## Cleveland, Blafeld star in meet

"I was dead from the 800," explained Blafeld. "I could barely get out of the blocks in the 100, so everyone had a jump on me."

Gary McConnell, a Harbor assistant, was confident at that point. "I think we're going to win the girls' championship now," he said. "Kelly (Ilnicki) can jog and win the mile. If Soquel can

take second and third, we will win."

Ilnicki did win the mile (as she had the two-mile earlier) and, indeed, the second and third places were captured by the Soquel runners to cancel out any chance for the Condors to pick up big points. That wrapped it up for the Harbor girls, but they did go on to win the mile relay for a final total of 108 points, while North County recorded 91, Soquel was third at 77.

Ilnicki ran her mile and two-mile

in similar fashion. "She just runs with the leaders until the last lap and then hits it," said Harbor Coach Bob Enzweiler. "The two-mile run isn't even a workout for her."

Watsonville's Susan Pnijk won two field events. She threw the shot put 34-10 and the discus at 104-0. Marelo Prep's Gina Slary won the 300-meter low hurdles for the third consecutive year with a time of 46.8 — but that was also because

of the shortened distance.

In the boys' competition, high jumper Chris Francis of Santa Cruz cleared the bar at school-record height of 6-5.

The day belonged to the legions from North County as they invaded Cabrillo College and came away with a sack-full of awards and the boys' championship. Cleveland and Blafeld led the individual performers on a day that went pretty much as was expected.

## Cleveland should star, but team track titles up in air

**APTOS** — Soquel High's multi-talented Johny Cleveland is favored to win four individual events Saturday at the Santa Cruz Coast Athletic League Track and Field Championships at Cabrillo College.

In Thursday's trials, Cleveland turned in the top qualifying times in both the 100 meters (11.0) and 220-yard dash (22.2). Although field events were not contested, Cleveland is also favored to win the long jump and triple jump at Saturday's finals.

The defending state long jump champion, Cleveland has leapt 24-0 1/2 this season and 40 feet even in the triple jump. He is

the defending SCAL titlist in both events. Cleveland appears to be in good form, despite recently having missed some scheduled practice workouts and meet competition.

"We won't run Cleveland in a relay," said Soquel Coach Mark McConnell. "He can score more (team) points for us as an individual than he can in a relay. We're going for the team championship."

Soquel and North Monterey County are expected to battle it out for the boys' varsity team title, with San Lorenzo Valley a darkhorse.

In the girls' varsity team chase, Harbor and North County are both even bets, with

Soquel and SLV expected to fight it out for third.

The SCAL championship meet will determine the official league champion, the dual meet results are not considered. The North County boys and the SLV girls were both unbeaten in dual meet competition this season.

Another individual expected to pile up some points for Soquel is distance runner Marc Goulet, who owns season-best times in the 800 meters (1:58), mile (4:21) and

two-mile (9:34). Leading the North County boys will be hurdler Juan Quintero, who is the man to beat in both the 110-meter high hurdles

and 300-meter intermediate hurdles. Quintero has run the highs in a season-best 14.8 and the intermediates in 39.8. While Cleveland owns the SCAL's best time in the intermediates, McConnell said Cleveland isn't going to run in the event Saturday.

"He prefers the 100 meters and 220-yard dashes," said McConnell. "It appears as if nobody will beat him on Saturday."

A major surprise in the girls' varsity competition Thursday was Soquel's Barbara Schmidt — out-beating Aptos' Jessica Johnson at the tape in the 100-meter low hurdles. Johnson, recovering from a bout with mononucleosis she ex-

perienced earlier in the season and did not begin competing until only a few weeks ago.

"Jessica's not herself right now, so it should be interesting in the finals," said McConnell of Johnson, the defending Central Coast Section champion in the 200 meters. "No one's counting her out, though, that's for sure."

Johnson, Kelly Blafeld of Harbor and freshman Mona Carrero of North County are expected to battle it out in both the 100 meters and 200-yard dashes.

Besides Blafeld, who owns the season's top times in both the 300 meters (26.3) and 400 meters (59.17), Harbor's attack is also

powered by distance runner Kelly Ilnicki. Going into the meet, Ilnicki has turned in season bests in the 800 meters (2:27), mile (5:11) and two-mile (12:25).

In the 300-meter low hurdles, SLV's Christi Bentley was fastest qualifier (40.0) and bettered her own school record by 1.5 seconds.

The top five finishers in all varsity events qualify for the Region IV meet on May 12 at Hartnell College in Salinas.

The SCAL Championships are to get underway with the field events at 10 a.m. Saturday. The running events are set to begin at 1 p.m.
