## DR. GAIL FULLERTON

### President



Gail Fullerton, Ph.D., was appointed President of San Jose State University in September, 1978. Dr. Fullerton was Executive Vice President of San Jose State prior to that date.

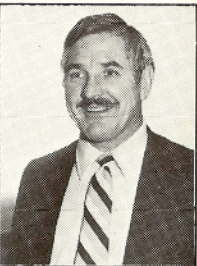
A sociologist, Dr. Fullerton has been a member of the Department of Sociology at San Jose State University since 1963, and served briefly as chair of that department before her appointment as Dean of Graduate Studies and Research in 1972. She presently holds the rank of Professor of Sociology. Her publications include two books, one of these a text published in 1972, with a second edition published in 1977.

She is currently a member of the Executive Committee of the Western College Association, a national panelist for the American Council on Education, a member of the International Sociological Association, the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Board of the San Jose Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Board of the San Jose Symphony, a member of the Board of Directors of the Greater San Jose YWCA, and a member of the Board of Directors of the Santa Clara County Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Inc.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska, Dr. Fullerton holds the Ph.D. in sociology from the University of Oregon.

## DAVE ADAMS

### Athletic Director



Appointed in December 1979, Dave Adams is completing his second full academic year as the San Jose State men's athletic director. A former assistant athletic director for men's athletics at the University of Pittsburgh for two years prior to his appointment, he joined the Spartans' athletic staff in February 1980.

Adams got his start in coaching as the head wrestling and assistant football coach at Bolling Springs (PA) High School in 1958. He returned to Penn State in 1959 as an assistant wrestling coach.

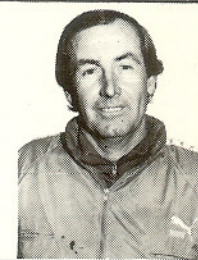
After serving five years at Penn State, he moved to Navy as an assistant baseball and head wrestling coach. In three seasons at the Naval Academy, his Plebe wrestling teams compiled a 21-1 record, including two undefeated seasons.

In 1967, Adams began a 12-year stint as the head wrestling coach at the University of Pittsburgh. Producing five Eastern Wrestling League and Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association champions, Adams' squads compiled a 90-69-2 record. His 1978 team established a school record for season victories with 13 wins.

Named the 1967 "Rookie Coach-of-the-Year" by the Amateur Wrestling News, Adams served on the executive committee of the NCAA Wrestling Coaches Association and is a past president of the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Coaches Association. Instrumental in the formation of the Eastern Wrestling League, the top Eastern collegiate wrestling league, Adams is currently secretary-editor of the NCAA Wrestling Rules Committee.

## ERNIE BULLARD

### Head Coach



Ernie Bullard begins his twelfth season at the helm of one of America's top collegiate track and field powers, San Jose State University.

A former head coach at Orange Coast Community College, Bullard came to San Jose State in 1968 from Mesa Community College in Mesa, AZ. His last Mesa JC team won the National Junior College Association (NJCAA) crown. In addition, he also coached several NJCAA individual champions, American JC record holders, and Olympic competitors.

Since coming to San Jose State, Bullard has guided his charges to nine NCAA championship meets, including a fourth place finish in 1975. His teams have won six Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) titles and placed second four other times.

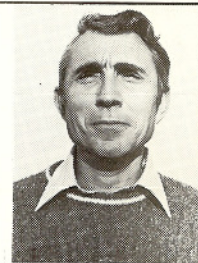
A dual meet power during his tenure, the Spartans have been consistently ranked in the top ten by *TRACK AND FIELD NEWS*. Three of his teams have compiled perfect dual meet record seasons as part of his 70-14 overall dual meet slate.

One of the top pole vault coaches in the world, Bullard graduated from the University of Southern California in 1959. An outstanding collegiate pole vaulter, he once placed fourth in the NCAA championships.

The 1975 U.S. Junior Olympic team coach earned his master's degree from Arizona State University in 1961. Internationally respected, he was also selected to the Olympic development staff in 1978.

## MARSHALL CLARK

### Distance Coach



Marshall Clark is completing his second year at San Jose State as the head cross country and distance coach for the Spartans' track and field program.

One of the finest distance coaches in the nation, Clark joined the Spartan coaching staff in July, 1980 after a two year stint at the University of Montana. He served as the cross country coach for one season, the head track coach for two campaigns, and the school's assistant athletic director.

The 48-year-old Clark established his Bay Area roots in 1968 when he was named coach of the Stanford University cross country team. During his ten year tenure, he led the Cardinals to a second place finish at the 1968 NCAA cross country championships. Among the many Stanford athletes he coached were Olympians Don Kardong and Duncan Macdonald.

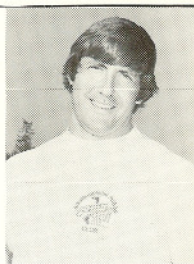
Selected to coach the 1972 United States AAU track team in Moscow, Russia, Clark was a successful high school coach at Los Altos and Seaside High Schools. In ten years, he won six conference championships and one southern section California Interscholastic Federation title.

A 1957 graduate of the University of Southern California, he was a three year letterman in track and cross country for the Trojans.



