Comfort, whose senior class is graduating Sunday, recovered from a cold to qualify with a 54-6 mark.

"I've had to put everything behind me," Comfort said. "I had to postpone dates with my girlfriend. I've been training since Oct. 21. I made the top nine, and that is all I care about."

Bunnell qualified for the finals with a subpar 56-4 mark. Bunnell, who said he felt nervous because he was the favorite, won the Central Coast Section title last week with a mark of 63-2½. Bunnell's toss last week was the seventh-best in the nation this year.

"I definitely was nervous," Bunnell said. "I had no power source."

Clark, Olson advance to the finals

NORWALK — For a few harrowing moments Friday night, Mountain View High School's Shannon Clark must have been terrified.

Clark — the two-time defending state champion in the 1,600 meters — had the third-fastest time in that event among the nine girls who qualified in the trials for today's finals in the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) state track and field meet at Cerritos College.

Clark's name initially was not announced among those of the nine qualifiers. After a review of the videotape, however, meet officials discovered it was a matter of misidentification. Clark indeed was the third-fastest qualifier with a time of 4:54.77.

Another Peninsula girl who earned a berth in today's finals was Palo Alto's Mary Karen Olson, who surprised herself by qualifying fourth in the 300 hurdles. Olson finished third in last week's Central Coast Sec-

There are no prohibitive favorites among the 16 Peninsula high school girls who have qualified for this year's California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) meet at Cerritos College in Norwalk on Friday and Saturday.

Unlike last year, when Mills High School's Leslie Maxie won the 300-meter hurdles for her third state title, no Peninsula girl athlete is regarded as a strong favor-

Among the local hopefuls, Mills' Buffy Sexton and St. Francis' Karen Lawson each have outside chances to win titles in field events, and Mountain View's Shannon Clark will attempt to earn her third consecutive title in the 1,600

meters.

Sexton earned Central Coast Section titles in the shot put and discus, but she will need to improve her marks to earn similar honors at the state level.

Sexton had a life-best 42-9½ in the shot put at the CCS finals last week, but will need an exceptional effort to defeat favorite Brandi Gail of Rowland. Gail won the Southern Section with a put of 47-4½.

The state meet record is 52-7½ set by Fullerton's Natalie Kaaiawahia in 1983.

Sexton took the CCS discus title with a throw of 130-1. Sequoia's Jennifer Ruff also qualified for the state meet by finishing third.

Lawson's best chance for a state title is in the long jump. She placed



Clark, the two-time defending state champion in the 1,600, will be hard-pressed to repeat. Clark finished second to Gunderson's Laurie Chapman in the CCS meet.

Mitty's Andreen Alvarenga could qualify for the finals in the 400. She had a life-best 55.71, which bettered her own CCS-best mark.

State Prep Track and Field Meet

San Diego Entrants Start Slow, Finish Strongly

NORWALK—Things did not look good for the San Diego Section for a while at Friday's State track meet trials at Cerritos College. A few injuries here and a couple of sub-par performances there cast a shadow on the section's hopes, which had looked so promising before the meet began.

But with some strong showings in the later events, things again look hopeful for the section to have one of its strongest performances in years at the finals, which begin at noon today with the girls' discus.

Brian Boggess of El Capitan High School was both one of the key disappointments early in the day and one of the bright spots at the end.

Boggess came into the meet as the second qualifier in the discus with a best of 191-feet 3-inches. Boggess' warm-up throws were all more than 180 feet, but the best he could manage was a 164-11 when the throws counted. He finished seventh among the nine qualifiers.

On his last throw, the announcer made an announcement just as Boggess was to release the discus.

Boggess was visibly upset.

"I heard him," said Boggess, who was throwing in front of few of the estimated 6,200 fans early in the day. "As soon as I released that last one, I knew I was dead."

He in a much happier mood after

he threw 60-1 to qualify second in the shotput. That also made Boggess more hopeful about his chances in the discus.

"The discus taught me a lesson," Boggess said. "It taught me you can't be too confident and you can't think you're too ready. I was too complacent. With a different group, I might not have made finals.

"I felt a lot better in the shot. I'm going to take them one at a time tomorrow [Saturday]. The discus may be more important. If I come back and win that, it will show I can come back from adversity and show what kind of competitor I am."

Many questioned Laura Chapel's decision to try to double in the 800-and 1,600-meter races. But after running strongly in two qualifying races Friday, the critics have gone into hiding.

Chapel had no problem winning her heat of the 800 meters. She hung back and did not take the lead until only 100 meters remained. Chapel's time of 2:10.92 was the second fastest of the day.

