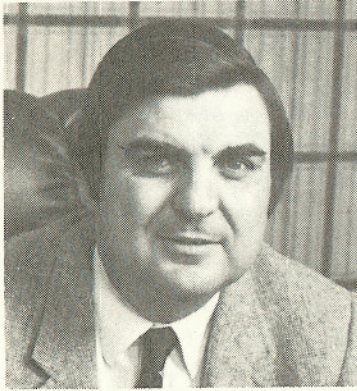

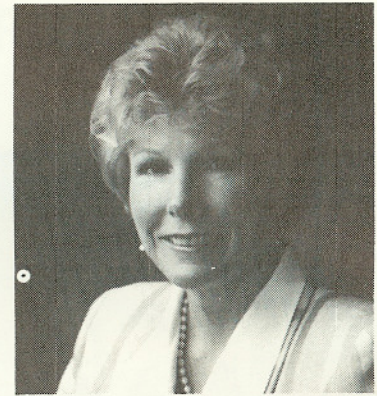

THE CIF: Doing the Job for Prep Sports Since 1914

In 1914, as high school athletic teams began crossing district lines to compete with neighboring schools, the CIF was established to provide consistency in sports rules and a safe, rewarding environment for young California athletes. Since that beginning, with fewer than 20,000 athletes, the organization has grown to become the largest youth agency in the state, serving over 500,000 young student-athletes each year.

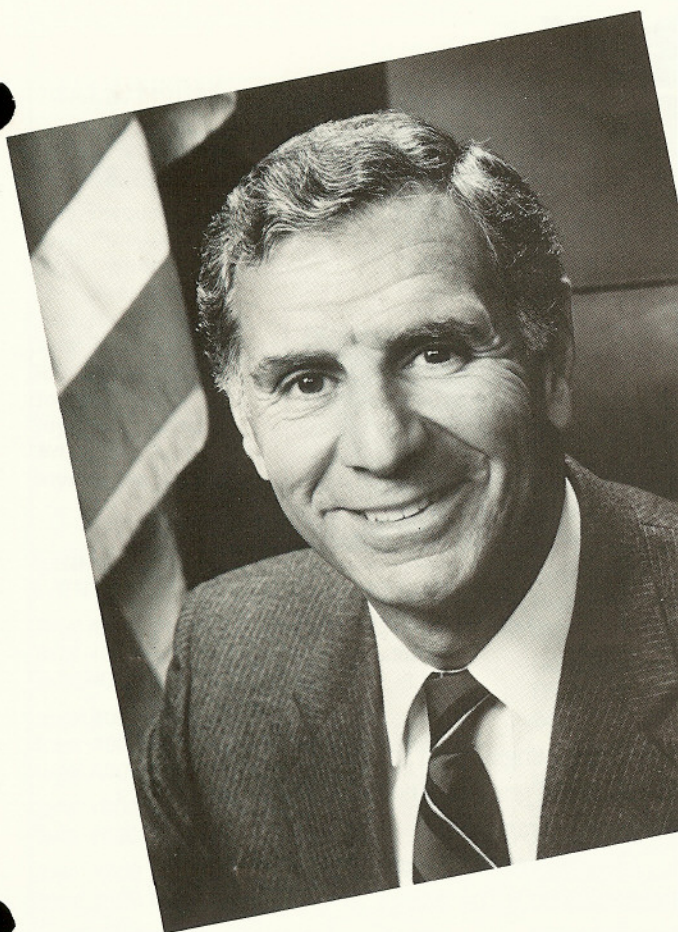
During dynamic growth years, the CIF saw participation in high school sports double (for both boys and girls) between 1965-1975, and, although since 1978 some leveling-off has occurred in numbers of students participating, indications are that such a trend is due more to a lack of available school programs rather than to a lack of interest or desire on the students' part.

Few Californians realize that the CIF, the sole administrative body of interscholastic athletics, is an independent organization that has been carefully structured to provide needed services to the youth of the state without placing unfair burdens on the public education system. Athletic programs conducted in all 1200 secondary-schools in the state do not exist simply because students desire to participate in sports. The CIF utilizes the volunteer services of over 10,000 persons who are charged with the task of ensuring effective athletic programs for all of the public, private, and parochial high schools of the state.

