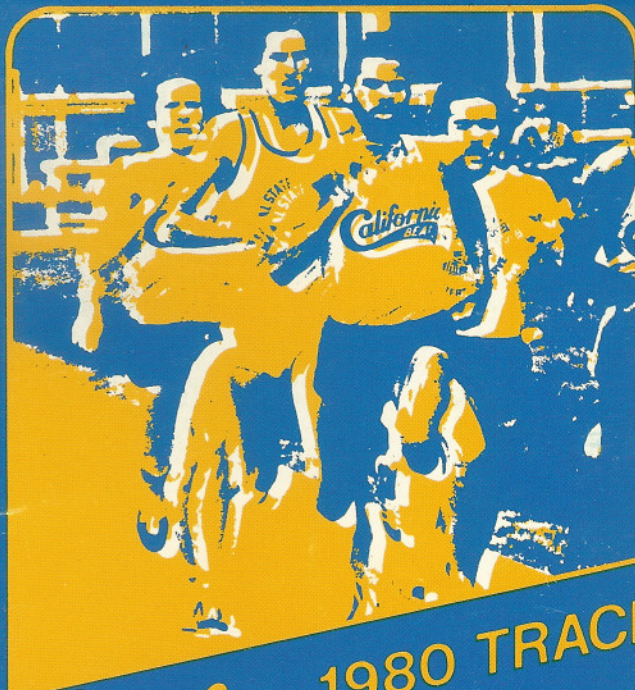

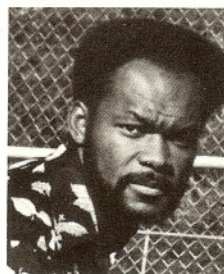
ERV HUNT

HEAD COACH UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

Erv Hunt enters his eighth season as the California track coach. He is only the sixth man to hold the position in the school's 79 years of track and field history.

At the time of his appointment by former track coach and currently athletic director Dave Maggard, Hunt was the youngest coach ever named to a head position at the University of California.

Hunt has accomplished many things during his seven years, including a 35-25 dual meet record. Since 1973, school records have been tied or established in thirteen of twenty events, 1979 saw six new records set.



Born and raised in Fresno, Calif., Hunt enjoyed both an outstanding prep and collegiate career in his hometown. He was a three sport athlete at Edison H.S., where he was a standout defensive back in football, played guard in basketball, and ran the hurdles in track.

His 14.0 time in the 120 high hurdles was the fastest JC time in the United States in 1969, when he finished second in the State JC meet. He also ran a 37.7 in the 330 intermediate hurdles that same year, and "toyed" with several field events, most notably his 49'8" triple jump.

He transferred to Fresno State on a football-track scholarship following his two years at Fresno CC, playing defensive back under Darryl Rogers, now at Arizona State. He won Little All-American honors as the Bulldogs won two conference titles.

At the conclusion of his college football he was chosen in the sixth round by the Green Bay Packers. He suffered a back injury in his second season as a pro which forced an early retirement.

Following his pro stint, Hunt returned to Fresno and taught elementary school for a brief time before teaching at Clovis H.S.

In 1972, Cal's head track coach Dave Maggard hired Hunt to handle the runners.

Hunt's accomplishments went beyond the playing field. In 1968 he was chosen by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes as the "Scholar-Athlete of the Year."

Erv and his lovely wife Jackie make their home in Richmond with their two children, Jamie, 8 and Ericka, 3.

MIKE HURD

ASSISTANT TRACK COACH UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA



A life-long Bay Area resident, Mike Hurd enters his first season coaching in the collegiate ranks, bringing great enthusiasm to the program. "Over the last few years, I'd been looking forward to coaching at the college level," says Mike, "and coming to Cal was ideal. It's an opportunity to coach in the best track conference in the United States, and without even having to move the family."

