STANFORD - While Woodside High's Wendy Brown was busy establishing herself as one of the alltime best female triple jumpers in the nation, Wildcat teammate LaShun Peters was just as impressive in Saturday's Stanford Track Invitational in the high school division.

Brown triple jumped 41-61/2 to again better the recorded national mark. Brown had jumped 41-111/2 last weekend in an unrecognized bid

for the national record.

Brown also won the long jump in 18-43/4, and did the 100 low hurdles in 14.38 to win that event.

Peters took both the 200 and 100, with times of 25.9 and 12.5 respec-

tively.

Peters and Brown also helped Woodside's 400 meter relay team to a first-place finish with a 48.65 best in the Central Coast Section this year. Peters took the baton as the third runner and raced into first place. Brown extended the winning margin running anchor.

"I saw the girl had five yards on me," said Peters. "So I just did what

I had to do - catch her."

Peters runs while chewing gum because "it keeps me relaxed," she said. "When I finish I don't breath as hard."

Woodside finished second to Gunn in the girls' meet, with Menlo-Atherton fourth.

Maxie's 57.52 in 400 hurdles breaks national high school, American junior girls' marks

Mills High School's Leslie Maxie ran the women's 400-meter hurdles in 57.52 seconds Saturday in Arizona to set a national high school girls' record and the American junior (under-19) record.

The old record was 57.60, set by Gayle Kellon of Walnut High last year in Los Angeles.

Maxie, a junior at Mills, set the record in the Sun Angel Invitational track meet at Arizona State University. She finished fourth.

"I was very nervous," said Maxie, who was competing against open national-caliber competition for the first time. "I just kept trying to tell myself, 'I can handle it. If I couldn't, I wouldn't be here.'

"It was fun. It was an experi-

Maxie is the defending state high school champion in the girls' 400 meters.

Maxie's mark will not be recognized as a state high school record because the California Interscholastic Federation (the body that governs high school sports in this state) only recognizes marks set in high school meets.

In a nonleague invitational meet involving five Peninsula high schools Saturday at Stanford Stadium, Woodside's Wendy Brown surpassed what until Friday had been the national high school girls' triple-jump record with a leap of 41-6½. Unfortunately for Brown, however, Berkeley's Yvette Bates went 41-10 Friday in the Fresno Bee Games.

Brown, who has a wind-aided 41-11½ jump this year, was unaware of Bates' jump at the time of her Prep track 4-8

personal-best leap.

"I woke up this morning feeling like I could break the record," Brown said. "I was looking forward to it. It was a nice day, although it may have been a little too warm. It was a comfortable day to jump, and the triple jump pit here has good footing."

Brown also won the long jump and 100-meter hurdles and anchored the winning 400 relay team. Brown long-jumped 18-43/4 and ran 14.38 in the hurdles.

Brown joined LaShun Peters, Tina Robinson and Tira Maximovich in running a 48.65 in the relay, the fastest mark in the Central Coast Section this season.

Gunn beat Woodside, 59-53, to capture the girls' title. Palo Alto (50) was next, followed by Menlo-Atherton (47) and Los Altos (29).

In the boys' meet, Gunn scored $72\frac{1}{3}$ points to easily outdistance Woodside $(55\frac{1}{3})$. Los Altos was third with $50\frac{1}{3}$ points, followed by Palo Alto (48) and an incomplete M-A team (27).

Peters also had a solid day for Woodside. In addition to the relay, Peters won both the 100 and 200.

"If I know I can beat someone, I'm not going to be nervous," Peters said, "but if I don't know someone in the race, then I get a little bit nervous. I try to think about what I have to do, the time I want to run and how I'm going to do it. Sometimes I think about what I'm going to do right after the race. I was just trying to keep my stride and speed the same when I got out

in front (in the 200)."

Peters invariably has a fast start, which helped her run 12.5 in the 100. Peters has run an 11.8 in that event and believes she can surpass that time in the near future.

"I don't have a very good finish,"
Peters said, "so I've been working
on getting a strong finish. I'm not
too worried about my starts."

Peters ran the 200 in 25.9.

Danette Vercher won both the discus (123-0) and shot put (36-91/4) for Gunn.

Tanya Bynoe won the 400 in 1:00.64 and helped Gunn win the mile relay in 4:24.7. Bynoe also placed second in the 800 behind M-A's Winnie Burns.

Dave Campbell won two events for Gunn's boys, running 49.85 in the 400 and also winning the 800.

Los Altos' Jack Mohr won the discus at 157-11 and the shot in 52-9.

Palo Alto's Don Powell won the low hurdles in 15.68 and was narrowly beaten in the 100 by Woodside's Troy Garner, 11.73 to 11.75.
