Record book takes bea

Pity the poor person who has to re-type the San Jose Relays' record

It may take quite a while.

The poor old book took quite a beating Saturday at San Jose City College in the annual relays, battered it was. To a pulp.

Nine community college meet records were set and six high school marks were established during the crystaline but blustery

Perhaps more noteable than the marks that will appear in the book, however, are the times and distances that will never see print.Unless an asterisk accompanies them.

Derald Harris, a freshman at Los

Medanos College in Pittsburg clocked the fifth-fastest electronically-time 200 meters ever, windaided or not, when he ran away from a quick field in 20.01.

The time, second fastest ever by a community college runner, is the quickest in the world during the past five years. But because of a 5.65 mile per hour aiding wind, put an asterisk by the "record."

Houston McTear, likewise a freshman at Santa Monica City College, blazed out of the blocks to whip Olympic 200-meter champion Don Quarrie in the invitational 100 meters. But once gain, a strong wind aided the time of 10.18.

And Mike McRae of Chabot College would have had himself national record in the triple jump had it not been for that gusty wind.

McRae leaped to a windy 53-4, which didn't count, and a 52-81/2 mark which did-for a new meet record. The non-windy mark missed tying the national record by a half inch.

Those three marks, all turned in by community college athletes, were the highlight of the day's events.

A national CC best of 1:25.7 in the 880 relay by Pasadena; a state best of 3:14.41 in the mile relay by Alameda: a national best of 52.0 in the 440 intermediate hurdles by Skyline's Tony Hicks; a national best of 7:41.1 in the two-mile relay
