CANBERRA, Dec. 3/4-- The 3rd Pan Pacific Conference Games resulted in a big success for a relatively young Australian team, but the placings could not be taken too seriously: athletes from US, Canada and Japan, were competing out of the season and the NZ team did not include most of their top athletes.

However, it was pleasing to note that the 18-year-old Peter Narracott, who was badly out of form at the World Cup, won the 100m in 10.52 by 0.17 from Bill Collins into a 5.7m headwind. In the 200m, however, Collin was an easy first in 20.83.

The 400m resulted in a smart 46.27 win by NZ veteran, Bevan Smith, who finished 0.08 ahead of the young Australian, Jim O'Sullivan.

One of the biggest upsets was in the 800m. Australian champion, John Higham (26), set a furious pace over the first 600m, but he was completely exhausted with 75m to go when the 19-y.o. Chum Darvall, passed him for a smart win in 1.47.88. Darvall is 1.93m tall. He has 400m best of 46.9 and can quickly accelerate. There is little doubt that one day he will break Ralph Doubell's 1968 Australian best time on record of 1.44.3.

Graham Crouch tried hard to win the 1500m, but in the closing stages could not ward-off Japan's World Cup runner, Takashi Ishii, who won by 0.09 in 3.45.08.

The 500m was an easy race for David Fitzsimons, who only a few days earlier was down with a virus infection. The 10,000m went to the young Australian, Robert de Castella and Ron Addison (US) took the 3000m st as he pleased in 8.38.16.

There was an boilover in the 110mH in which Warren Parr was declared winner from US star, Charles Foster, in an equal time of 14.21 into a firm headwind. Don Wright (18), who is going to the States next year, was an early leader and finished third in 14.25.

Gary Brown let Sam Turner (US) do all the early running, then came home strongly to win 400mH in 51.89. Both relays went to US from Japan in 38.85 and 3.07.26.

Ron Livers (US) bounced to 16.63 for a well earned win in the triple jump but narrowly missed the bar 2.17m to concede the high jump to Japanese ace Kazunuri Koshikawa. Chris Commons, with an illegal 2.5m wind, won the long jump with a pb. of 8.08m and Bruce Simpson (Canada) was an easy first in the PV at 5.25m.

US took the SP honours through Colin Anderson (19.62) but in the DT Dan Gardner had only 10cm to spare from Japan's Kiyotaka Kawaski at 57.5. Peter Farmer was comfortable first in HT (67.62) and Phil Olsen (Canada) in the JT (80.98).

With Raelene Boyle for the first time not in an Australian team since 1968, Denise Robertson won the 100m/200m double (11.67/22.87) and also helped Australia to win the two relays (44.26/3.34.24).

In the 400m Montreal semi-finalist, Verna Burnard, showed return to form with 0.38 win over US champ. Sharon Dabney in 52.63.

Francie Larrieu took the 800m/1500m double in 2.06.30/4.18.32.

Debbie La Plante (US) dominated the 100mH with 14.03 and Marian Fisher (Australia) set BC 400m H hurdles electronic record of 57.28.

Debbie Brill went through the motions to claim HJ at 1.88 and Lyn Jancenko cleared 6.59 for 1st in BJ from teammate, Erica Nixon, who sat down on her best jump, yet still was credited with 6.38m.

Gael Mulhall took the SP by 15cm from Japan's Kayoko Hayashi at 16.15m Jane Haist (Canada) was too strong in the DT (55.64) and the fast improving Pam Mathews won the JT at 56.88.

Chum Darval, the 19-y.o. and 1.93m middle-distance sensation continued his presence felt with 1.47.6 win over Mark Belger (US) 1.48.0 and the rather tired John Higham (1.48.1), who tried to steal the race with 300m to go. However, Darvall kept in touch with him and then went on to ward-off Belger, who sprinted well over the last 90m. \*\*Geoff Shaw, 20, set quick pace in the 3000m and did not give in to the spirited challenge from David Fitzsimons, to win by 0.2sec. in 7.57.2. Takao Nakamura (Japan) took third spot from teammate, Fushumi Shigenari in equal time

of 7.58.6, whilst Henry Marsh (US) was next in 8.19.9 from Peter Butler (Canada) 8.20.5. Bruce Simpson (Canada) failed at his opening height of 5.05m and Ray Boyd (Australia) cleared 5.20m before three failures with the bar at Austraoian resident record of 5.35m. In the women's high jump Debbie Brill (Can.) went over 1.89m and Chris Annison (17) equalled her national residetn record of 1.83m. Tamami Yagi (Jap.) was 3rd at 1.77m and the 14-y.o. Vanessa Browne took 4th on a count-back from Theresa Smith (US) at 1.74m. 

110H Foster had a bad start and had to try to overtake into a 5m/s headwind. Parr lunged head over heels into the tape. The photo gave the win to Parr. Foster could not accept the photo result. In my view Parr was the clear winner.

400H Turner only had limited time to train before the meet. He was out early ; had to chop at the 6th hurdle, nicked the 7th; and knocked the last three down. Brown of Australia seeing Turner's problems mustered a strong drive to the tape to overtake the faltering Yank.

A well prepared Australian Team  
performed at a high level to dominate  
the third Pacific conference Games with  
the best showing by an Oceania Team since  
the 1956 Olympics.

Swirling winds on both days hampered  
performances. The cross wind was effected  
by the stadium design so that wind  
was against the runners in both  
back straight and home straight as well  
as the second bend. The sprints and  
hurdles were all run against significant  
wind. The runway events were tricky  
with wind blowing in opposit directions  
at the top of the runway and the pit.  
Cross wind in the Javelin and Discus.  
Bar had to be held on during jumpers approach  
in women's High Jump.

