Hart wins fast 100 at Fresno

FRESNO — Eddie Hart announced his coming out of retirement the only way he knew how — winning the 100 meter dash here at the West Coast Relays in Ratcliffe Stadium before a near capacity crowd last night.

Hart's last race before his 10.21 victory last night was the anchor leg of the winning United States 4x100 relay team at the 1972 Olympics in Munich.

"Actually, the last time I ran was two weeks ago at the California faculty meet at Hayward," said Hart as he slipped on his warmup suit. "I ran a 10.3 then and I felt pretty good. What brought me out of retirement? Circumstances. I'm in a position to earn some money so I needn't have that worry anymore."

Hart was referring to his job as head track coach at the College of Alameda. He said he does not find a conflict between his training and coaching.

"There's not problem about that," he said. "I've

There were other heroics for San Jose City College athletes. They won a botched-up relay that wound up being between 800 meters and 880 yards, but they still may gain a national junior college record of 1:23.96 out of it.

The first three Jaguars, Dwayne Green, Ernest Lewis and Willie Jackson, each ran 200 meters, while anchor man Eugene Rachel ran 223 yards.

Meet referee Hal Beatty said the Jaguars could possibly be given an 800-meter record, but it cannot be accepted as a national or WCR mark for 880 yards because it was three yards short.

San Jose's team members rated their exchanges "not very good," and they said they are certain they can do better.

A Jaguar foursome of Donnie Anderson, Lewis, Jackson and Rachel earlier won the 400-meter relay in 40.23, and Andre Phillips improved his national-leading 400-meter intermediate time to 50.75.

In the open division, meet records fell in the hammer throw, discus, intermediate hurdles and javelin.

Ken Stadel of the San Jose Stars rubbed out the meet record of 213-4 by San Josean John Powell in the discus with a throw of 216-9. Stadel, who threw a lifetime best of 224-5 in the San Jose National Invitational last Saturday, wasn't pleased with his mark.

"I felt real tacky today," said Stadel. "I don't know what it is, but I just don't throw well in Fresno."

Rech Greybehl of USC won the 400-meter intermediate hurdles in 49.84 to erase the meet mark of 50.1 set by Ron Whitney of the Southern California Striders in 1967.

Scott Neilson of Washington won the hammer throw with a heave of 235-4 to eclipse the WCR record of 226-4 set by George Frenn in 1971, and Phil Olsen of Tennessee won the javelin at 280-8 to surpass the meet standard of 277-2 by Bill Skinner of the New York Athletic Club in 1971.

"I feel very competitive now," said Olsen. "I felt great today. I think I can get the world record (310-4) by 1980. That is my goal now. I'll be going after Miklos Nemeth (of Hungary) at Moscow."

Ruth Kleinsasser Caldwell of Citrus J.C. sat a new national junior college 800-meter record and WCR mark of 2:03.9, beating Tecla Chembawi of Maccabi Track Club and Cyndy Poor of Athletics in Action in the process.

"I've been here the last two years running behind Cyndy and lost because she would pass me at the 220," said Caldwell. "I figured if I went out hard I'd get her."

Stanford's James Lofton was second in the long jump at 26-4 behind Charlton Ehizuelen's 26-6½, and Al Feuerbach of Athletics West won the shot put with an impressive 69-1½.
