





It was a repeat of the North Coast Section meet. Junior Jessica Spies (Livermore, NC), who trains with the San Jose Cindergals in Saratoga, blasted the first lap in 59.3 and hung on for second with a 68.0. Donna Curtis (Culver City, S) ran a much more evenly paced race of 62.1 and 63.6 and passed Spies in the stretch. Last year's disqualified champion junior Rennie Durand (Laguna Beach, S) placed third. Three sophomores—Michelle Lowe (Manual Arts, LA), Trescia Palmer (Westchester, LA), and Monica Montanez (San Joaquin Memorial, C)—made the finals. Junior Maria King (Milpitas, CC), who was chosen to finish third, finished seventh in 2:11.54!

MEN'S 800

Pete Richardson (Berkeley) set a new national record of 1:47.31. The old record of 1:48.20 was set by Jeff West (Crenshaw, LA) at the US-USSR Jr. Meet in Bakersfield on June 30, 1979. Dale Scott (El Cerrito) ran 880 yards in 1:48.5 (1:47.9 converted to 800 meters) to finish second to Mark Winzenried at the Kennedy Games in Berkeley on June 10, 1972. The old State Meet record was 1:48.8 (880 yards) by Richard Joyce (Sierra) in 1965. Richardson ran an even pace of 53.6 and 53.7. Eddie Davis (Compton), who had the best time entering the competition, faded to third. Seventh place was 1:51.54! Johnny Langerston (Berkeley), who wanted to beat his teammate, ran the 400 in 52.92. This spread out the field and gave Richardson plenty of running room as no boxes of runners could develop.



CCS track fans were treated to two tingling mile runs in the Region III meet and again at the Section championships. Willow Glen's Jeff Purrington out-kicked Paul Cox of Los Gatos and Santa Teresa's Joe Rubio to win at the section meet in 14.14.3 with the other two second and third at 14.14.7.

"I think all three of those have a shot to run their best times ever," says Los Gatos coach Willie Har-

matz. "The pace at the section meet was too slow for a good time. None of those three are pace setters, they're kickers. There will be some really good milers at the state meet, so they'll get that fast pace."

Marden of Mission San Jose could be on the verge of a 3,200 title. He ran second last year and, although Jon Butler of Edison in Huntington Beach is ranked ahead of Marden, Jay has beaten him in seven of seven outings. Marden and Butler went 1-2 in last fall's national cross country final in San Diego.

"He's in excellent physical condition," said MSJ coach Jack Marden of his son, a senior who missed much of the season because of mononucleosis. "I think his overall strength may make the difference. He bench presses 250."

Another of this section's possibilities to place in the state meet is Buchser's Margaret Demorest in the girls 300 hurdles. It's a new event at the state meet this year, but Demorest ran it last year in AAU competition.

She won the CCS event, and her best time this year is 43.91 (converted from 330 yards). She also finished second in the CCS 100 low hurdles to Soquel's Kim Horn. Demorest faces staunch competition from national recordholder Gayle Kellon of Walnut (42.16c), Berkeley's Sherifa Sanders, who leads the state in the lows, and Locke's Cynthia Cooper, "the Wizard" who proved to be the basketball playing whiz that Lynbrook couldn't handle in the state final in March.

"I was hoping to do a better time in the CCS," says Demorest, who was hindered by a severe heel bruise late in the season and hardshipped through the Santa Clara Valley League meet to Region II. "It has cleared up a lot, so now it just aches.

"I've been thinking about it (the state meet) a lot. I want to so it doesn't surprise me. I want to think about what I have to do, how I have to run so I don't stutter before a hurdle. I'll need something around 43.44 to get to the finals. I think I can compete with those girls. No one is that far ahead of me."

Buchser teammate Marc Anderson is ranked third in the state in the pole vault at 15-4. He won at the CCS with 15-2 and shouldn't be too shaken by his first state meet because, as a group, this section's vaulters are the best in California.

"He's gone 15-6 in practice and he's been consistent over 15-0," says coach Chuck Kappen. "There's a guy from Fresno (Doug Fraley, Clovis) who has gone 15-6, but he hasn't been consistent. And Marc seems to repond to pressure."