As a result of effective planning, sound program administration, and a determination to support the philosophy that all student-athletes in our state should be provided with equal participation opportunities, the CIF has propelled California into uncontested leadership in the nurturing of outstanding athletes. Former and current California high school athletes hold more national records than do students from any other state — and our youngsters continue to be highly recruited by top-notch universities across the country. Many of the names are legend — Amy Alcott, Rick Monday, Bill Walton, Pat Haden, John McKay, Scott McGregor, Ron Cuccia, Jill Sterkel, Sherri Howard; all former CIF athletes, all outstanding men and women of whom Californians can be proud.

Although the CIF has been serving California youth for nearly 70 years and can boast of having over four million "alumni," many are unaware of the diversity of CIF administrative responsibility. Day-to-day activities of the CIF state office in Fullerton include enforcing regulations, establishing state calendars of events, arranging and supervising state championships in four sports, maintaining individual and team sports records, providing publicity to the media, publishing the *State News*, and maintaining legal and insurance services which ensure the very existence of prep sports. In addition, 10 section commissioners throughout the state maintain full-time schedules to ensure that prep athletic events in their areas are operated effectively, safely, and consistently.

The support of the California public has been responsible for the success and expansion of California athletic programs for 72 years. With the continued cooperation and dedication of school superintendents, principals, and athletic directors, as well as the keen interest of over one-half million students and their families each year, the future of prep sports would appear to be bright and healthy. The CIF urges you to lend your support to our young student-athletes by attending high school sporting events in your community on a regular basis. The CIF welcomes you to this championship event; a showcase of some of our finest young California athletes — our nation's future leaders.

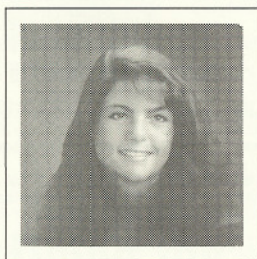

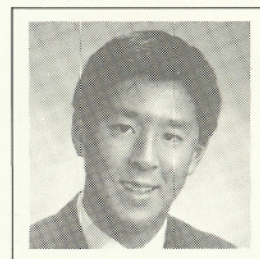

Paul plans to attend Harvard, majoring in engineering and communications and would like to become a research professor.

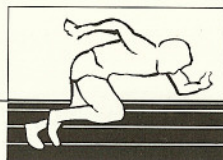
Chan is the senior class valedictorian and a National Merit Scholar. He will graduate first in his class of 551 with a grade point average of 4.21.

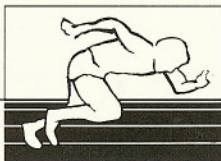

When this 5'7", 136 pound senior, speeds down to her last state meet tape, you will be witnessing a bit of history. The moment she hits the tape she may very well be acclaimed as the finest, all-around sprinter/hurdler in California history. This weekend she'll be pursuing the accomplishments of Leslie Maxie Mills (Millbrae).

The common element between these ladies? They have won state titles or been nationally ranked in the 200, 400, 100 hurdles and 300 hurdles. In her prep career Maxie ran 23.44, 53:07, 13:74, and a national record 40.18. In her junior year she ran the 400 hurdles in another national prep record of 55.20. In that race she just missed making the U.S. Olympic team finishing fifth at the trails.

How does Vickers compare? 24.02, 52.25, 13.47 and 41.32. Janeene also has a national championship to her credit. This past March she captured the 400 at the Pathmark meet in New Haven Connecticut. Her time of 54.85 led the nation and is the 8th best mark in prep history.

Making all-time lists is something that both Vickers and Leslie do very well. Maxies rankings in national and state history are 200 (13th and 6th), 400 (21st and 7th), 100 hurdles (31st and 9th), 300 hurdles (1st and 1st). Vickers by comparison comes in at 200 (3rd nationally in '87), 400 (12th and 6th), 100 hurdles (6th and 2nd) and in the 300 hurdles (3rd and 3rd).

This season Vickers has added another facet to her repertoire. The 100 meter dash. Vickers is among the state leaders in the short dash having won the event at Mt. SAC in a time of 11.89w. She also won both hurdles at that meet with times of 13.7h and 42.54. The latter leads the state.

What will she run at state? Obviously she would be the favorite in just about anything she chooses. She will forego the 400 meter dash due to its proximity to the 100 meter hurdles. However she will be the force to be reckoned with in the 100 as well as the 100 and 300 low hurdles.

