Aztecs whip CSLA

Bill St. John and Sam Alexander set SDSU track and field records Saturday as the Aztecs ran their dual meet record to 6-0 by defeating Cal State Los Angeles, 90-73, at Choc Sportsman Oval.

St. John, a freshman, ran a 9:08.1 steeplechase while Alexander tossed the discus 175'7" to erase Houston Ridge's 11-year-old mark of 174'9". Mark Dowling held the steeplechase mark at 9:12.9.

The Aztecs won 13 events, including both relays, against the previously unbeaten Diablos.

Other top Aztec marks included a 21.5 220 into the wind by James Perry.

Jose Madruga ran a 47.7 440 for first and Brian Donohue won the 880-yard run in a time of 1:52.2. Tom Smith was victorious in the mile in 4:09.

Besides Alexander's victory in the discus, the Aztecs earned four other first place finishes in field events.

Joe Briski was victorious in the hammer throw, with a toss of 167'4". In the shotput, Jean Beaudry won with 57'2"; Scott Young leaped 6'9" to win the high jump; and Mike Packer won the javelin with a throw of 215'7".