Hurd was the head track and field coach at Antioch HS for nine seasons, expanding student involvement from 30 to 140, boys and girls. Antioch never finished lower than second in the Diablo Valley Athletic League, and won the league title in 1973, 1974, 1976, 1977, and 1979.

The 33-year old was born in Pittsburg and grew up in Antioch, earning eight letters in cross-country, basketball, and track at Antioch H.S. ('64). He then attended Fresno State, earning three varsity letters as a horizontal jumper and sprinter. As a senior in 1968, he ran the lead leg on FSU's sprint relay, passing the baton to—Erv Hunt.

He and his wife Lisa make their home in Antioch with their son Matthew.

BRIAN MAXWELL

ASSISTANT TRACK COACH DISTANCE RUNNERS



Canada's top distance runner is California's coach in the distance events. Brian Maxwell, himself a former Bear, rates among the world's elite in the marathon and road racing, and in coaching draws upon his own experience.

Now in his fifth season at Cal, Maxwell also handles the fall cross-country chores. He began coaching at Cal after his final season competing for the Bears (1975). During his Cal career,

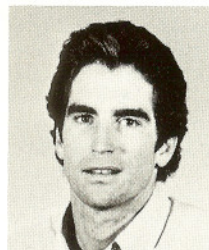
he made the top ten lists at two, three, and six miles, as well as the steeplechase.

Born in London, England, he attended Victoria Park H.S. in Toronto. As a prep, he was the Canadian junior 5000 meters champion, and later recorded the fourth fastest 10,000 meters time by a Canadian.

He received a bachelor's degree in architecture from Cal.

BRAD DUFFEY

ASSISTANT TRACK COACH UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA



Former Cal 5000-meter record holder Brad Duffey enters his second year as an assistant at Cal, aiding Erv Hunt and Brian Maxwell on the track. A four-year letterman at Cal (1973-77, sitting out 1975), he recorded Cal's best marks ever at two and three miles and 5000 meters during his career, also making the top 10 in the mile.

The 25-year old came to Cal from Lowell H.S. in San Francisco, with family tradition at Cal (five family members are Cal grads), and received a degree in political science in 1977. He went on to earn a teaching credential in 1978, also at Cal.

As a senior, he was also honored as the 1977 recipient of the Brutus Hamilton Award for Cal's track scholar-athlete of the year.

DAVE MAGGARD

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA



While excellence, diversity, creativity and size are the hallmarks of the University of California, the same can be said of its popular athletic director, Dave Maggard.

Now in his eighth year as Cal's director of men's intercollegiate athletics, Maggard has a background in sports only a very select few enjoy. However, the level of excellence at which he has performed is unsurpassed.

As an athlete, he reached the pinnacle of amateur athletics as a member of the 1968 U.S. Olympic team as a 67-foot shot putter. During his college days he set the Cal school record in the shot put while winning three letters in that sport and one in football.

While a rookie head coach for the 1970 Cal track team, Maggard led the Golden Bears to that sport's pinnacle, the NCAA championship, developing such standouts as former world record holder Eddie Hart and NFL standout Isaac Curtis.

In 1971, he was selected to the prestigious post of Head Coach of the United States National Track and Field Team. A year later, at the young age of 32, Maggard was named the University's Athletic Director, one of the most commanding positions at any level of athletic administration. The job he has done since 1972 is nothing short of outstanding, bringing the University back to athletic prominence and respect.

The task was not an easy one by any means. His first effort was giving birth to the Bear Backers, which has since become the fund-raising life blood of the Department. This donor group has grown from an infancy of virtually nothing to its present stature of \$700,000 annual giving, which includes a full grant-in-aid program, endowments, and capital improvements.

Maggard has also taken steps to improve several of the University's athletic facilities, which includes a new \$250,000 track surface, a new \$135,000 tennis complex, and a new \$35,000 bulkhead for the aquatics complex.

