Bayi Upset by Scott in

Steve Scott of UC Irvine upset Tanzania's Filbert Bayi in the 1,500 meters and Steve Williams beat a star-studded field in the 100 meters Friday night in the first Jamaica Invitational track and field meet at Kingston.

Olympic champion Edwin Moses completed an impressive double, winning the 400-meter hurdles in 48.64, best in the world this year, and upsetting Olympic silver medalist Alejandro Casanas of Cuba in the 110-meter high hurdles in 13.5.

Bayi, world record-holder at 1,500 meters, actually finished third in a photo finish that saw Scott and Steve Ovett of Britain both clocking 3:39.8. Bayi, who led until the final 80 meters, was timed in 3:39.9. His world record is 3:32.2.

"I was surprised Bayi had no kick," said Scott.

Bayi indicated he wasn't in top shape, saying, "I was only 60 to 65 per cent. I've only been training a few weeks."

Williams, coming from third place midway in the 100, hit the tape just in front of Americans Steve Riddick and Houston McTear. Williams was clocked in 10.26, Riddick in 10.31 and McTear in 10.33. Olympic champion Hasely Crawford of Trinidad was fourth in 10.35 and Olympic 200-meter champion Don Quarrie of Jamaica was fifth in 10.40.

last week, was sixth in 10.46.

Williams, knocked out of the last two Olympics by injuries, said, "It was just a matter of accelerating. There were too many people in the race to be concerned with others."

Mike Boit of Kenya won the 800 meters in 1:44.7. Tom McLean of Bucknell was second in 1:45.2.
