SCVAL track trio scores a triple runaway

LOS ALTOS HILLS — Somewhere in the back of Bill Green's mind, he knows there is another Peninsula athlete who has beat him every time they've raced.

Never mind that Green of Cubberley High is the defending state champion in the quarter-mile and this year holds the national best of 21.0 in the 220-yard dash. This runner has something on him.

And she won't let him forget it.
Way back at Crescent Park Elementary School in Palo Alto, Lola Rockwell showed Green who was the boss when it came to sprinting.
"I sure didn't want any boy to beat me," she said. "Of course, he never brings it up in the public eye."

Now competing in their respective divisions, Green of Cubberley and Rockwell of Gunn spotlighted the Santa Clara Valley Athletic League finals Saturday with record-setting performances at Foothill College.

It was Green's last race ever in

the SCVAL and he stamped it with confirmation that he is the No. 1 sprinter in the league's history. He made a clean sweep of the 100, 220 and 440 with record-breaking performances the 100 (9.6) and 220 (21.5).

Green's quarter-mile clocking of 47.8 is the fastest run in the CCS this

Rockwell, a junior, was every bit as convincing in the girls varsity, stunning the field with league records while taking the 100 in a CCS best of 10.94, the 220 (25.7) and long jump (18-5). Her marks helped crown the year for Gunn's girls with the SCVAL title.

Kerry Brogan of Los Altos was the other star of the show, scoring an amazing triple by capturing the 2 mile, 880 and mile in that order. Her stamina and drive is unmatched in the Central Coast Section.

It was an example of what makes Los Altos a winner, year in and year out. The Knights added to their remarkable record by racking up a perfect year and another SCVAL

boys championship.

Freshman Bryan Carroll, Tom Deeney and Jim Krueger powered the way for Los Altos, as the Knights finished with the No. 1 total of 99½ points in the finals to go with a 9-0 dual-meet season.

For Los Altos coach Leo Long, it was his 14th SCVAL championship in 16 years of coaching. Long said he was especially thrilled by this year's team, since it lacked the sprint power of most champion-ship-caliber squads.

But Los Altos has something else—it has drive, more than any other team around can offer. The Knights also have Bryan Carroll.

Carroll became the first freshman in SCVAL history ever to win two league titles. He opened by capturing the 2-mile in 9:39.8 and then backing it up with a winning 4:31.8 in the mile.

The accomplishment is magnified when one considers that not one of the top three placers who challenged him in the mile had run in the 2-mile earlier in the meet. "He's incredible and unbelievable."

Long said.

Teammates Krueger and Deeney also won key victories for the Knights, although they took different routes. Krueger, a big favorite, sailed away with the SCVAL record in the shot put with a heave of 59-80.

Deeney, on the other hand, was a critical underdog in the 880, a race Mario Springer of Mountain View has dominated all season. But Deeney came out fast and Springer — or anybody else — could never catch him, as he finished with a lifetime best 1:57.8.

Springer, who has the best time in the CCS for the 880 (1:56.6), finished a mysterious fourth. He'll get another chance in the Region II finals Saturday at Los Gatos High

Cubberley had record performances not only by Green, but by Terry Smith in the 330 low hurdles. It was an extremely fast field—with Los Altos' Deeney, Gunn's Rick Ludeman and Cubberley's Jeff Moss and Chris Cooke all breaking the 40-second barrier.

Smith won it in 38.7.