He was recently appointed the chairman for the NCAA's prestigious International Relations Committee, which worked toward rejoining the United States Olympic Committee. He also serves on the NCAA's Committee for the United States Track & Field Federation, and is a member of a committee which sanctions all-star high school games.

A native of Turlock, California, Maggard enrolled at Cal on a football scholarship. He lettered one year in football and three in track before graduation in 1962 with his BA in Physical Science.

He began teaching and coaching on the high school level in 1963 at Sunset HS in Hayward, Calif., while training toward his goal of winning a spot on the 1968 Olympic squad.

He later assumed a coaching and teaching position with Los Altos HS near San Jose, but was summoned back to his alma mater for the 1969 season to serve as Sam Bell's assistant with the track team. A year later, he was the head track coach.

Despite the long hours and the seven day working weeks, one of his greatest enjoyments comes with the time he can spend with his family. He and his lovely wife, Carolyn, have three children, David, Darrin, and Dana. The Maggards make their home in Lafayette.

STAFF PERSONNEL

California athletic department staff actively involved with track and field include medical, equipment, and facilities personnel. The daily well-being of the participants is attended to by head trainer Bob Orr, who is assisted by Dave Stenger, Paul Mohler, and Bob Annabelle.

The Bears' team physician is Dr. Jerome Patmont, a Cal graduate who handles all of the men's intercollegiate sports at Berkeley.

Equipment is under the supervision of Dick Hale.

Maintenance of the track facility is overseen by Hal Barker, who also directs the Bears' operations in Memorial Stadium, Evans Diamond, and areas of Harmon Gymnasium. He is assisted primarily by Pete Molendyk and Jack Baldrige at the track.

PRESS SERVICES

Requests for credentials for California track and field events should be made in writing and one week in advance to John McCasey, director of public relations, men's intercollegiate athletics, 61 Harmon Gym.

Edwards Stadium has a press box, located on the west side, with access by stairs only. Complete event summaries will be provided at the conclusion of the meet. If telephones are required at the press box, orders must be placed directly with Pacific Telephone. Otherwise, a telecopier and several phones located in the Sports Information Office in Harmon Gym may be made available upon prior arrangement.



CALIFORNIA IN 1980

1980 CALIFORNIA TRACK OUTLOOK

Despite the loss of a handful of seniors to graduation, three of whom figured in five school records in 1979, California's 1980 track and field squad could be one of the better-balanced in a number of years.

Andy Clifford, Michael Marlow, and Gary Blume are gone, but returning are Cal recordmen Dave Steen (decathlon) and Floyd Eddings (long jump), as well as eight Cal Top Tennessees. Add in a double-handful of quality newcomers, and the Bears appear to be in reasonably good shape—which they need to be, once again facing some of the nation's best squads in San Jose State and Pac-10 rivals USC, UCLA, and Washington State.

ERV HUNT: "I'm really looking forward to this season. There's something about this group we have this year, it's exciting. We'll have to see how it all comes performance-wise, of course, but some of the youngsters we have will surprise some people. I think this could be the best-balanced team I've had here."

EVENT BY EVENT

(depth chart on page 20)

100-200: The Bears appear to be deeper in the short sprints than last year, but lost school record holder Mike Farmer. Back are Holden Smith and Alonzo Mathis from last year, Floyd Eddings returns after a redshirt season, and better overall depth could bring Eugene Rachal back to the short races. Also, hurdles man Derek Robinson has excellent speed, and could be used in the flat races.

400: Possibly the only "regular" 400 men this year might be freshmen—walk-on Gary Kelly, who logged a 46.9 relay leg for Locke HS (and may also appear in the sprints), and Gregg Thornton, who turned in a 48.5 open 400. The top 400 times for Cal in 1979 belonged to hurdler Lloyd Guss (46.81) and 800 man Mike White (47.1), both personal bests. Rachal (47.6) also recorded a PR.

