REFEREE



BOB TIMMONS

Bob Timmons gained fame as Jim Ryun's high school and university coach at Wichita, Kansas East high school and the University of Kansas but long after the former world mile record holder hung up his spikes, the 52-year old mentor is still winning titles.

Timmons, a KU graduate, has won 19 of 34 Big Eight conference championships including 10 consecutive outdoor track and field titles. He's also won seven indoor crowns and two cross-country titles.

HONORARY REFEREE



DARRELL ROYAL

Serving as honorary referee is Darrell Royal, director of Athletics at The University in Austin who resigned as head football coach last December after 20 highly successful seasons.

Royal's Longhorn grid teams won 11 Southwest conference championships and three national titles during his two decades on the 40 Acres.

As athletic director for the past 13 years, Royal has seen the Longhorns win national glory in other sports as well, including five national team and individual golf crowns, one baseball title and three track individual championships.

THE 50TH TEXAS RELAYS April 1–2, 1977 Austin, Texas

The Texas Relays track and field classic was co-founded in 1925 by L. Theo Bellmont and Clyde Littlefield.

The carnival, which attracts many of the nation's top athletes, has been held annually since 1925 with the exception of three depression years—1933, 1934, and 1935.

COACHES NOTE

There have been some major changes within divisions and events. Please note event sheet carefully before making out entries. Also note that individual events in the University, College, and Junior College divisions will be run together in the Collegiate Division. All athletes must meet qualifying standards.

Please note the events for your division listed on the event sheet. Enter only individuals or teams in the events in your division.

Eligibility

The rules of the National Collegiate Athletic Association and the U.S. Track and Field

Federation apply to all teams and individual participants of the Texas Relays.

To be eligible to compete in the High School Division, persons and teams must be in good standing with the respective state interscholastic association.

Prelims

In all cases where preliminaries are needed, the field will be cut to fewest number of heats possible.

Limit on Entries

Two athletes per team will be allowed in individual events. One relay team will be allowed to run in each relay.

BE SURE TO SEND YOUR ENTRIES BY FIRST CLASS REGISTERED, RETURN RECEIPT REQUESTED.

Please include times and best marks in all events on the entry blanks.

Declaration of Entries

Coaches may scratch from 2 p.m. on Thursday, March 31 at Bellmont Hall, 8th Floor (Memorial Stadium, west side), but MUST CERTIFY by 5 p.m. by either scratching or declaring IN PERSON that there are no changes. All entries not certified by this time WILL NOT be drawn into heats and lanes.

Scratches and/or certification must be made IN PERSON (another coach may do this for you). This means that each coach is responsible to inform the Meet Director either in person or through another coach of his entries EVEN IF THERE ARE NO CHANGES.

ALL DECLARATIONS FOR ALL DIVISIONS MUST BE MADE IN PERSON, NO TELEPHONE, TELEGRAPH, OR LETTERS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

...IF ANY ATHLETE IS DRAWN IN ON THURSDAY NIGHT AND DOES NOT RUN IN ANY OF THE RACES IN WHICH THEY ARE DRAWN, THEY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED FROM RUNNING FOR THE REST OF THE MEET. THIS APPLIES TO ALL DIVISIONS.

The following Texas Relays Honest Effort Rule is different from the N.C.A.A. Rule 5, Section 8, Article 1, page 57.

Runners legally declared in running events must honestly participate. (Refer to the Foreword of the N.C.A.A. Track & Field Guide.) The runner must run with maximum effort, or qualify or place, and not intentionally take a false start, in all heats and finals, or be barred from all remaining running events in the current Championships. However, an athlete barred for scratching or dropping out because of injury or illness may return to the competition if the Meet Physician substantiates the ailment and subsequent recovery to the referee in writing.

COACHES PLEASE NOTE

CONTESTANTS IN THE JERRY THOMPSON MILE, THE COLLEGIATE 1500 METERS, AND THE COLLEGIATE 5,000 METERS MAY NOT RUN IN ANY OTHER RACE THAT DAY BEFORE THESE SPECIAL RACES.

THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS: ATHLETES VIOLATING THIS RULE WILL BE DISQUALIFIED FROM FURTHER COMPETITION.

If you enter your One and Three Milers in relays which come before the 1500 Meters and the 5000 Meters, these people will not be considered when selecting the open events. This means that relays will be considered before individual events if athletes are entered in both.

Women's Division

N.C.C.A. rules will govern the Women's Division. There will be 9 events—100-meter dash, 100-meter hurdles, 1500 meters, 440 relay, sprint medley, mile relay, two mile relay, pentathlon, and high jump. In the sprint medley there will be two legs of 110 yards, one of 220, and one 440. There will be prelims only in the 100-meter dash, the 100-meter hurdles, the 440 yard relay, and the mile relay. The OTHER EVENTS WILL BE INVITATIONAL ONLY.

The Women's hurdles will be run with the

international spacing which is 13 meters (42.651 ft.) to the first hurdles, 8.5 meters (27.887 ft.) between hurdles, and 10.5 meters (34.448 ft.) to the finish line.

