### NOT JUST ANOTHER MEET

# Arcadia Invitational once again produces a national record and a big-time effort from Muir's Haslip

o the non-enthusiasts, the Footlocker/ Arcadia Track and Field Invitational is just another meet that prepares the individual athletes for the CIF section, masters and state meets in May and early June.

The enthusiasts know better, and several of the competitors who made the excursion to Arcadia on April 9 would attest to that feeling.

"CIF and State is what you're shooting for, but this is special because of the competition," said 1993 100 meter state champion Bryan Howard of Canyon Springs in reference to the event that includes several state champions from places outside California.

Besides Howard, who finished second in the 100, the event was highlighted by peformances from Top Male Athlete Kenny Haslip of Pasadena Muir and Top Female Athlete Suzy Powell of Modesto Downey.

Haslip, who won state titles in the 300 intermediate hurdles last season, had the finest night ever by a Muir athlete at Arcadia as he became the first in school history to

win four events. Besides being a member of Muir's winning relay teams in the 400 and 1600, he also took the top prize in the 110 high hurdles and 300 intermediate hurdles.

"I like it when people don't think I can do something," said Haslip, who has signed a football letter of intent with USC. "I used to think I could do it with speed alone. But it's more than that. You gotta have technique and concentration. All the work paid off."

It also worked for Powell, who set a new national interscholastic mark with a throw of 178 feet, 8 inches in the discus.

"I was real pleased with it," said a calm Powell, who is headed to UCLA. "It was great to get the national record, but I'm really shooting for a 185. I feel I can do that by the time state rolls around."

Powell is not the only one who feels that way. Most of the competing athletes believe Arcadia is a primer for a state title, but with one exception.

"You want to win," said Howard, who

was expected to duel with Redlands' Pat Johnson in a much anticipated showdown in the 100 meters.

That showdown did occur, but both were overshadowed when Jermaine Stafford of Rochester, New York, breezed past them at the finish line to take first place with a time of 10.46 seconds. Howard was second at 10.55 with Johnson third at 10.57.

"I was happy with (the run) at this time of year," Howard said. "Me and Pat were right there, then (Stafford) just blew by us. It was a real surpise, but we'll be ready by CIF."

Both Howard and Johnson broke from the starting blocks first and were neck and neck for the first 50 meters. Stafford, though, recovered with a sudden burst and nipped the duo at the finish line.

"We were right out in front, then he came out of nowhere," said Johnson, who was hampered by injuries last year before turning in the top mark in the state so far this year. "But that's Arcadia."

Not to be outdone was state high jump leader Jeremy Fischer. The senior from Camarillo won the event with a mark of 7-0, but not before fighting off a challange from Eisenhower's Art Lloyd, who took home the second-place medal with a mark of 6-8.

"I was hoping to make the meet mark of 7-2," said Fischer, who would clear 7-3 one week later at the Mt. San Antonio College Relays. "But I'll take this. Now I have a first, second and third in three seasons at

Arcadia. It's a little disapointing, but I'm real happy with the 7-0.

Another top performance was turned in by Muir's 1600 relay team, which outdueled Fredrick Douglass High of Atlanta, Georgia to take the top prize.

It wasn't the first time the two teams met and that's what pleased Muir's runners the most.

"When Atlanta said they were coming out here, we said they better bring their dogs," said Haslip, who helped Muir to its second victory over Douglass in the 1600 with a time of 3:13.38 compared to Douglass' 3:19.01. "We told them that because we were going to get them. This is our house. They tried to break in without a key...we weren't going to let it happen."

Muir also took the national lead in the 400 relay with a time of 41.09. They defeated Los Angeles Dorsey (41.80) and Long Beach Poly (41.88).

There were other new national lead marks set as well.