800: Mike White lowered the school freshman record (formerly held by Rick Brown) 1.1 seconds in 1979, the bulk of that coming in a third-place finish at the national AAU meet. Cal's fifth-best all-time, he's joined by JC transfer John Sup, who managed 1:50.6 last season despite infrequent activity at 800 meters, as well as hurdlers Guss, Peter Grimes, and Mark Uribe, all of whom could participate here.

1500: This event will sorely miss the durable Clifford, who was undefeated in dual meet 1500s the last three seasons, and also doubled back on occasion at 800. Facing that gap is Sup, the state small JC champion (3:45.9). Soph Mike O'Reilly recorded personal bests last year in back-to-back weekends, finishing seventh in the Pac-10 at 3:50.0, and Felix Elieff (3:51), among others, could drop down from the distance races.

Distance: Coach Brian Maxwell has more flexibility than he's had in a while, with Elieff (14:17.4) and Hal Schulz (14:12.8, 9:01.3), both of whom rank among Cal's top ten. Then there are talented freshman Tom Downs (8:55.2mi), JC transfer Michael Dyer (9:00.8), and a long runner in Rich McCann. However, the departed Blume left with school marks in the 5000, 10,000, and steeplechase.

Hurdles: Once again, the deepest and best event for the Bears, but amazingly, this year's group very well could be better than 1979 (which featured two top 10 high hurdlers, and five top 10 400 hurdlers). In the highs, Larry Cowling (14.1), a top 10 man as a freshman, is joined by Derek Robinson (13.7) and B.J. Carmichael (14.0). In the longer race, Lloyd Guss became Cal's second fastest ever with a 50.22 electronic time at the World University Games, and Cowling (51.1) and Grimes (51.7) both broke the freshman record and made the top ten. Senior Mark Uribe ran 52.1 in one meet during a redshirt 1979 season, and freshman Jim Brovelli also sat out last year.

Relays: Holden Smith and Larry Cowling were the only two Bears who ran on every Cal sprint relay in 1979, as the probable best combo (with Farmer and Rachal) ran just two races together. Options are more numerous this year, with Robinson, Eddings, returnee Mathis, and possibly Carmichael, Thornton, or Kelly also under consideration.

On the longer relay, Mike White has run under 46 seconds, and Cowling, Guss, Eddings, Kelly, and jumper Paul Bates have run under 47 seconds.

High Jump: Promises to be one of the Bears' most improved events, with freshmen Tim Poltl (7-3), Mike Nelson (7-1), and Jeff Stuart (6-8) joining returnees Steen (6-9) and Peter Imperial (6-8½).

Pole Vault: A question mark as the season opens. Kevin Stevenson (16-0) sat out 1979, and is joined by squaddies Tom Philbert and Paul Roache, and Steen, all over 15 feet.

Long Jump: Depth promises to be much better than last season. Although a 1978 football knee injury makes Eddings a somewhat questionable entity, JC transfer Paul Bates (25-3) and hurdler Robinson (25-0½) give Cal three 25-footers. Steen reached 24-4½ in a decathlon last year, a life best.

Triple Jump: Record-holder Michael Marlow placed fourth in the NCAA's last year as a senior, but Bates comes in with excellent credentials as the state JC champion and a best of 52-4½. Beyond him, however, it's wide open.

Shot Put: David Porath collected the freshman record and moved into fourth place on Cal's all-time list (58-8). He's just over a foot shy of Dave Maggard's 1962 school record. JC transfer Mike Self (53-5) redshirted in 1979, and if a sore shoulder permits, footballer Pat Graham (54-1) has displayed some ability with the 16-pound ball. Soph Bruce Parker is close to breaking into Cal's Top 10.

Discus: Porath is also Cal's fourth best all-time here (183-0), and figures to progress up this list as well. Behind him, probably, is 1979 redshirt Tony Hill.