Another who figures to place in a field event is triple jumper Ken Taylor of Yerba Buena. The 6-foot-1 senior and basketball standout had a winning 50-0¼ effort at the section meet, bettering his previous section best of 48-7 and missing the CCS all-time best mark by a half-inch. Other jumps in his CCS series were 49-0 and 49-7.

Seanez returns

The toughest hurdle

Track and field lends itself to fraternizing. It's the nature of the sport — all that spare time between events — just as it's the nature of those involved in track to keep abreast of what's being done around the rest of the country.

Certainly the rest of the country keeps tabs on California, where the state meet is the finest high school event of the year. And certainly track and field disciples around the country are wondering this week where the heck Gilroy, Calif., is.

It's not the garlic that has their senses perked; it's graceful, fluid 300-meter low hurdler Ron Seanez. He takes the Central Coast Section's brightest chance for a championship to the Friday-Saturday state meet at Cerritos College in Norwalk.

"The last time I lost was at the state meet last year," says Seanez, a Gilroy senior. "So I'm undefeated this year. Hopefully it's going to stay that way."

Seanez ran a lifetime best of 36.25 (converted from 330 yards) at last Friday's CCS championship meet at San Jose City College. He shares the national lead with Chris Crisman of Riverside Poly, so if they survive Friday's trials as anticipated, they will be going head to head Saturday evening.

This is the 63rd boys meet and the eighth girls meet, and California is one of the few states that holds them simultaneously. All events will be metric. Trials are Friday afternoon with twilight finals Saturday. Defending champions in seven events return and with 13 national bests held by entrants, additional national records and bests are probable.

The nine sections are allotted different numbers of qualifiers based on section size, and each state event includes 27 entrants. The fallibility of that system showed itself once again last week when Mission San Francisco's Ken Fraizer, the nation's leading long jumper, finished second in the San Francisco-Oakland

Section meet and thus failed to qualify because his section only sends its winners.

The CCS will ship its top three finishers in each event to Norwalk and that group could place in as many as 20 events. The Central Coast had three champions in 1979 — Cubberley's Bill Green in the 100 and 440 yards and Camden's Ann Regan in the 880. Last year, the section's best finishes were second places, by Maria King, then of Ayer, in the 800, Menlo-Atherton's Greg Ellis in the pole vault and Silver Creek's surprising 400 relay team. Additionally, Mission San Jose's Jay Marden (North Coast Section) was second in the 3,200.

This weekend, the best showing by the CCS will again likely be made in the middle distance events, but if there is a championship to be won, it probably will be Seanez who grabs it. He qualified first from the CCS in both the 300 and the 110 highs (14.73), and he already has experienced the somewhat overwhelming atmosphere of the state meet. He qualified for the 300 hurdles last year in Berkeley, but failed to reach the finals.

"I was nervous last year, so this year I'm just trying to think of it as another track meet," says Seanez. "I'm going to go for a qualifying time in the trials because I want a good lane for the final — 3, 4 or 5. I'll use the highs as kind of a warm-up to the lows."

"The last 150 meters is the strongest part of my race. My start hasn't been that good. I'm always third or fourth over the first hurdle and then I make it up on the curve. I'll be mainly working on my start this week."

As a freshman, Seanez was playing football and basketball and considering baseball until Gilroy track coach Avis Kelley convinced him to run. Seanez quarterbacked the Mustangs' football squad last fall, but gave up basketball to concentrate on the hurdles. Now, Seanez is being courted by college coaches — at the rate of two phone calls a night.

"They put a lot of pressure on you. They all say their program is right for you," says Seanez, who will play for the South in the North-South All-Star football game in August. "I want to go somewhere in California and I want them to have a good computer science program because track isn't an all-life thing."



Sprints — Junior Kevin Willhite is in fine shape for possible double, with Robinson (unbeaten in 100) not back up to full power after pulling groin in early May. Robinson was second in last year's 100 and won 200. 400 almost wide open, with soph David Timmons among favorites. Double CCS champ Reggie Grimes (Hill) capable of placing in both 100 and 200.

