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and dwelt on the importance of Jubail industrial zone for the development of the Kingdom.

As the King cut the ribbon marking the inauguration of the gas liquefaction plant, the oil minister said the new plant will produce 3.5 million cubic feet of liquefied gas per day.

He said that the setting up of this plant was a cherished objective of the late King Faisal.

Sheikh Ahmed said that construction of three other similar plants was planned in other parts of the Kingdom, but that the Jubail plant was the largest since its production capacity will correspond to 50 per cent of the total output of the three other plants.

He said that the establishment of this plant was essential for the industrialization of the Kingdom.

King Khaled then toured the various sections of the plant escorted by Sheikh Ahmed who briefed him on its technical aspects.

The King landed at Jubail's King Abdul Aziz naval base at 9 a.m. where he was received by Prince Fahd, Prince Abdullah, Prince Sultan and other princes, high-ranking officials and senior officers.

Commander of the base, Col. Ibrahim Al-Saga welcomed the King and escorted him on a tour of the base, following which the King unveiled memorial of Jubail's commercial port amid cheers from crowd.

Luncheon banquet was laid on by the commission in honor of King Khaled and his party before their return to Dhahran.

Iraq, Saudis grab track medals

RIYADH, Oct. 29 — Iraq dominated the winner's circle at the four-day Gulf Track and Field Championship held Oct. 25 through 28 at the Malaz stadium, Riyadh.

Tough competition was provided by Saudi Arabia, though, which swept up most of the remaining medals, followed by Kuwait.

The tournament, which opened at 4 p.m. Oct. 25, in a ceremony attended by Prince Salman, governor of Riyadh, Prince Faisal ibn Fahd, head of the Youth Welfare Authority, and Prince Talal ibn Saud, is an annual competition involving the Gulf countries — Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Bahrain, Iraq, Qatar, and the United Arab Emirates.

Each year a different country plays host to the event; Iraq was the site last year and the tournament will take place in Kuwait next year. The Saudi national track team, a group of dedicated young men who participate regularly in their home town track club, trained for two months in Sweden for the event.

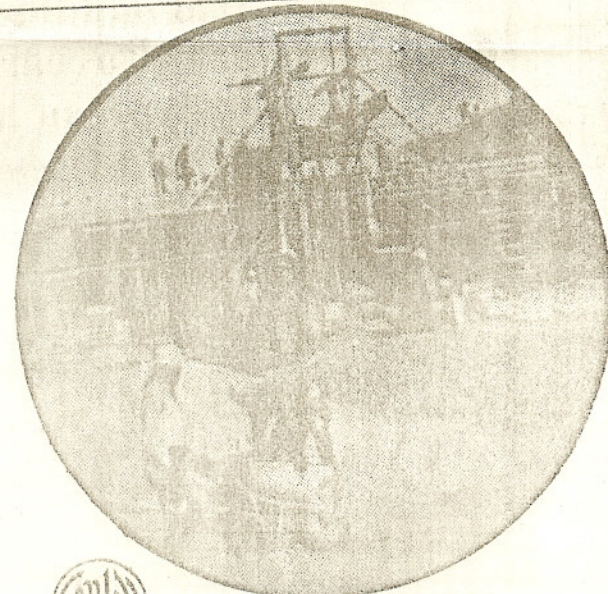