## JOHN POWELL

### Weight Coach



One of the top discus throwers in the world over the past ten years, John Powell returns to coach the weight men for the fourth year.

The former world record holder in the discus at 226-8 set in Long Beach, CA on May 4, 1975, John is a two-time Olympian. He finished fourth at Munich in 1972, and picked up a bronze medal in 1976 at Montreal.

A 1969 graduate of San Jose State with a degree in political science and a minor in psychology, John finished fourth in the 1969 NCAA Championships. He was the AAU Champion in 1974 and 1975.

The native San Franciscan has co-authored two books on the discus: "The Linear Approach to the Discus" and "Discus: Wilkins vs. Powell, A Comparative Study," with SJSU Head Coach Ernie Bullard. Single, the 33 year-old Powell lives in Cupertino, CA.

## BOB POYNTER

### Sprint Coach



In his second year with the Spartan coaching staff, Bob Poynter is a former San Jose State track great. He was the NCAA runner-up in the 100 and 220 yard dashes in 1959. He ranks second on the Spartan all-time list in the 200 meters, and ran on the 1959 400 meter relay team which is also second all-time.

Bob attended Pasadena High School where he was state champion in the 220 in both his junior and senior years.

He earned his bachelor's degree in Physical Education from San Jose State in 1965. From 1969 through 1974 he coached at Silver Creek High School in San Jose where he first coached Millard Hampton. While they were both at San Jose City College, Millard made the 1976 United States Olympic team, winning a gold medal (400 meter relay) and silver medal (200 meters). Bob coached many fine athletes at SJCC, including Cecil Overstreet and Don Livers who were state champions in the 100 and 200 meters, respectively. Other Poynter products are Willie Jackson (1979 State JC 100 and 200 meter champion), Tim Foster (1980 PCAA 200 meter champion), and new Spartan recruits Dwayne Green and Dwayne Taylor.

Earning his master's degree in Physical Education from Cal Poly—San Luis Obispo, Bob works full time as a counselor at Silver Creek High School. Married for 20 years to wife Gloria, the Poynters live in San Jose with their two children, Effrem, 15, and Adrienne, 7.

## 1982 SEASON OUTLOOK

The defending Pacific Coast Athletic Association champion San Jose State University track team will return to a dual meet season format as the squad seeks to maintain one of great traditions in west coast collegiate track and field ranks. The Spartans open the 1982 outdoor season in Los Angeles in a triangular meet with Pac-10 conference powers UCLA and Arizona. During the year, San Jose State will battle two more Pac-10 foes, California and Oregon State, as well as conference rivals UC-Irvine, Fresno State, and Cal State-Long Beach.

The Spartans will again excel in the sprints and hurdles and display good balance in all track events. Field events will also be much stronger over a year ago.

### SPRINTS

### COACHES' RATING—EXCELLENT

Sprint coach Bob Poynter will have a veteran corps of sprinters that should compete favorably with the top collegiate sprinters in the country during the 1982 season. Last year's sprint nucleus, the 400 meter relay quartet of Cleve Prince, Ken Thomas, Dwayne Green, and Virgil Torrence, an All-American foursome that finished fifth at the 1981 NCAA Championships, is back intact. Thomas, a two-sport All-PCAA and All-American performer, will be after his third conference title in the 100 meters.

Other short sprint competitors shooting to impact this year's club are Tim Foster, a 1981 redshirt who was the 1980 PCAA 200 meter titlist, and sophomore Darryl McCane.

In the 400 meters, Prince, who placed second at the PCAAs, will be joined by sophomore Harry Campbell, fifth in the conference meet in this event, and freshman Paul Jones to power the Spartans.

### RELAYS

San Jose State expects to improve both its sprint relay foursomes. Competition will be keen for the 400 meter relay spots as the Spartans hope to better the 39.91 time at the NCAA Championships. With the addition of intermediate hurdler Bernie Holloway (45.5 in the 400) to the 1600 meter relay group, this Spartan relay team should also lower last year's standard of 3:08.56.

### HURDLES

### COACHES' RATING—EXCELLENT

The Spartans will feature a one-two punch in PCAA champion Will Patterson and Mike Hawthorne, who finished fourth at the conference meet, in the 110 meter high hurdles. Both men hope to crack the 14.00 second barrier this season to give San Jose State additional competitors at the NCAA meet at the end of the year.

Thorvalour Thorsson, the Spartans only intermediate hurdler last year, will receive strong support from California junior college champion Bernie Holloway, who has the potential to be one of the nation's best, and Jerome Bearden, a veteran who redshirted last season.

Mitch Musgrove and three junior college transfers, Reggie Green, Ruddy Herman, and Tim Nash will provide added depth.

## DID YOU KNOW?

San Jose State has had three individual Olympic Gold Medalists. Willie Steele won the long jump in 1948 with a leap of 25 feet, 8 inches. In 1968, Lee Evans won the 400 meters with a time of 43.86. Also that year, Tommie Smith won the 200 meters with a 19.83 clocking.

Evans and Ronnie Ray Smith have won gold medals as members of the 1968 U.S. 1600 and 400 meter relay teams, respectively.