Middle distances — 800 unbeaten Eddie Davis and Pete Richardson, who was second last year, square off for first time this year in good matchup. CCS king Oran Woods (Milpitas) keeps improving and could place. 1600 has Gary Gonzales (3:51.36 for 1500) and Barasa Thomas, third in national cross country last year, leading a tight field. Paul Cox figured to place, but so could CCS champ Jeff Purrrington (Willow Glen) and Brian Dulin (Leigh). National cross country champ Jay Marden is 7-0 over Jon Butler, second in cross country, and seems in fine form after long illness in March and April. They'll meet in the 3200, where they went 2-3 last year, but the two would also stage a good 1600 with Butler at 4:06.75 and Marden at 4:10.4. CCS champ Mike McCollum and Jesse Torres figure to be in leaders' taut wake.

Hurdles — Excellent lows field with first three almost even. Ron Seanez was pushed to his 36.25c, and Chris Crisman was pushed to his 36.25 by James Knowles (36.31). Highs predicted close, with Ron McCoy (at 13.93, INTO the wind) leading the way.

Relays — 1600 is awesome. Berkeley went 3:11.7 without much competition and Kenny Robinson (46.7); their team has three members back from last year's 3:10.42 unit and has been winning often and by comfortable margins in 3:14 range. Anchor leg should not be missed, and Centennial's national record of 3:10.37 could fall. Berkeley's lone loss (without Robinson) in 400 is to Muir in tough Arcadia Invitational.

Whaler ran the 3,200 in 9:17.4, finishing in 19th place in the rugged field. John Butler of Edison High in Fresno won the event with a time of 8:46.78. Harold Kuphaldt of Bella Vista High School in Sacramento, to whom Whaler finished second in the Sac-Joaquin section meet, placed fifth in 8:54.79.

Also competing in the 3,200 run was Del Oro's Stacy McAfee. Stacy's time of 11:03.06 was good for 14th in the girls' 3,200, and 2½ seconds off her personal best time, established in the section meet.

The girls' 3,200 was won by Vickie Cook of Alemany High of Encino, in a state meet record time of 10:12.31. The time broke Cook's previous standard of 10:14.78, set in the 1980 meet.

McAfee was one of only two freshmen to compete in the event.

Chula Vista's Jose Vega finished 23rd in the boys 3200 meters. The Spartan junior ran a creditable race for the first mile staying up in the middle of the pack. In the second mile, Vega faded back.

Smallwood places 10th

NORWALK — Shawn Smallwood of Corcoran and Mike Macliz of Avenal didn't fare as well as they had hoped over the weekend at the 63rd running of the California state high school track meet held at Cerritos College.

Despite running a lifetime best of 9:01.2 in the 3200 meters, Smallwood still only finished 10th in what his coach, Jerry McKinzie, called a very fast field.

Although not placing, Smallwood did manage to lower his top previous time by eight seconds. Corcoran cross country coach Jess Arriaga, who accompanied the Panther senior, said Smallwood could have clocked under the nine-minute mark had he been able to get into the first lane.

John Butler, who won the event in 8:46.78, was out front along with Jay Marden while Smallwood was in the pack that followed.

"He was in lane two or three throughout the race," Arriaga said. "Each time to go around a curb and you're not in the first lane, you lose as much as three-quarters of a second. I kept telling him to get in the first lane, but he couldn't. It became a dogfight between the runners. He lost about four seconds because of that."

The performance by Macliz could have been summed up in one word, according to Avenal coach Bill Hatcher: "Nerves."

Macliz, who had not lost a meet until the Valley finals, where he finished third, was eliminated from the competition when he failed to clear the opening height of 6-foot-2.

In the jumps he did take, Macliz attained good height but kept dragging his trail leg, according to Hatcher.

"He was nervous and he couldn't correct that," Hatcher said.

