## The SPAL was not without its surprises

LOS ALTOS HILLS - Nearly every winner in the South Peninsula Athletic League track and field finals continued to look like a prime candidate for a state meet spot. The most memorable champion, however, was a miler who had never broken five minutes going into his senior season.

Certainly, Art Nicholson ran to his potential Saturday at Foothill College while earning the first sprint sweep in SPAL history, clocking 9.8, 22.0 and 49.2 to claim the outstanding runner trophy and lead Menlo-Atherton High over dual meet champ Carlmont for the Bears' first league finals title since

Certainly, compact 5-foot-11. 190-pound strongboy Chris Morton unloaded under pressure, as usual, to take the outstanding field event trophy with life bests in the shot put (57-8) and discus (154-8 1/2).

Certainly, every other league favorite came through with a highcaliber victory.

Yet Greg Hanna's surprise triumph in the mile for San Carlos would have won any award for heart, hands down.

While much more accomplished runners were concerned more with each other and also sapped somewhat by the heat of earlier competition on the warmest day of the spring, Hanna won the championship he had secretly planned for since the first day of practice.

Hanna had learned he didn't have the kick needed to hold back. So the lanky senior gambled his dream on going out as hard as he could and sustaining the pace, if he could, while letting his rivals worry about the heat and team point strategy. The result was a wire-towire victory in 4:32.2, a whopping 30-second improvement on his best mark going into the season.

"I really believed I could do it," said Hanna, "although there's always a certain doubt when you've never done it. But you've got to believe in yourself. You're cheating yourself if you don't give yourself a chance. I just focused everything on this meet and psyched myself

Morton, too, was psyched - by the trials edge which rival Dean Paleologos of Woodside had established, and by the 56-11 3/4 shot put by Awalt's Rick Weyers earlier on the same field Saturday in the Santa Clara Valley Athletic League

"Weyers' throw knocked me down in the CCS (Central Coast Section) standings," said Morton, who is eyeing at least the third and final state meet qualifying spot at the CCS finals (he now ranks third in the CCS).

Morton surprised himself by beating M-A's John Harris by half an inch in the discus.

M-A, which outscored Carlmont 91 1/2 to 82 1/2, received its biggest come-through by senior hurdler Steve Woodson, who took a pair of critical thirds with life bests of 15.0 in the highs and 38.9 in the lows (tying M-A's record).

Senior Jim Swain of Carlmont won the hurdles in 14.5 (a life best) and 38.0 to beat a life best 38.7 by Woodside's Kirk Campana. Swain,