She will also see relay duty, anchoring Pomona's 1600 meter

Paul Thomas often examines the bulletin board in the coaches' office at Jesuit High School. The tiny numbers typed on one particular sheet of yellow paper provide encouragement and impetus to one of the nation's leading prep distance runners before he embarks on his daily chores.

"Not many schools can put their board up against ours," Thomas says.

Thomas is referring to the list of all-time Jesuit performers in the three longest track events — 800, 1,600 and 3,200 meters. And he's right. Few schools in the country can match the fast times at Jesuit High.

For proof, consider only that Thomas, a senior who competed in the shadows of Eric and Mark Mastalir the last three years, led the nation at 3,200 meters for most of this spring with a clocking of 8 minutes, 53.92 seconds. Yet his time places him no better than third on Jesuit's all-time list.

Or that in March he ran an indoor mile in 4:12.24, also fastest in the nation for 1987. Again, good for third behind the Mastalirs.

Climbing that list can be an exhausting proposition, even for a runner as talented and dedicated as Thomas. The school records at 800 (1:50.70, Pat McCrystle, 1980), 1,600 (4:05.58, Mark Mastalir, 1986) and 3,200 (8:44.95) are all Sac-Joaquin Section marks besides. But Thomas is making progress, and the heart of the season, including the California Interscholastic Federation state meet at Hughes Stadium, awaits.

Thomas is fulfilling the promise he first showed as a 114-pound freshman in the fall of 1983. Paul's older brother, Jim, previously alerted Jesuit coach Walt Lange about his precocious younger brother, who ran a 4:58 mile at the age of 11.

"Jim told us his brother was a much better runner than he was," Lange says. "I didn't pay too much attention to it at the time."

Lange, who since 1971 has coached 17 Jesuit runners under the 9:30 mark in the two-mile run, pays attention to results.


relay team. She is an excellent relay runner having anchored the United States junior team to the world title last summer. Can Vickers bring Pomona a state title? A possibility now that Hawthorne is out of the 400 relay and their sprinters are nursing some injuries. Most of all she hopes to duplicate her double of 86, where she won both hurdles in 13.74 and 41.32.


Who will give her competition? Most likely a set of Arcadia Invitational champions. In the 100h Vickers will be pushed by junior La Shawn Simmons of El Monte. Simmons captured the short hurdles at Arcadia in a then national ad state leading 13.78. In the longer race Effie Daetz of Leigh (San Jose) who is third in the nation and second in the state with a 42.72. In the 100 she will face the defending state champion, Angela Burnham (Rio Mesa, Oxnard).

Besides repeating state championships Vickers hopes to repeat some other honors as well. Last year she was an all-American in the 400 and 300 hurdles and was the Gatorade Athlete of the Year in the western region. Her honors aren't confined to just the track as she is a 3.49 student and member of California Scholarship Federation.

Next year she will help the rich get richer. Next fall she will enter UCLA on a track scholarship. There she hopes to go on to national titles and Olympic glory. Just one problem coach. What event?

Thomas produced immediately. He finished second in the varsity race at the prestigious Clovis Invitational cross-country meet, less than a month into his freshman year.

"It was obvious from the beginning he had tremendous talent," Lange says. "Paul has a beautiful stride. I call him the greyhound. It's so smooth."

Nagging injuries and illnesses hindered Thomas the next two years, although he managed to run 9:20.6 for 3,200 meters as a sophomore, just missing a state-meet berth.

He emerged as a national-class runner his junior year, improving to 9:05.27 in the Sac-Joaquin Section championship meet, completing a 1-2-3 Jesuit sweep of the event. But one week later, at the state meet in Norwalk, he finished a disappointing half-lap behind Eric Mastalir in 9:25.

"I'd hate for that to happen this year," Thomas says. "I thought there was a lot of pressure on me, but there really wasn't."

Lange says, "The record shows he's a lot more consistent. He hasn't had a blow-up this year."

Eric Mastalir, currently redshirting his freshman track season at Stanford, says he's not surprised to see his former teammate taking off where he and his brother left off.

"He's definitely as good as either one of us were," Mastalir says.

Thomas will attend the University of Arkansas in the fall on a track scholarship. The Rancho Cordova resident doesn't run away from competition, choosing Jesuit for his high school, Arkansas for his college.

