Bishop surprises self

Carlmont runner wins state half mile

Pam Blackburn of Cubberley was so relaxed she couldn't get up for the finals in the state high school track and field champion-

Wyatt Bishop of Carlmont simply couldn't believe he was up.

Blackburn placed third in the girls' high jump while Bishop won the boys' 880 in the 58th annual California Interscholastic Federation meet Saturday at Berkeley's Edwards Stadium.

"I was standing up on that thing (the victory stand) and I still didn't think it was me," said Bishop after his 1:544 half mile, slowest winning time in a CIF meet in 18 years.

Bishop, though he narrowly edged four runners in a blanket finish, threw up his hands at the tape as if positive he had won.

Actually, the gesture was born more from reflex than out of con-

"My coach (Loren Lansberry) always told me even if it's very close to raise your hands symbolically at the finish."

Bishop's victory is the first by a boy from the South Peninsula Athletic League since Ron Larrieu of Brew was ninth and last in the long Palo Alto won the mile in 1956.

Blackburn, gunning for her second high jump crown in three years, said "I was totally relaxed and maybe that's what was wrong.

"Yesterday (Friday) I was more intense because I had to make the top nine. And today ... it just wasn't the same."

The 17-year-old Blackburn, participating in her third state meet as was Bishop, cleared 5-8 on her second attempt but then missed three competition.

Sophomore Kari Grosswiller of Upland, Southern Section, won the event at 5-10, breaking Blackburn's meet record 5-0 in the

"I had a few things that weren't right on," said Pam. "I could have had 5-10 today if I pulled everything together. But it just didn't feel right."

In addition to Bishop and Blackburn, the Midpeninsula had one other top five finisher in Lynbrook's Kris Costello who placed second in the girls' 80 low hurdles in 10.8.

Costello also ran in the 220 final and finished seventh in 26.2 after a check of Friday's films showed her third in her trial heat, not a nonqualifying sixth as originally announced.

The only other boy competing in the finals was Carlmont's Bob Love who placed 15th in 9:26.7 in the two-mile. Los Altos' Perrin

This year's carnival of events was hardly a record-breaker. Not a single new mark was established despite the presence of a few standout performances.

Basically it was a show of strength by Mt. Pleasant and the rest of the San Jose schools.

The Cardinals hardly surprised anyone in the good-sized crowd that sat huddled on the chilly and windy night. With the speedy Cannon blasting to impressive 9.8 and

1:52.9 - just five tenths off the state Best. Carlmont's Wyatt Bishop earned his third straight trip to the big meet with a runnerup 1:53.4, his career best.

Joining Bishop and Bennett in Berkeley next week will be Tony Vecchiet of Los Altos, Bob Love and Vince Bradley of Carlmont, Paul Bates and Richard Clark of Menlo-Atherton, Ray Franklin of Los Altos and Mark Duggan of Monta Vista.

Outstanding performances were many and the best were turned in by Carlmont High's Wyatt Bishop, Menlo-Atherton juniors Paul Bates and Richard Clark and Woodside's Dan Farwell - not to mention the greatest SPAL frosh-soph finals in

Ill feelings were spared and no one athlete was named, but that was anything but a reflection of what went on in the field and on CSM's swift, sun-bathed Tartan

Carlmont took seven firsts and rode it's celebrated depth to an expected team title in the varsity division, scoring 88 points to runnerup M-A's 69. Woodside was third with 421/2 and Palo Alto fourth with 28.

In the frosh-soph, where the varsity was upstaged in both relays and in the 330 low hurdles, Carlmont and Sequoia finished in a tie for the crown with 66 points apiece.

Bishop, who ran the 880 in a varsity meet only once before this season, took a tenth off his season best for a 1:57.4 runaway win over Menlo's Keith Young (1:59.0), the second SPALer to crack 2:00.0 this season.

Given only about 15 minutes to catch his breath, Bishop, two-time state meet vet in the 440, came back to capture a second straight SPAL quarter crown in 49.3, holding off Bates, who had the same

Bishop also had a 50.6 anchor on Carlmont's winning 3:30.4 mile relay, which like some Scot athletes performed more for points than marks. Counting his 49.3, Bates went on to record another great triple.

Bates captured the long jump with a leap of 23-3 which will rank high in the CCS rankings, and he was also a convincing winner in the triple jump in 46-11.

Clark of M-A re-set his school record in the 330 lows with a 39.2 time and added another victory in the 120 highs with a 14.6 clocking.

Woodside's Farwell ran the mile of his prep career, coming from behind to put on a great kick over the final 100 yards to win in 4:22.8 - 10 seconds lower than his previous best.
