 — Senior




A super miler and cross country runner . . . returning letterman who qualified for last year's NCAA cross country championships . . . posted a career best in the mile in 4:06.1 . . . also has bests of 1:57 (880), 8:54.8 (2-mile), 13:38.6 (3-mile) and 14:11 (5,000 meters) . . . competed at Grossmont College in El Cajon where he won All-Mission Conference honors twice and set the loop record with his career best . . . prepped at Monte Vista High School . . . born February 11, 1953 in San Diego but calls El Cajon home now . . . married (Susan) . . . physical education major.

DON MILLER — Sprints — 6-0 — 170 — 23 — Junior

A tremendous transfer prospect, especially in the quarter-mile . . . career best of 47.0 in the 440 . . . comes to the Aztecs from Los Angeles City College . . . other career bests are 9.4 (100) and 21.2 (220) . . . prepped at Banning and Dorsey High Schools in Los Angeles . . . born June 21, 1952 in New York City but calls Los Angeles home now . . . single . . . An outstanding junior college transfer prospect from Mesa (Ariz.) College . . . threw his lifetime best of 235-5 when he won the Arizona Junior College Athletic Conference title . . . finished second in the national junior college meet at Pasadena, Texas with a toss of 214 . . . took second at last year's Bakersfield Relays . . . prepped at Mesa High School where he took second place in the conference . . . also competed in the long and triple jumps and played baseball . . . born July 16, 1955 in Phoenix but calls Mesa home now . . . single . . . zoology major.

CRAIG ROBINSON — Pole Vault — 6-0 — 170 — 21 — Junior

A top transfer prospect from Trade Technical College in Los Angeles . . . has vaulted over 16 feet . . . finished 2nd in the state JC meet last year . . . prepped at Washington High School in L.A. and won three letters . . . born December 4, 1975 in Los Angeles and still calls it home . . . single.



EARL ROBINSON — Middle Distances — 6-1 — 165 — 21 — Senior



An outstanding 880/mile runner . . . turned in lifetime bests as an Aztec last year of 4:04.4 (mile), 1:50.7 (800 meters), 3:47.2 (1500 meters) . . . other career marks are 49.7 (440), 1:51.8 (880) . . . ran on school record 2-mile relay team . . . transferred from West Los Angeles College a year ago where he finished 6th in the state JC meet . . . prepped at Westchester High in L.A. . . . born April 21, 1954 in Los Angeles and still calls it home . . . single . . . recreation major.

MARK STEVENS — Weights — 6-3 — 225 — 22 — Senior

Returning letterman who placed third last year in the PCAA Championships in the shot put . . . has a career best of 55-6 he recorded while at Southern Cal . . . lettered two years as a Trojan . . . also throws the discus and hammer . . . bests are 159-0 (discus) and 125-3 (hammer) . . . prepped at Harbor High School in Newport Beach . . . was 1971 prep state champ with a record 67-2 $\frac{1}{4}$ put . . . third in National Prep Meet in 1971 . . . born May 7, 1953 in San Gabriel but calls Newport Beach home now . . . single . . . business major.



YALE STROM — Distances — 5-9 — 125 — 18 — Freshman



One of the few frosh on the 1976 squad . . . will run the mile and 3-mile . . . prepped at Crawford High School in San Diego where he ran the mile in 4:30 and the 2-mile in 9:38 . . . also runs the half and full marathon . . . born June 6, 1957 in Detroit, Michigan but calls San Diego home now . . . single.

QUENTIN WHEELER — Hurdles — 6-1 — 165 — 20 — Sophomore

Had an excellent frosh season in '75 for the Aztecs . . . qualified for the NCAA's with a 50.8 in the 440 IH . . . his 50.8 was best in the nation by a freshman last year . . . won the PCAA title in the 440 IH and finished second in the 120 high hurdles . . . ran on the conference champion mile relay team . . . has career bests of 14.5 (120 HH), 47.9 (440) and 22.5 (220) . . . prepped at Monmouth Regional in New Shrewsbury, N.J. with Odie Huffman . . . also played soccer . . . born April 27, 1955 in Long Branch, N.J. but calls New Shrewsbury home now . . . single . . . history major.



HAROLD WILLIAMS — Sprinter — 6-0 — 170 — 22 — Senior



Returns for his final season as an Aztec . . . has qualified for the NCAA's twice . . . career bests are 9.3 (100), 20.6 (220) and 46.3 (440) . . . also has a 46.6 relay leg . . . has share of Aztec records in 440, 880 and mile relays . . . as frosh at Texas (El Paso) won WAC 100 and 220 . . . won the PCAA 220 as a sophomore . . . placed sixth in '72 Olympic trials at 200 meters . . . prepped at Newton High in Elmhurst, N.Y. . . . born August 23, 1953 in Brooklyn, but calls Queens home now . . . married (Deborah) . . .
