Central Collegiate Conference Championships: Michigans depth proves too much for opposition

Michigan's powerful squad proved that they were solid in almost every event and convincingly defeated a strong Eastern Michigan unit 148 to 117. The Wolverines scored in 17 of 19 events, failing to score in the 35 lb. wt. and the 600, but winning 7 events. Air Force and Penn State locked up in a tight third place battle that was decided in the meets final event, the Long Jump. The Cadets did prove that their "quick" oversized marks were for real led by Senior Mark Webster.

Event by Event Analysis

60: Michigans Doug Hennigar, a junior got out the quickest and held off surges by Bruce Taylor and Russ Bailey, two of EMU'S four finalist to win in an electric timed 6.19

60HH: Air Forces T.G. Parker, Michigans Don Wheeler, and the Wolverines Arnett Chisolm went over the first hurdle together, but by the second hurdle Parker and Chisolm were out in front. Chisolm hit the third hurdle, locked elbows with Parker and fell going over the fourth hurdle. Parker, Air Forces Craig Adams, and Penn States Dennis Rock finished 1,2,3 but T.G. was disqualified on a skeptical infraction.

220: In a two heat final Doug Hennigar and Kentucky States Greg Anderson went through the 220 in 22.6, and 22.7 with the KSU runner outkicking the Wolverine by .07 with a 30.6. In the second heat, an Eastern Michigan duo, Ken Delor, and Russ Bailey, hit the 220 even with Michigans Charles Crouther (22.8) and Bailey outkicked his two challengers in a swift 30.54

440: Another two heat final saw Michigans James Grace have the 220 lead (22.9) with Air Forces Jeff Remington on his back. Around the final turn, Penn States Keith Falco made a move to the inside but got held off by Remington's massive frame. Grace glided in to a 49.08. The second heat had Kentucky States Randy Williams hold off fast closing Bill Lee of the Air Force in 48.54.

600: Air Forces Mark Webster, the lanky cadet made up the stagger on Kentucky States Anthony Akins and Penn States Bill Austin by the first turn, glided through the 440 in 49.0 and soared past the finish line with a quickcord 1:09.54, just off Stan Vinsons meet record of 1:09.1. Unfortunately, this talented Cadet senior is ineligible for NCAA Championship meet having spent his first year at Furman, before switching to the academy. Eastern Michigans Mike Arnold ran away with the second heat (1:11.13) for second place.

880: Eastern Michigans Jerry Wojtala took the lead for 220 yards with Michigans Dave Furst and Penn States Pat Rexroat on his back. Rexroat surged to the lead at the 440 and held on until the backstretch of the final lap where the Michigan sopho more took over and pulled away.

Central Collegiates Analysis -2

1000: In the day's most exciting individual race, Kent States Bill Dunlap, and Penn States Mike Wyatt broke from the pack hitting the 440 respectively in 56.2 and 56.8. By the 660, Dunlap(1:26.2), Wyatt (1:26.5) and Michigans Andy Johnson (1:27.5) were 1,2,3 with Eastern Michigans Maurice Weaver not far behind. At the 880, the Mammouth striding Wolverine lengthened his stride and pulled within .4 of Dunlap and Wyatt who were even at 1:55.0. When the Michigan giant put it in gear, he was too much for Dunlap who had to run two strides for each of Johnsons, reminiscent of duals between Jack Bachelor and Frank Shorter. Wyatt tied up and the EMU freshman passed him with a strong finish.

MILE: Western Michigan's Tom Duits looked invincible going through 1:59.2, and 3:00.4 and even 3:29.0 before the wall fell on top of him. Joe Dubina, the Kent State senior went by him on the far turn and Michigans Steve Elliothipped him out at the finish line to give Michigan a 2-4-5 finish in the race, for 14 team points.

2Mile: Another superb race with Michigans Greg Meyer opening with a 64.3. Penn States George Malley, and Pitts Mel Boyd stayed on his back. By the 3/4 Boyd had taken the lead, Malleyhad faded due to an ankle injury, and Meyer, PSU's Bruce Baden and Eastern Michigans Ed Grabowski were still in contention. At 1 1/2 Boyd, Meyer and Baden were thirty yards up on Grabowski and an additional 40 on Pitts Ron Wirick, Western Michigans Jeff Zylstra and Malley. With a 440 to go Baden made a move, taking the lead (7:48.1) and opened up 5 on Meyer and 10 on Boyd. But within 25 yards Meyer glided past Baden and finished with a last quarter of 60.8. Malley on guts alone managed to outlean Zylstra for fifth place.

3m: Michigans Bill Donakowski went right out and won hands down in a relaxed 13:53.0

35 lb wt: Held at Eastern Michigans field house, Penn States two throwers, Al Jackson and Gary Greaser dominated the event hitting 63-11 1/2 and 59-10 respectively. Jackson's entire series was better than anyone elses best and averaged 62-2.

Triple Jump:The meets only double winners Craig Adams of Air Force hit 49-9 1/4 to outbound nearest rival Keith Taylor of Pitt.

High Jump: The name of Steve Elliot reminds most knowledgeable track fans of the Michigan miler, but not to Eastern Michigan University. Their Elliot leaped a pr 7-0 to head the field of 9 athletes at 6-8.

Pole Vault: Another EMU jumper, Nat Durham broke his own meet record of 16-4 to defend his own title with a vault of 16-6.

Long Jump: Michigan's James Henry (I think a freshman) leaped 24-8 1/2 to wrap up the competition in the preliminaries. The team fight for third place came down to a jump-off between Penn States John Sallade and Air Forces Russ Clemons, with the Nittany Lion junior hitting a pr 24-1 3/4 to lead his team to a third place team finish.

Centrals Wrapup

Shot Put: In a close competition Canada's Bruno Pauletto, throwing for Central Michigan barely outdistanced Michigan States Paul Schneider and Kent States Steve Cameron .

DMR: Michigans Dave Furst decided the race on the first leg hitting the 880 in 1:55.5, fifteen yards ahead of Bowling Green, Pitt and Penn State. Gary Hicks (49.5), Steve Elliot (3:00.3), and Greg Meyer (4:10.2) rounded out the Wolverine squad that hit 9:56.0

2MR: Eastern Michigans Guy Cole put his team in the race (1:56.0) behind Michigans Greg Meyer (1:55.2). EMU's Don Hubbard blow the race open with a 1:52.6 second leg, but Bowling Green's Rick Hutchinson left Eastern's Craig Gully's (1:55.7) standing still and the two squads handed off together. BG's Gary Desjardins sat back as Eastern Michigan's star freshman Maurice Weaver opened in a 55.9 quarter, hit 1:52.5 and won going away 7:36.85 to 7:41.40.

MR: In the final track race, Air Forces foursome had scored in three individual events as had Kentucky State. Cadet Russ Clemons handed off in a leadoff 48.3, five tenths ahead of KSU's Greg Anderson. Anthony Akins hit 48.2 to move ahead of Air Forces Bill Lee (48.9) but Air Forces Mark Webster clocked a sensational 47.4 to destroy the strong field and hand off to Jeff Remington who strided to an unpushed 49.1 as Air Force ran the top MR for a college team in the U.S, proving that their 3:13.? ~~was~~ on their oversized track was no fluke.