"I didn't think he'd be interested in coming to the Midwest," says Arkansas coach John McDonnell. "When he got here, he realized it's a prettier place than he thought."

Fayetteville is pretty. But starter, please fire the recall gun. The Midwest?

"We're almost in Kansas," McDonnell asserts.

Such geographical liberties don't sway Thomas, who simply wants to be all that he can be as a runner. McDonnell's track record with distance runners is exemplary. Arkansas won the 1986 NCAA cross country championship and has replaced Oregon as the nation's most fertile spawning ground for distance runners.

"I'm not a big-city kid," Thomas says. "I think it'll be neat, leaving California, going away to school."

His roommate at Arkansas will be Eric Henry, whose recent 8:52.2 clocking for 3,200 eclipsed Thomas' time as the national leader. Henry also anchored McCullough High (The Woodlands, Texas) to a national record in the distance medley relay. McCullough's 9:53.31 beat Jesuit's year-old mark of 9:56.3, to which Thomas contributed an 800-meter leg.

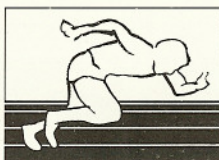
"We only had it one year," Thomas says. "I'm trying to decide whether it's better that a friend helped break it. I guess it is."

Thomas will attempt a 1,600-3,200 double at the state meet, encouraged by the favorable time schedule that allows runners a break of nearly two hours between races. The once-frail freshman now carries 157 sturdy pounds on a 6-foot frame and has displayed an ability to run two fast races in a single day.

Thomas prefers the mile, saying, "It's the glamour event around the world. I haven't heard too many people say, 'Hey, let's go to a track meet and watch the two-mile.'"

Following the state finals, Thomas will have the opportunity to chase fast times at the Golden West Invitational in Sacramento and the Keebler Invitational in Chicago.

Thomas believes he can bring his mile time down to 4:04 or 4:05, which would give future Marauders something to contemplate as they head off toward the American River on a quiet run.

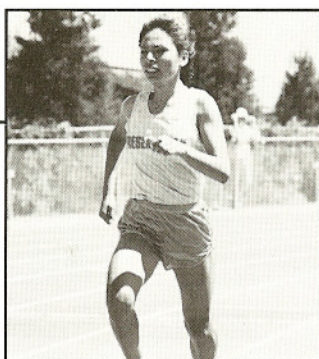
BRENT BURNS/Acalanes

What does the future hold? Possibly the decathlon. Along with good natural speed the Acalanes senior has thrown over 50' in the shot and has high jumped 6' 2".



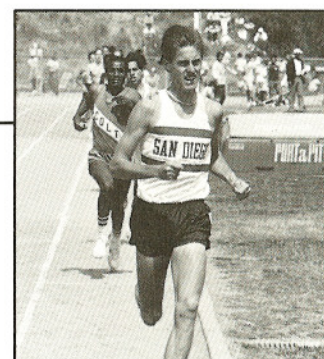

After high school he will attend the University of Arizona where he hopes to prepare for the 1992 Olympics. Once college is done, he wants to continue running and, of course, be the best.



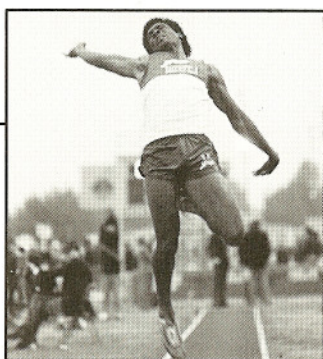

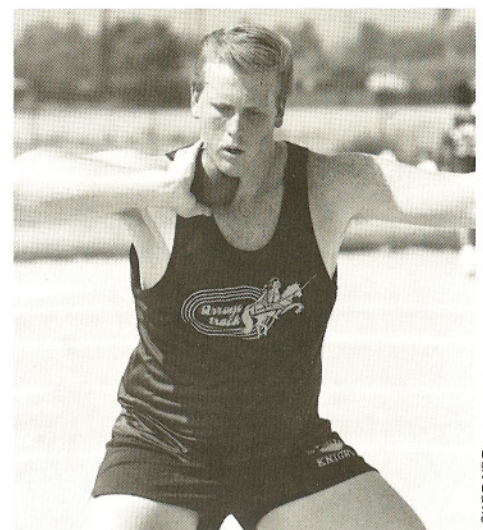