Javelin: One of Steen's better decathlon events is the spear, and his 217-10 life best came during the Stanford dual, a meet in which he also pole vaulted, high jumped, and long jumped. Senior Doug Cooper (218-7) hopes that his throwing elbow permits him to return to the form he displayed in 1977.

Decathlon: Steen, still just a junior, figures to gain consistency on the 10-event circuit as he gains improved strength and adds a little body weight. Top events are jumps and javelin, while the weights have been his rough spots.

PROFILES

LARRY COWLING



Sophomore, Sacramento
Hurdles

One of Cal's fine freshman crop in 1979, Cowling took two seconds off the school freshman mark with a 51.31 at the Brooks meet (hand-timed 51.0). Enjoyed a solid season, running five races under 52 seconds in his first full season with the collegiate hurdles. Finished 7th in the Pac-10 after a then-PR 51.50 in the heats. 110 PR came against UCLA; didn't run the highs at the Pac-10s, because of duty on both relays.

Ran the second leg of Cal's 400 relay, and had a best leg of 46.6 on the 4 x 400 relay. Prep bests were 13.7, 36.6, and 53.78 at Sacramento HS, where he was team MVP and a four-year letterman under Tommy Allen. Was the 1978 state meet 330H runnerup.

DOUG COOPER



Senior, Portland, OR
Javelin
218-7

Bothered the last two seasons by tendonitis in his throwing elbow, appears to have regained some of the form that enabled him to score at the Pac-10 meet as a freshman. Placed sixth in the 1977 conference meet, but managed only 200-3 in 1978 and 181-0 last season, when he threw in just three meets. Was a 199-10 prep thrower at Jesuit HS in Portland, where he lettered three years in both football and track and field. Fine arts major.

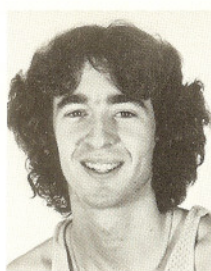
FLOYD EDDINGS

School record holder in the long jump returns to track activity this season, but may be limited to the sprints. Is coming off a knee injury midway through the 1978 football season which caused him to miss last track season and also the 1979 grid year. Displayed some of his raw potential during his freshman year, when he erased Arnold Nutting's 1937 school LJ record with a 25-6½ at the West Coast Relays. He also placed sixth in the Pac-10, but had long jumped only since mid-season. Clocked 10.6 in the 100, and 46.8 leading off the 4 x 400 relay. In two football seasons, has caught 30 passes for 553 yards and 7 TDs. Won Alabama state prep decathlon as a soph. Attended Ganesha HS in Pomona.

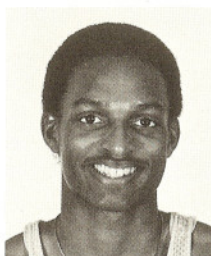
FELIX ELIEFF

PETER GRIMES

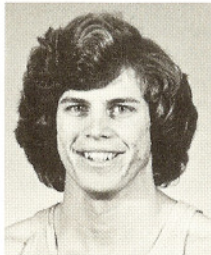

Clocked 51.80 at the Brooks meet. Also saw early season action in the 110 hurdles, as well as one 1:54.4

LLOYD GUSS

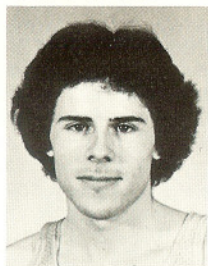

After running mostly flat 400s as a freshman, concentrated on the hurdles last season, dropping 1.7 seconds off his PR. Physically strong, he turned in a highly consistent season, with his slowest time of the year a 52.8, six college races under 52 seconds, and three more in post season. Picked up PRs in back-to-back weekends vs. USC and UCLA (both behind teammates), got another in a third-place run at the Pac-10s, and then became Cal's second-fastest 400 hurdler at the University Games in Mexico City during the summer. He also knocked a second off his flat 400 best, with a 46.81 at the Western Canada Games. Has a relay best of 46.4 and also has run 1:52 in the 800. Attended West Vancouver HS.