800 meters, with Scott Cox of Long Beach Wilson second (1:49.30) and Eddie Davis of Compton third (1:50.33). Richardson's time surpassed the national mark of 1:48.8, set by Richard Joyce of Sierra in 1965.

—Berkeley's 1,600 relay team of Ulysee Walker (48.3), Richardson (46.7), Walter Murray (47.1) and Kenny Robinson (46.3) ran 3:08.94 to break Centennial's national record of 3:10.37, set last year.

—Berkeley's girls 400-meter relay team of Tanaya King, Sharon Ware, Robyne Johnson and Nedrea Rodgers ran 45.13 to break their own national record of 45.81, set last year.

—Kennedy's girls 1,600 meter relay team of Tina Howard (54.2), Kelley Cook (57.4), Annette Johnson (55.3) and Denean Howard (50.8) ran 3:37.71 to break their own national record of 3:37.98, set last year.

—Berkeley's Murray also set a national record of 35.79 in the 300 low hurdles in Friday's preliminaries.

Berkeley won its second straight boys title, beating Muir, 58-40, becoming the first school to win back-to-back State titles since Long Beach Poly in 1964-65.

Berkeley's girls made up for last year's second place finish to Kennedy by scoring a record 64 points. Kennedy was second with 36. Fullerton, with sophomore Natalie

Kaaiamamia winning the girls discus and shotput, was fifth behind Dorsey and Manual Arts with 30 points.

"We didn't want to go back to Berkeley without both State titles," said Berkeley's Charles Clewis, who helped the Yellowjackets set a State record of 40.86 in the 400 relay. "We might have stayed in L.A. if we hadn't won it."

Richardson and Robinson probably had more to do with winning the title for Berkeley than anyone else.

A Robinson-Style 800

Richardson's 800 meters set the stage for Berkeley's great showing. He ran the first 400 in 54.0 and the second in 53.31, displaying a great kick.

"I ran it James Robinson-style," Richardson said. "He's my idol. I ran it just the way I wanted to. All I've been doing is working on my last 220 for my kick. I'm pretty sure I could have run faster if I was pushed."

But Cox and Davis, who'd pushed each other in the last two weeks, didn't challenge Richardson. Davis, the previous national leader at 1:49.43, seemed sluggish.

"It just wasn't in me today," Davis said. "When I wanted to run, it just wasn't there."

Robinson made up for his second place finish in the 100 last year by running 10.60 to beat junior Kevin Willhite of Cordova High (10.68).

Robinson also ran on both of Berkeley's winning relay teams, turning in a sprint relay split of 9.6.

But Willhite came back to edge Robinson in the 200. Willhite was timed in 20.81, with Robinson, the defending champion in the event, running 21.05.

"I wasn't happy with my start in the 100," Robinson said. "It seemed like I was standing up in the blocks. But it seems that I'm a lot stronger in the 100 than the 200."

Sherifa Sanders and Sharon Ware led Berkeley's girls to the title.

Sanders set a State record of 13.71 in the 100 meter hurdles in Friday's prelims, and ran 13.74 to win the finals. Val Flemmings of Northgate led until she fell going over the ninth hurdle.

"She (Flemmings) probably would have won if she hadn't tripped, but my coach always told me to relax if I was behind and I stayed with it and won," Sanders said. "I feel really bad for her."

Ware successfully defended her 100 meter championship, running 11.66 to beat Denean Howard of Kennedy (11.83). She also ran on both relay teams.

But Howard came back to win the 200, running 23.73. Ware was third (24.17) behind Latanya Dawkins (24.10) of Dorsey.

Junior Polly Plumer of Irvine's University High ran 4:42.43 in the 1,600 to break Cheri Williams' record of 4:44.95 in the 1,600.

Letters to the High School Editor

Dear Keith,

I saw your editorial in the August issue. While I agree with you completely about Frazier, I think your proposals (even if they could be carried out, which I doubt) would ruin the State Meet. What you would end up with would be a meet made up mostly of Southern Section entries. And 27 entries would be silly with maybe 18 of them from the Southern Section. Further, not every section has the facilities for automatic timing, certainly not at meets throughout the season. And if you did have section meets, what would you do if the wind was above the allowable, run and jump against it?

