NOTES -- Army's track program continues to roll along in high gear ... head coach John Randolph, in his first year at the Cadet helm, guided the indoor team to an undefeated season; Saturday afternoon at Shea Stadium, despite rain and wind and chilly temperatures, he watched from the sidelines as the outdoor team opened its season with an 88-75 victory over Princeton.

"The weather conditions were anything but ideal," confirmed Randolph ...
"In fact, they were plain miserable. Despite that, and the fact we had only one day of practice this week due to spring leave, it was a very encouraging result. It is even more remarkable considering we did not have Curt Alitz, Dexter Adams or Clay Slack in uniform today," added Randolph... the Cadet trio had been excused from participating in the meet due to schedule conflicts.

Despite their absence, Army managed to score firsts in 10 of the 19 events, as well as tagging on nine seconds ... the Cadets also swept the discus, with junior Dave Wiener claiming the front position with his heave of 143 feet 2 inches ... Wiener also finished second in the hammer throw, losing out to Princeton's Gene Mancino.

In the field events, where Army was able to build a close 37-35 cushion, three other Cadets joined Wiener in the victory circle ... they were Bob Hoisington in the high jump, Mike Willis in the long jump and John DePiazza in the pole vault ... due to the terrible weather conditions, the pole vault, the high jump and the triple jump all were contested indoors in the Field House.

Senior captain Ivory Carson celebrated the experience of the outdoor season by sharing in three firsts ... he won both the 110-meter high hurdles and the 400-meter intermediate hurdles, and ran the second leg on the winning mile relay team ... others with winning efforts included Eric Handy in the 400-meter run, Kevin Stump in the 100-meter dash and Mike Schaefer in the 200-meter dash ... the Cadets also had a shot at a first in the 400-meter relay, but a dropped baton on the final leg proved costly.

Army will return to the Shea Stadium course next Saturday afternoon at 1:30 to host Yale and Columbia in a triangular affair.