Denise Upsher of Torrey Pines improved her previous best time by two seconds and qualified third in the 800 (2:11.21).

Chapel got boxed in early in the first heat of the 1,600, but she went wide and finished with a group of four that was separated by only

nine-hundredths of a second.

"I felt really good with the double today," said Chapel, who was fourth at 4:55.46. "I want to win the half so bad. We'll just see what I have left in the mile later in the day."

Darcy Arreola of Grossmont was second in that same heat. Arreola set the pace, as she usually does. But Arreola, who dropped the 800, said that her only goal was qualifying.

"I just took it easy," said Arreola, who ran a 4:55.38. "I felt like I could have run my fastest time if I had been pushed."

San Diego Section's best event was the girls' discus. Both Tracy Crawford of Southwest and Lori Parker of Ramona qualified, as expected. Crawford was the top qualifier with a throw of 150-0. But the surprise was Terri Mann of Point Loma, who, throwing the discus for the first year, qualified third with a throw of 146-7, 10 feet better than her previous best. Parker was the fourth qualifier at 142-0.

Crawford came back later and qualified third in the shotput with a throw of 42-2½. Kartsie Leppaluoto of Madison was the fourth qualifier at 42-1½.

That was the good news, but there was plenty of bad news early in the day.

Michelle Outlaw of Lincoln

looked strong and was running second in the 100 low hurdles. But she hit the seventh hurdle hard with her trail knee and nearly fell. She finished second to last in her heat.

"That's the second year in a row," Outlaw said. "Last year I hit the seventh hurdle, too. I hit hard at Mt. SAC, but this hurts more than ever."

Outlaw came back with her knee heavily bandaged to finish third in her heat of the 300 hurdles with a time of 44.73 but failed to qualify for the finals.

An injury caused Yolanda Fitch of Morse to have a disappointing day as well. Fitch has had a problem with her right hip and she aggravated the injury during the 400 relay early Friday.

Fitch came back to run the 100 meters but finished last in her heat. She was forced to scratch in the 400 meters, where she figured to finish in the top six.

Sophomore Charles Huff of La Jolla had won the section long jump title with a jump of 23-4½, but Huff did not jump farther than 22 feet and failed to make the finals.

In the girls' triple jump, the last event, Jackie Anderson of Mount Miguel qualified with a jump of 38-1 and freshman LaFrania West of Grossmont qualified with a jump of 37-944.

Maggie Henson, Yleana Carrasco and Kaleaph Carter led Orange County performers in the first day of the State high school track meet Friday at Cerritos College.

The first day of the two-day tournament is something like a wedding rehearsal as athletes jockey for position in today's final, where the medals are actually won.

Each event had three flights of nine athletes each, with the nine best times or distances among those 27 advancing to the final.

Carrasco, Henson and Carter each distinguished themselves in front of the crowd of 6,200 by winning their events on a cool and windy evening, one that many of the athletes complained worked against them.

Among them was Katella High School's Terry Johnson, who placed second overall in the 110-and 300-meter hurdles.

Following his heat in the 110 hurdles, Johnson fretted that a strong crosswind might throw off his stride in the longer race, which is run on a curve.

"My start was excellent in this race (110), but sometimes the wind can blow you from side to side," Johnson said. "Now [in the 330] I've just got to make sure that I get in my 13 steps between hurdles.

"If it picks up, it might cause me to stutter-step."


Johnson looked smooth in both races, turning in a 14.13 in the shorter race and a 37.86 in the longer one.

The wind didn't seem to bother Anaheim High's Carrasco, however, as her high jump of 5-feet 6-inches gave her first place.

Five other jumpers also cleared 5-6, including Debbie Orr of Ocean View, but Carrasco won by virtue of least number of misses. Orr placed fourth and Lisa Coleman of Marina (5-5) ninth to qualify for the final.

The other field event winner of the night from the county was Edison's Carter, whose shotput of 60-10³4 outdistanced El Capitan's Brian Boggess' toss of 60-1.

While many of the other athletes at the meet sported T-shirts of rock groups or colleges, Carter and teammate Mike Smyser opted for something more mystical.

can make the difference between winning and losing."

Whatever, the Vital Force was certainly with Carter, the Chargers' sophomore sensation who put himself in a good position to win the state championship when the shotput final begins at 7 tonight.

Another good bet for a state title from a county athlete would be Newport Harbor's Henson, who advanced to the final in the 800 and 1,600 runs.

Henson placed seventh overall in the longer race in a time of 4:55.40 but won the 800 in 2:10.66. When told of her time after the race, Henson asked, "Can you check that? It didn't feel that fast at all."