I made up the enclosed set of statistics to measure the "quality" of each State Meet qualifier over the past 7 years. It is very instructive, showing how strong the Southern Section is and the lack of depth in some other sections. I think it's clear that hardly ever will a "Frazier-type situation" arise in any section except for the single-qualifier sections, the Northern and Oak/SF. (In fact, the only other

case I can think of was the year Montgomery and another good shot putter [from Corning] competed in the Northern Section.) But to allow a worthy athlete like Frazier to compete in the State Meet, I would opt for an appeal possibility. The 2nd place finisher (conceivably even the 3rd) in the Northern and Oak/SF meets could appeal for State Meet acceptance to a knowledgeable review board (like Jack Shepard and you). If accepted in a track event, drop the NCS #4, Cent #3, SD #3, etc. qualifier on a rotating basis.

While the current 27 qualifiers certainly aren't the State's best, it only takes a day of heats to get close to the 9 best.

Editor: I don't think my proposals would ruin the State Meet, but rather result in an improvement. The NCAA and Pac-10 meets are not ruined by using qualifying standards. Qualifying standards insure that the best athletes will be allowed to compete no matter where they may hail from. You are concerned that the Southern Section would have too many participants, but it doesn't concern you that they are now grossly under-represented. Sixty percent of the population lives in Southern

California, yet they don't receive their fair share of slots in the State Meet. Automatic timing is now generally available and would become a regular feature of all big meets. Since athletes could attain their qualifying mark anytime during the season, it wouldn't matter if one meet happened to be wind-aided.

If other readers have ideas for improving the State Meet selection process, please write.

Berkeley dominates state prep track meet

NORWALK (AP) — Berkeley High dominated the team competition and five national prep records were established in the 63rd annual California State High School track and field championships at Cerritos College.

Except for Carl Nelson of Oroville's Las Plumas High, prep athletes from the far north state finished well off the torrid pace.

Nelson placed second in the long jump with a leap of 24-2, but was nearly a foot behind the winning leap of 25-1½.

Shasta High's Kathy Dolan placed 27th in the two-mile field at 11:40.5 while Hayfork's Don Merwin put on a strong kick to finish 22nd in the boy's two-mile at 9:22.

Weed's Steve Vontungeln failed to make the finals in the triple jump.

Berkeley won the boy's competition Saturday night for the second straight year with 58 points and the girls prevailed with 64 points. Both

totals are the highest winning totals in state meet history.

In the boy's 800 meters, Pete Richardson of Berkeley smashed the national standard with a sizzling 1:47.31 clocking. The old mark was 1:48.8.

Polly Plummer of University High in Irvine set a national record in the women's 1,600 meters with a time of 4:42.43. The event is rarely contested outside of California. The old mark of 4:42.5 was set by Deanna Coleman of Issaquah High of Washington three years ago.

Among outstanding performers in the boy's competition were: Kenny Robinson of Berkeley in the 100 meters with a 10.60 clocking; junior Kevin Willhite of Rancho Cordova in the 200 with a time of 20.81; John Butler of Edison in the 3,200 meters with a time of 8:46.78; Ken Frazier of Mission San Jose in the triple jump with a leap of 50-10¾, and Anthony Caire of Plus X in Downey with a leap of 7-1 in the high jump.

It's All Berkeley as Records Fall in State Track

They locked the stadium gates and stopped selling tickets five minutes before the first running event at Saturday night's 63rd California High School track and field championships at Cerritos College.

And if you weren't among the standing room only crowd of 14,250, you may have missed the best State meet ever. It also ranks as one of the greatest high school track meets ever.

Five national records were set in the two-day meet—four in Saturday's finals. Nine State records were also broken in the finals.

Berkeley High, perhaps the best high school boys *and* girls track team ever assembled, set three national records in running away with the team titles. It's the first time a school has won the boys and girls team titles in the same year.

