SCCAL athletes post wins at region meet

SALINAS — Soquel High's Johnny Cleveland long jumped a Northern California-best 23-10½ and Jessica Johnson of Aptos blazed to a 24.9 in the 200 meters to highlight the Region IV Track and Field Championships Saturday at Hartnell College.

Seaside easily ran away with both varsity titles, but Soquel nailed down third place in the boys' division and Aptos nipped North Salinas for second place in the girls' competition.

"I was really happy with both our teams," said Soquel Coach Mark McConnell, whose girls' varsity was fourth in the team standings. "Just the facility and the conditions helped us all to some great times, some school records and a lot of personal bests."

Cleveland was the unofficial boys' varsity high-point athlete with a first in the long jump, seconds in both the 200 meters and triple jump and a leg on the Knights' third-place 400 relay.

Jeff Thorbs of San Lorenzo Valley won both the 200 (in a Central Coast Section season-best 21.7) and the 400 (a school record 48.3) and might possibly have added a third victory in the 100 if he had not arrived late due to heavy traffic. Although Thorbs was in attendance at the track in time for the start, he did not have the extra time necessary to warm up and mentally prepare for the event and decided against competing.

Another incident at the meet concerning an SLV runner occurred when distance star Mike Rome unexplainedly stepped off the track 100 yards away from the final lap of the two mile while in first place.

"He was right there ready to win it," said Cougar Coach Marty Kruger, adding that Rome has been suffering from the flu and fever for the past few days which could perhaps explain why he stopped. "It's an unexplainable kind of thing."

John Kaitz of Aptos was the only other Santa Cruz Coast Athletic League winner with a toss of 132-11 to win the discus competition.

The girls' varsity was dominated by local athletes as Aptos' Johnson and Karen Cantoni each won two events as did SLV's Jackie Hale.

Johnson established herself as the CCS favorite in the 300 and then set a school record in the 100 low hurdles with a 15.0 clocking. Cantoni avenged a loss to Harbor's Kelly Blafeld in the league meet by edging her by a second in the 800 (2:22.6), but had more than enough left in the mile to slice her personal best time by 29 seconds down to a first-place 5:28.2.

Hale ran away from the field to win the shot put in 36-4 and also won the discus in 122-4, coming through on her final attempt to edge Gilroy's Cindy Teller who had only minutes before taken the lead.

"Our whole league really did well," said Aptos Coach Mark Magagna. "We were all very pleased."

Jay Avenmarg of SLV set a school record in the boys' 800 with a second-place timing of 1:55.1, while Pat Rainey of Harbor also set a school record in the mile of 4:33.4, good enough for fifth place. John Kladius of Harbor was second in the high jump with a leap of 6-2.

The Soquel 400 relay team of Cleveland, David Locke, Rod Brower, Duane Woodlief set a school record with a third-place time of 43.1. John Van Ness then teamed with Brower, Locke and Woodlief in the 1600 relay and the Knights finished second in 3:24.7.

Jenny Smith of Soquel was second in the girls' two mile in 12:22.1 and teammate Cindy Folston third in the long jump with a school record 16-1¼. Heidi Skewis gave the Knights another school mark in the triple jump with a second-place leap of 36-3 that vaulted her into the CCS' top 10 in the event.

Gina Starr of Mareilo Prep placed third in the 300 low hurdles in 49.4 and teammates Lesley Anderson and Joan Scibetta placed sixth in the discus and shot putt, respectively. Besides her second in the 800, Harbor's Blafeld was also fourth in the 400.

Harbor's 400 relay team of Cindy Graver, Michelle Haberman, Shanna Factor and Blafeld was second, while Soquel's foursome of Erin Hite, Skewis, Folston and Stacy Stiller was third. Barbara Schmidt of Soquel was fourth in the 100 low hurdles to qualify for the CCS meet.

The top four finishers in each event at the Regional IV meet will advance to the CCS championships Friday at San Jose City College. The top three finishers in the CCS meet will then qualify for the Northern California meet May 27-28 at Berkeley.
