About 10 minutes after her false start the first of her three-year high school career — Johnson regained her composure in time to win her heat in the trials of the

Taking out her frustration in the 200, Johnson held off defending Region champ Nicole Caldwell of Redwood Christian in a tight head-to-head duel over the final 50 24.7 seconds. Caldwell, who earlier had won the 100 meters, was so devastated by winning that she immediately fell to the ground in tears.

Later, Johnson anchored the Mariners' 1600 meter relay team to a third-place "I'm glad this day is over," Johnson

said. "I can't wait to forget it — at least some of it."

While there was more than enough disappointment to go around for Santa Cruz Coast Athletic League athletes, there were plenty of victories as well.