—Berkeley's Pete Richardson set a national record of 1:47.31 in the

800 meters, with Scott Cox of Long Beach Wilson second (1:49.30) and Eddie Davis of Compton third (1:50.33). Richardson's time surpassed the national mark of 1:48.8, set by Richard Joyce of Sierra in 1965.

—Berkeley's 1,600 relay team of Ulysee Walker (48.3), Richardson (46.7), Walter Murray (47.1) and Kenny Robinson (46.3) ran 3:08.94 to break Centennial's national record of 3:10.37, set last year.

—Berkeley's girls 400-meter relay team of Tanaya King, Sharon Ware, Robyne Johnson and Nedrea Rodgers ran 45.13 to break their own national record of 45.81, set last year.

—Kennedy's girls 1,600 meter relay team of Tina Howard (54.2), Kelley Cook (57.4), Annette Johnson (55.3) and Denean Howard (50.8) ran 3:37.71 to break their own national record of 3:37.98, set last year.

—Berkeley's Murray also set a national record of 35.79 in the 300 low hurdles in Friday's preliminaries.

Berkeley won its second straight boys title, beating Muir, 58-40, becoming the first school to win back-to-back State titles since Long Beach Poly in 1964-65.

Berkeley's girls made up for last year's second place finish to Kennedy by scoring a record 64 points. Kennedy was second with 36. Fullerton, with sophomore Natalie

Kaaiamamia winning the girls discus and shotput, was fifth behind Dorsey and Manual Arts with 30 points.

"We didn't want to go back to Berkeley without both State titles," said Berkeley's Charles Clewis, who helped the Yellowjackets set a State record of 40.86 in the 400 relay. "We might have stayed in L.A. if we hadn't won it."

Richardson and Robinson probably had more to do with winning the title for Berkeley than anyone else.

A Robinson-Style 800

Richardson's 800 meters set the stage for Berkeley's great showing.

He ran the first 400 in 54.0 and the second in 53.31, displaying a great kick.

"I ran it James Robinson-style," Richardson said. "He's my idol. I ran it just the way I wanted to. All I've been doing is working on my last 220 for my kick. I'm pretty sure I could have run faster if I was pushed."

But Cox and Davis, who'd pushed each other in the last two weeks, didn't challenge Richardson. Davis, the previous national leader at 1:49.43, seemed sluggish.

"It just wasn't in me today," Davis said. "When I wanted to run, it just wasn't there."

Robinson made up for his second place finish in the 100 last year by running 10.60 to beat junior Kevin Willhite of Cordova High (10.68).

Robinson also ran on both of Berkeley's winning relay teams, turning in a sprint relay split of 9.6.

But Willhite came back to edge Robinson in the 200. Willhite was timed in 20.81, with Robinson, the defending champion in the event, running 21.05.

"I wasn't happy with my start in the 100," Robinson said. "It seemed like I was standing up in the blocks. But it seems that I'm a lot stronger in the 100 than the 200."

Sherifa Sanders and Sharon Ware led Berkeley's girls to the title.


Sanders set a State record of 13.71 in the 100 meter hurdles in Friday's prelims, and ran 13.74 to win the finals. Val Flemmings of Northgate led until she fell going over the ninth hurdle.

"She (Flemmings) probably would have won if she hadn't tripped, but my coach always told me to relax if I was behind and I stayed with it and won," Sanders said. "I feel really bad for her."

Ware successfully defended her 100 meter championship, running 11.66 to beat Denean Howard of Kennedy (11.83). She also ran on both relay teams.

But Howard came back to win the 200, running 23.73. Ware was third (24.17) behind Latanya Dawkins (24.10) of Dorsey.

Junior Polly Plumer of Irvine's University High ran 4:42.43 in the 1,600 to break Cheri Williams' record of 4:44.95 in the 1,600.

A Record Night at State Meet — and It's Only Qualifying

Berkeley's Murray Sets National Hurdles Mark

If Friday's preliminaries were any indication, today's 63rd California high school track and field championships at Cerritos College could be one of the best State meets ever—if the wind dies down.

One national and three State records were set in qualifying, but the wind robbed Berkeley sprinter Kenny Robinson of a State record in the 100-meter dash, and Muir's Ed Tave of the co-national lead in the long jump.