DISTANCE MEDLEY: In the past there has been a lot of controversy concerning the selection of the distance medleys. In order to eliminate this situation, each school entered in the distance medley must declare their miler. This individual must run. The selection will be made to a great extent upon the miler submitted. If a change is to be made from this original declaration, the games committee must approve. If the miler declared does not run, the distance medley will be disqualified.

3000 Meter Steeplechase: approximately 12 best times will be accepted.

High Jump, Pole Vault Data

The Collegiate high jump will start at 6'7" and go up two inches at a time to 7'1" the bar will be moved up one inch at a time. The Collegiate pole vault will begin at 15'9" and go up six inches at a time to 17'3". After 17'3" the bar will be moved up three inches at a time.

Collegiate Invitational Events

There will be two invitational events this year—the Collegiate 1500 Meters and the Collegiate 5000 Meters.

There WILL be preliminaries in the University and College sprint medley relays.

The standards this year for the Collegiate 1500 Meters and the 5000 Meters are listed below:

1500 Meters (1 mile): (1) Best time ever of 4:04, or (2) Best time this year of 4:08, or (3) 12 best times submitted—ONLY 12 WILL RUN. Please indicate if times submitted are metric times.

5000 Meters (3 mile): (1) Best time ever of 13:45, or (2) Best time this year of 13:55, or (3) 16 best times submitted—ONLY 16 WILL RUN. Please indicate

if times submitted are metric times.

In selecting the athletes to run in these events, we will lean more heavily towards times that have been run this year. Meter times will be converted.

Attention All University-College-Junior College Coaches

There has been a change in these divisions. We will continue to run the universities, colleges, and junior colleges together in the individual events and this will be called the Collegiate Division. All athletes must meet

qualifying standards.

In the University-College Division Relays where there are prelims, universities and colleges will run together. In the 4 Mile Relay, we will pick the 16 best University-College teams. In the *University* 2 Mile Relay and Distance Medley Relay, we will select the 16 best university teams. In the *University-College* 2 Mile Relay and Distance Medley

Relay, we will pick the 16 best universities and colleges which were not picked for the University 2 Mile Relay and Distance Medley Relay. Awards will be given in *all* relays.

In all invitational events, you must meet the qualifying standard to be considered for that event.

HIGH SCHOOL

This year's Texas Relays will feature 11 high school events. In order to run in this meet a high school athlete must have met the following standards during 1977 (please give the date and place of meet):

120 High Hurdles—14.4 100-Yard Dash—9.7

Two-Mile Run—Best 16 times submitted. Must run 2 miles on the track in an official track meet in 1977. CROSS COUNTRY TIMES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

440-Yard Relay—43.0 Mile Relay—3:22 Two-Mile Relay—16 best times High Jump—6'5" Long Jump—22'6" Pole Vault—14'0" Shot Put—56' Discus—165'

Junior College Relays

There will be prelims in the 440 relay and mile relay. The Junior College sprint medley relay is invitational—give best times for all four runners. Best combined times will be selected to run. There will be no prelims in the JC distance medley.

There are no individual events in the Junior College Division. JC athletes will run in the

College Division.

Protests

Protests relating to matters which develop during the carrying through of the program should be made at once and not later than 30 minutes after the result has been officially announced in the finals or within 15 minutes in a preliminary round. Any such protest must be made in writing by a coach and submitted to the protest table. The protest will be submitted to the Referee who will render a decision.

ÁTTENTION COACHES IN ALL DIVISIONS:

The Texas Relays will continue its CHAL-LENGE RULE. Any coach may challenge in writing the time, height, or distance marks as entered. It is then the responsibility of the challenged person to verify to the Games Committee the marks in order to compete.

Decathlon and Pentathlon

There will be a special Texas Relays USTFF Decathlon and Pentathlon (Southwest Championships) at Memorial Stadium on Wednesday and Thursday, March 30 and 31. The field will be limited to the 12 best individuals. Please submit individual times and distances for each event and total points in previous decathlons and pentathlons.

Qualifying

All running events are heated and laned according to times submitted. If no times are

given, they are drawn. Qualifying for finals will be on place and/or time basis in all events except the 440 hurdles. The eight best times will qualify in the 440 hurdles.

THERE WILL BE AN ENTRY FEE OF \$2.00 PER ATHLETE IN ALL DIVISIONS. ENTRY FEES ARE NOT TRANSFERABLE OR REFUNDABLE. ENTRIES NOT ACCOMPANIED BY FEES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AND WILL NOT BE RETURNED TO SENDER.

High School

The Texas Relays High School Division will be run under N.C.A.A. rules. We will use the N.C.A.A. Start Rule. Refer to the 1977 N.C.A.A. Track & Field Guide.

Thursday Night Banquet

For coaches, officials, and press, by invitation only. Sorry, but each school will be limited to the Head Track Coach and the Assistant Track Coach only.

Relays

Any athlete qualified for this meet may run on any relay at any time.

Artificial Surface

Memorial Stadium, site of the Texas Relays, has a Tartan track around the AstroTurf

football field. The pole vault, javelin, triple jump, high jump, and long jump runways are made of the Tartan surface also. One-quarter inch spikes will be required for all track events and the pole vault, javelin, triple jump and long jump events. The shot put and discus rings are of concrete and will require rubbersole shoes. The javelin and discus prelims and finals will be held on the freshman field located across the street, west and south of Memorial Stadium.