The concept of the Pacific Conference Games which splits the ~~the~~ athletes by event (irrespective of team) into touring groups for satellite meets after the games was again very successful. Three groups each attended two satellite meets after the Canberra Games. The athletes benefitted by the additional competitions and were ~~thus~~ able to see other parts of Australia. <sup>local</sup> Athletes benefitted by competing with international athletes. The smaller groups made it possible for athletes from different nations to get to know each other much better. The concept of post "Games" satellite meets is an excellent one.

The star of the Games was Denise Robertson who won both 100m & 200m as well as running strong legs on both relays for four gold medals.

Denise Robertson dominated the fields in both sprints with an outstanding display of smoothness and power.

In the 100m Robertson outclassed the field (against a ~~2.9~~ 2.9 mps wind which was much stronger in the final 20 meters where it funnelled through the stands). Robertson's 11.67 is worth much more under better conditions. Debbie Wells came from well back at 50 meters to a clear second in 11.79. New Zealand's Wendy Brown caught ~~Patty~~ fast starting Patty Loverock at the line for third (11.91 to 11.97).

Robertson came back the next day to run 22.87 against a strong breeze all the way in one of the better 200 meters I have seen. Wells again ran with power in the latter stages for second in 23.64 but just held off Kim Robertson of New Zealand (23.68).

Wells is one of the best prospects in the world at age 16. Her size and power

are impressive.

Patty Loverock was very tight and lost fourth at the line to New Zealand's Monag Mackenzie as both timed 24.00.

In the 400 meters Veria Butnard ran a well paced race from lane 8 to win going away in 52.63. Sharon Pabrey (USA) (53.03) collared Marian Fisher (53.19) in the final straight for second. Joyce Yakkabovich was away slowly and finished fourth (54.44) with Bev Kotsopoulos fifth in 55.46.

Francie Larieu came up with a strong double to win both 800m and 1500m.

In the 800m she front ran to a comfortable 2:06.3 win. Anne Mackie Moretti was well placed throughout but faded to fourth in the stretch (2:07.6) as Michelle Green (2:06.7) and Allison Wreath (2:07.2) ran her down. ~~in the~~ Debbie Scott 165 contact early and could only achieve sixth in 2:10.4.

In the 1500m Debbie Mitchell-Pearson strung out the field with even 68 second laps. Only Larrien was able to stay with Mitchell-Pearson. Marian Fisher was ~~an unsung hero~~ not really recognized for her three golds and bronze.

In the 400m Hurdles Fisher ran a well paced race for an excellent 57.28 wind to rank tenth in the 1977 world list with a Commonwealth record. Francine Gendron was

With Fisher at the eighth hurdle but could not match the Australians finish. Lamen Campton (Aus) caught Gendron at the tenth hurdle but could not match Francies run in and was  $13/100$  behind the Canadian at 58.40 at the finish. Gendron's time is the second best ever by a Canadian only  $17/100$  outside her national record.

In the 4x100 m relay Lyu Taceenko ran a brilliant lead off leg and Denise Robertson increased the lead on the back stretch. Marian Fisher and Debbie Wells maintained the advantage for a 44.26 Australian win. New Zealand looked sharp in 44.95<sup>for second</sup>. The Canadian team passed well but lacked speed with only one sprint specialist Anne Mackie-Moredale, Patty Loverock, Joyce Yablonowich and Joanne McLeod finished third in 45.99.

In the 1600 m relay Australia with Fisher, Campton, Robertson and Burnard were easy winners in 3:34.2. The Canadian team ran a very even race to hold second.

Bev Krotowski (55.46), Anne Mackie-Morelli, Francine Gendron (54.20),  
~~Joyce Yakubowich~~ (54.07) and Joyce Yakubowich  
(54.31) went into second at the break and were never challenged.

Debbie Brill dominated the high jump.

Diane Jones-Konikowski cleared 1.71m for seventh.

Lynn Jacenko totally dominated the long jump. Her first round 5.59m was aided by a 2.1 m/s wind however the position of the wind gauge was a factor as ~~the~~ flags at the pit showed negative wind. Her second round 5.48m and final 5.51m jumps were both legal. This capped an undefeated season for Jacenko.

Her 5.59 was only 1cm ~~as~~ short of her best.

Erica Hooker, who has a very strong approach, jumped well to record 6.38m. Noelene Hodgins jumped 6.18m in the last round to take third from New Zealand Team mate Sue Burnside. Diane Jones-Konikowska was sluggish and could not improve on her first round 5.97m which placed her fifth.

Gail Muhalil gave Australia the shot put title with a 16.45m put ahead of Kayoko Hayashi of Japan (16.00m). Lucette Moreau lacked her usual explosion and finished third with 15.40m. Diane Jones-Konikowska could reach only 14.27m for seventh.

Jane Haist reached 55.64m to win the Discus with Muhalil second (54.40) and Lynn Wimbigner third (52.58m). Lucette Moreau reached 50.20m for fourth.

Pam Mathews gave Australia the javelin gold with 56.88m. Karin Smith (USA) was second (54.50m) with Keiko Myokai (Jap) third.

Collins reversed the results in the 200 meters with a strong 20.83 against the wind. Narracott recorded 21.06 for second. Dan Biocchi ~~was~~ was again away slowly but came on strongly to record 21.30 just  $\frac{1}{100}$  behind Toshio Toyota's ~~for~~ bronze medal performance.
