

That event was the 100-meter hurdles.

Both runners got off to an adequate start and were running side by side most of the way. The most minute mistake by either runner would have meant defeat. At the end, Maxie won, although both runners were timed in a 1984 Central Coast Section-best and meet-record 13.7 seconds.

Maxie used a loss to Brown the previous week to help motivate her for Friday's race.

""I wanted to show that you could win a race and be a lady about it. I'm sure at the time she did it, she wasn't thinking about it. I wanted to keep thinking about it."


After beating Maxie in the 100 hurdles last week at CSM, Brown raised her arms in the air and looked skyward in jubilation. It was a gesture of happiness after her first-ever hurdles victory over Maxie.

"We're actually friends," Maxie said. "It's only a rivalry when you make it that way. I don't think of it that way because you want to deal with people outside of track, but it's hard when you're always reading about us."

The day was far from a total loss for Brown, however. She won the triple jump (she already had won the long jump and high jump Wednesday) to help Woodside take the girls' team title, 87-72, over Menlo-Atherton.

Maxie also won the 330 hurdles in a meet-record 41.5 and gave the Vikings a substantial lead in the 1,600 relay. Mills finished second in that race as M-A came back to win.

Brown won the triple jump at 41-10½, beating teammate Tina Robinson, who went 36-4½. Brown set meet records in both the triple jump and long jump.

"That's pretty good, but it's not great," Brown said. "I like the pit better at San Jose (City College, the site of the CCS meet next Friday). I want to go 45 in the triple jump there, 21 in the long jump and 6-3 in the high jump. I know I can do 6-3. I also want to try 6-4. San Jose is a world-record place for me."

M-A freshman Angie Daniels, who was disqualified in the 400 but placed second in the 200, came back with a tremendous effort as the anchor of the Bears' winning 1,600 relay team. Her split was 59.3, and she overcame a 50-yard deficit. Maxie's split for Mills, on the second leg, was 54.5.

Sophomore LaShun Peters won the 100 (tying a meet record at 12.2) and 200 for Woodside, giving the Wildcats a total of five firsts. Woodside also had four seconds.

M-A was paced by Daniels, Clarissa Peer, Winnie Burns and Sheila Farris. Peer won the 400, was third in the 200 and ran in the 1,600 relay. Burns won the 800, took fourth in the 330 hurdles and ran in the 1,600 relay (Meg Williams also ran in the relay). Farris took the shot put Wednesday.

Mike King was a big reason M-A's boys finished a strong second. King won both hurdles, running 39.2 in the intermediates.

"My steps were all off today," King said. "I think I could go for the low 38s in the CCS. Speed is my strongest point, but we have people who can run faster in the sprints, and the hurdles turned out to be my best event."

Roland Anderson, a sophomore, won the shot put at 50-6 and Charles Smith tied for second in the 100 to help the Bears' cause.

San Mateo's Matt Giusto won the two-mile in a meet-record 9:17.3 and then took the mile in 4:20.6.

"I was a little tired after the twomile race," said Giusto, who will attend the University of Arizona. "I didn't feel too well in the race and my throat was dry. I went too fast on the first mile, and that put me off balance for the rest of the race. I tried to relax and not push too hard."