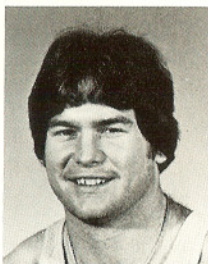

Made the Pac-10 standard with a PR at an SPAAU meet, then lowered that another 0.5 seconds in the Pac-10 finals, finishing seventh. Could see action in the 800, where he has run in the 1:52-53 range. Came to Cal as a 4:09.4

DAVID PORATH**Weights****Sophomore, Merced****183-0, 58-8**

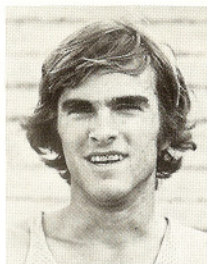

The previous week, had run 47.6 and 21.25, both career bests, against USC. Did not run again until Stanford meet, and did run the 200 and short relay at the Pac-10s. Came to Cal from San Jose CC, after attending Yerba Buena HS (San Jose). As a prep, played football

and ran track, earning Outstanding Back in 1972 and '74, track MVP honors in 1973, '75, and '76. Biology major.

HAL SCHULZ**Junior, San Anselmo****Distance****14:15.8, 9:01.3 SC**

Sat out the 1979 season. Ranks fourth all-time at Cal in the 5,000, fifth in the steeplechase. Won five of seven dual meet 5000s in 1978, but also has strength for steeple. Career barrier best came at the 1977 Pac-8 meet, when he finished seventh. Did a lot of road racing last season, and also ran in world junior cross-country championships in March 1977. Attended Redwood HS in Marin county, running 13:52 for three miles.

HOLDEN SMITH**Senior, Aptos****Sprints****10.5, 21.3, 47.7**

Ran the 400 primarily in 1979, but could appear in the 100 and 200 more this season. Took seconds against UCLA and Stanford (a career PR), as well as a third against SJS in the one-lap race, also scored in the 200 against the Bruins. Recorded 47.2 relay split, also a PR, at the NCAAs. Led off the 1977 (5th NCAA) and 1978 400 relay for Cal, but last season ran first, third, or anchor, depending on the lineup.

Earned NCAA points with a fifth (7456) in June. Pac-10 performance was the more remarkable due to back pains which limited dual meet action. Still, did

take second against USC in both pole vault and triple jump, and had a busy day at Stanford—tying for first in high jump and pole vault, taking second in the long jump and javelin (a career PR). During the summer, competed in the Pan-American Games, but withdrew after pole vault. Won the 1977 Canada Summer Games decathlon, and helped Burnaby Central HS to the British Columbia provincial championship with wins in the high, long, and triple jumps, and pole vault.

2. AUTOMATIC-HAND CONVERSION (Suffix e)

In races up to 400 meters, automatic times will generally be slower than hand times. The standard conversions are: 100m, 110m, 200m: 0.24 seconds; 400m, 0.14 seconds. Thus, to figure a hand-timed equivalent from automatic, subtract the appropriate figure.

NOTE:For international and national records, only times recorded with fully automatic timing will be accepted in events up to 400 meters. Above that distance, records will be recorded in 1/10 second, with auto-timed marks rounded to the next higher 1/10.

And, in England, he became Cal's second-ever sub-four minute miler, clocking 3:59.5 at Gateshead. Also in Europe, he added a PR 1:47.3 800 meters to move to sixth all-time at Cal.

And GARY BLUME, who hadn't set any Cal marks previously, made up for lost time with three—he ran 29:57.8 for 10,000 meters at the Stanford Relays; 8:36.7 in a fifth-place finish in his steeplechase head at the NCAAs, reportedly the fastest non-qualifying time ever at that event; and then capped his season with a 14:06.6 summer run in Los Gatos to take the remaining school distance record.