Walter Murray of Berkeley ran 35.79 in his heat of the 300-meter low hurdles to break the national hand-timed record of 35.6, set by Darrin Hill of Middletown, Ohio, in 1978.

"I didn't even know that I'd broken the national record until someone came over and told me 10 minutes after the race," Murray said. "It just didn't seem that fast. I was just going out to qualify, but the guy in Lane 5 (James Knowles of Blair, 36.09) was really pushing me and I haven't been pushed this year."

Frazier Sets Triple Jump Record

Ken Frazier of San Francisco's Mission High went 52-4¾ in the triple jump to break Dokie Williams' State record of 51-0¼, set in 1977. The national record is 52-6¼ set by David Tucker of Fresno's San Joaquin Memorial High in 1970. Frazier is the national leader in the long jump at 25-3 but failed to qualify in the event for the State meet. He said he was trying to make up for it by winning the triple jump.

Dorsey's 400-meter relay team of Kirk Williams, Gerald Boles, Fred Williams and Kelvin Jackson ran 40.92 in their heat to break the State record of 41.0 set by San Francisco Wilson in 1973. Jackson outkicked Berkeley anchor man Murray down the stretch to give Dorsey the upset win. Jackson, the City sprint champ, also won his 100-meter heat in a wind-aided 10.45.

Sherifa Sanders of Berkeley ran 13.71 in the girls 110-meter low hurdles, the first running event of the meet, to break the State record of 13.83, set by Kris Costello of Lynbrook in 1978.

Howard Hawkins' year-old State 100-meter record of 10.55 was surpassed by Robinson, who ran a 10.24 to win his heat. But the wind reading was 3.02 meters per second—the limit is 2.0 m.p.s.

Junior Kevin Willhite of Cordova High in Rancho Cordova, the national leader at 200 meters, ran 20.81 in beating Robinson (21.03) in a 200 heat. It's the fastest 200 time in the nation this year, surpassing Willhite's week-old mark of 21.01. The State record is 20.7, set by Mel Gray of Montgomery High in Santa Rose in 1967. Willhite also won his 100-meter heat in a wind-aided 10.50.

Motivated by Robinson

"I didn't plan to go all out today because it's just the qualifying," Willhite said. "But then I looked at the heat sheet and saw that I was in the same heat with Robinson. Running against Robinson psyched me up. My chances are better in the 200 than the 100 because I'm a lot stronger in the longer race."

Robinson, the defending State champ at 200 meters, accelerated off the turn but couldn't catch Willhite.

"I was going to go after him but I didn't run it all the way through," Robinson said. "Tomorrow, I'll run all the way through."

Robinson and Murray are the keys to Berkeley's bid to defend its state boys track title. They'll run four events apiece in today's finals.

Tave, the key man in Muir's bid to unseat Berkeley, got off a wind-aided long jump of 25-3, just 1½ inches off the State record, set by Muir's Jerry Proctor in 1967. It would have made him the co-national leader with Frazier if it hadn't been wind-aided.

Berkeley qualified in eight events, with Muir qualifying in seven.

Berkeley girls qualified in 11 events, while rival Kennedy of Granada Hills qualified in five.

The Howard Sisters of Kennedy, Denean and Tina, who along with sister Sherri turned the State meet into a family affair last year by setting a national record in the 400 and 1,600 relay, led the Golden Cougars again.

Denean had the fastest time in the 200 (23.74). Sherri ran 23.19 last year to set the national record. Denean ran 11.64 in the 100, the day's second best time behind Berkeley's Sharon Ware (11.50). Ware is the defending champion in the event.

Kennedy's 400-meter relay team of Kim Grant, Tina Howard, Annette Johnson and Denean Howard ran 46.70. Kennedy set the national record of 45.18 last year.

Eddie Davis of Compton had the day's best time in the 800 (1:52.26), with Scott Cox of Long Beach Wilson qualifying in 1:52.50 and Berkeley's Pete Richardson running 1:52.89 . . .