If it didn't feel fast, it certainly looked that way as Henson outdistanced the other runners in her heat in the two-lap race.

"I felt kind of alone the last 220 yards," she said. "I was worried that the pace wasn't fast enough."

The pace turned out to be fast enough for both the win and an assignment to lane No. 5 for the start of the final, an advantage if only she can see where the rest of the field is before breaking to the inside after the first lap.

A medal for placing among the top six finishers would make a nice going-away present for the University of Mississippi-bound senior, one who is also going to Hawaii for a vacation after graduation later this month.

Other county athletes who advanced to the finals and have opportunities to win medals include, among the girls, El Modena's Shellie Lovati in the discus and shotput; Edison's Nicole Richot and Mission Viejo's Kathy Grayson in the 800; Ocean View's Debbie Orr in the triple jump; and the Mission Viejo 1,600 relay team.

Those who qualified from the county for the boys' finals include Anaheim's Mike Fritz in the 400; Villa Park's Jim Sorenson in the 800; Servite's Steve Williams, Estancia's Doug Miller, and Foothill's Steve Slocum in the pole vault, and Corona del Mar's Michael Bain in the discus.

State Prep Track and Field Preliminaries

He Qualifies for Final, Then Races for Diploma

Call the State high school track preliminaries Friday night at Cerritos College a director's delight. While long on events, with three heats for most every race, and short on surprises, it set the scene for today's finals (first field event at noon, first race at 6 p.m.).

Not that the day did not have its unforgettable moments, especially for Matt Large of Desert, who, with an assist from the school's student body and various other props, qualified for the final in the 800 and graduated a couple of hours later.

Large's heat was scheduled to start at 6:06 p.m., and graduation for the school at Edwards Air Force Base, approximately 125 miles away, was set for 6. No problem. The senior class voted to delay the ceremonies until 8, and Large arranged for transportation from the stadium to Long Beach Airport and from there to the base. He wasn't the leading man on the track but did manage to squeeze in a 1:51.47 to qualify for today's nine-man field.

Quite a day, except that it wasn't over. The script then called for Large to drive to Anaheim and join classmates in post-graduation festivities at Disneyland. Finally, he would go to Laguna Beach, sleep late today in a condominium owned by the parents of his coach's wife and make it back to Cerritos College in time for the 6:47 p.m. final. Stay tuned.

One of the featured performers

in the 800, Neil Fitzgerald of San Francisco Ignatius, also had his day complicated by travel, except that this was unexpected. The flight from San Francisco to LAX at noon was canceled. The Ignatius team got another one at 2. They arrived in Los Angeles a little after 3, just in time for rush-hour traffic. They got to the stadium with 30 minutes to spare before Fitzgerald's race.

In the end, Fitzgerald didn't seem affected one bit. He not only won his heat, but he ran 1:50-94, the third-best time in the nation this year. It also set up one of today's best matchups, Fitzgerald against Vincent Thompson of Locke, who finished second in the State last season and won his heat Friday light in 1:53.31.

"I expect a fast first lap," said Fitzgerald, who beat Thompson at the Arcadia Invitational after previously losing to him indoors at the Sunkist Invitational. "We run with similar styles. I'll try to go out with a 53 (for the first 400 meters) and come back with something similar."

Marcus Hooks of Lakewood, who already has the 1986 lead in the triple jump, moved up to No. 5 on the all-time list in leading the qualifiers with a best of 52-5¾. That was a full two inches better than the wind-aided 50-5¾ by Terence Williams of Pasadena Muir.

"I want the record (52-10½ by Charles Mayfield of Muir in 1980)

real bad," said Hooks, who bettered the 50-foot barrier for the 11th straight competition. "I've only got one more day left. My coach, he just wanted me to jump to qualify, but I even surprised myself."

Steve Lewis, a junior from American of Fremont and a transfer from L.A. Banning, turned in the second-best time in the country in winning his 400 heat in 46.50. That was 1.23 seconds better than the next best qualifier, Marvin Douglas of L.A. Fremont.

Sophomore sensation Quincy Watts of Taft and senior Ronald McCree from Madera, the defending State champion at 100 meters, will have their anticipated showdowns in the sprints. Both won their heats in the 100 and the 200, with Watts leading all qualifiers in the 100 (10.61), followed by Muir's Corey Ealy (10.76). McCree won his race in 10.98.

Watts, whose only two losses this seasosn were to McCree, won the second heat of the 200 in 21.18 in advancing to a final that will also include Ealy, football star Terry Rodgers from Sweetwater of National City, Martin Cannady of Duarte and Curtis Rogers of Sacramento Johnson.