EDWARDS STADIUM

Long considered the finest track facility in the world, Edwards Stadium (seating 22,000) received a face lift in 1977 with the installation of a Tartan surface not only on the oval but on all the infield runways as well.

The track oval was also changed to a metric distance, changing from 440 yards to the more contemporary 400 meters.

Edwards was originally finished in 1932 and at the time it was the only, "pure track" stadium in the world. The stadium has been the site of seven NCAA Championship meets, one National AAU Championship, and All-American Invitational in 1966, the 1971 and 1978 US vs. USSR meet, and six Kennedy Games.

The stadium is named after Col. George C. Edwards, as is the field adjoining it to the east.

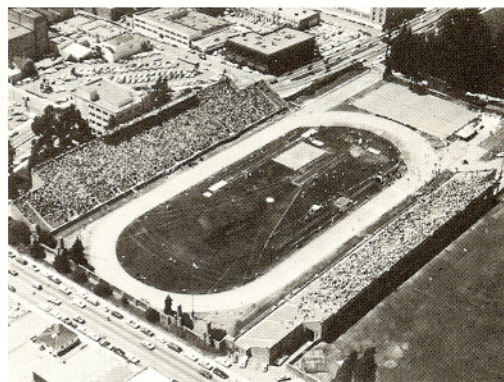
In 1957 the oval itself was dedicated in the name of Walter Christie, California's first track coach, 1900-32, and in the early 60's "friends of California track," raised funds to build the Walter Christie bench which stands just outside the running track on the west side of the field.

With funds that remained after the bench was built, the electric clock that stands atop the scoreboard to the north was purchased.

Prior to 1977, the track was last redone in 1965 with Fresno clay and cinders. The site of 11 world records, 16 American records, and at least 18 collegiate records, Edwards Stadium, with the addition of its synthetic surface, became once again one of the finest track facilities in the world.

CALIFORNIA

The Berkeley campus is surrounded by wooded, rolling hills and by business and residential districts of the town of Berkeley (population 112,000). Despite its growth, the campus retains much natural beauty, with verdant glens, spacious plazas, and picturesque Stawberry Creek running through the length of the campus. The Berkeley hills afford a panoramic view of much of the San Francisco Bay Area, a nine-county region widely acclaimed for its panoramic vistas and cultural activities.

One is impressed by the vitality of the campus. Students advocating social change and political activism at Sproul Plaza rallies are, of course, part of the story. But there are a host of other features—public lectures and concerts; campus-sponsored forums and seminars; clubs and workshops; dramatic presentations; international festivals; art, photographic, design, architectural, anthropological, and archaeological exhibits and displays; and dozens of bookstores within one square mile—all of these make Berkeley one of the most intellectually stimulating communities in the country.

There are more than one hundred academic departments and interdepartmental groups, most offering instruction at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. The libraries on campus combined have a collection of more than 5,000,000 volumes. And the faculty of the University is internationally noted for its distinguished academic achievements.

Ten members of the faculty have been awarded Nobel Prizes—81 are members of the National Academy of Sciences—36 are members of the National Academy of Engineering—and for 15 of the past 16 years, Berkeley has won more of the prestigious Guggenheim Fellowships than any other university in the country.

The high quality of the University's programs was reaffirmed by the American Council of Education in its most recent evaluation of graduate schools in the United States. The ACE

ranked Berkeley as the top graduate school in the country. Twenty-six of the thirty-five graduate departments were ranked as the first, second, or third best in the nation. Eight departments were top-ranked.

The promise of a University of California is contained in the State's constitution, drafted in Monterey in the gold rush year of 1849, although it was not until March 23, 1868, that the University of California was signed by Governor Henry Haight. The University's initial site was the Oakland campus of the College of California, which a year previously had offered its buildings and land to the state on condition that "a complete University" be established for the teaching of the humanities, agriculture, mining, and mechanics. The University moved to its first permanent campus, Berkeley, in 1873.