Cross country state champion Mebrathom Keflezighi of San Diego took over the national lead in the 1600 with a time of 4:08.32. He also placed second in the 3200. In the 1600, Keflezighi bested San Diego Section rival Mark Hauser of St. Augustine, who won a similar stride-to-stride showdown over Keflezighi the week before. Hauser's time at Arcadia was 4:09.46.

Also sizzling was Long Beach Poly's Andrea Anderson, who turned in a nice double with victories in the 100 (11.57) and 200 (23.48 wind-aided) and showed that the preseason talk of her taking over the mantle of nine-time state champion Marion Jones was right on the money.

Bell Gardens super sophomore Michael Granville won the 800 for the second year in a row and had a quick time of 1:51.90. He was even faster, though, on the indoor oval at the Sunkist meet in February (1:51.11), which was the leading time in the nation as of April 22.

In the girls 300 hurdles, the equivalent of Haslip was Oakland Skyline standout Angela Harris. She took home first-place honors with a national-best 42.33 time, which is far superior to the 42.76 mark she turned in while winning at last year's state meet. Harris also was part of Skyline's 1600 relay team, but the Titans got nipped in a thrilling race by Morningside. The Monarchs clocked 3:43.71. Skyline hit the line in 3:44.36. The times were ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in the nation at the time.

National bests, records and memories. Another year at Arcadia is in the books.





Johnson zipped to a 10.42 time and beat defending state champion Bryan Howard in the 100 meters at the Inland Empire meet on March 26.

I've never seen a guy do that."

Johnson said: "I was just like a bench warmer. I practiced hard like everybody else. And when we ran, I always tried to be first."

Johnson went on to miss one practice all season, and at the same time pulled his grades up. When the first quarter report cards came out, Johnson's grades had improved enough that he was eligible. But by that time, Redlands had advanced to the CIF Southern Section Division I quarterfinals and Johnson saw action for only a few plays.

Perhaps a more significant development coming out of the season was Johnson's budding friendship with teammate Sean Walker. It was Walker (no relation to Jim Walker) who began to encourage Johnson to think about running track in the spring.

"We were at football practice and he was telling me what a good runner he was," Sean Walker said. "We would run 100s (conditioning sprints) in practice and he was always out in front. I could just tell by his body shape and his speed that he would be good in track."

Sean Walker had to use every salesmanship trick to close this deal, though. Never having been exposed to track before, Johnson was a reluctant convert.

"Sean was the first one to bug me about track," Johnson said. "And he bugged me and bugged me. I was like, 'I don't want to. I don't want to. Leave me alone.' But after a while, I went, I guess I'm doing al lright."

There were other travails that first year, the biggest was the hip injury. Johnson felt a twinge near his left hip in the first meet of the season. He figured it was a hip pointer, he had hose before, and didn't feel it was bad enough o keep him from participating in the Bronco

Invitational at Cal Poly Pomona the following week.

"I was running the 4x100 and I pulled in like five people, but all (the muscles in the hip) just popped," Johnson said. "I tried to push it down, and work it out, but it would just creep up again."

The torn hip flexor kept Johnson out of action for most of the track season his junior year. After therapy, which included a lot of pool work that Johnson has kept up even now that he is healthy, he was able to get back on the track again at the end of the season. But he wasn't anywhere near 100 percent.

Still, Johnson served notice of what he was capable of with a fourth place finish in the 200 at the state meet. The three finishers in front of him were Calvin Harrison of North Salinas, Howard and Anthony Volsan of Merced. Johnson almost qualified for the finals in the 100, too. His time of 10.65 was .07 too slow.

Those accomplishments were tremendous considering Johnson was limited to a total of 16 races all season.

And during the month or so Johnson rehabilitated the injury, Sean Walker came through again with some valuable support.

"I almost quit, but the person who most influenced me to keep running was Sean," Johnson said. "It sucked, getting hurt. I don't

like to watch somebody else run. I don't like to watch a race thinking, I could have won that."

The one thing that coaches and teammates alike comment on is Johnson's work ethic. That's a big reason he was able to recover so quickly from his injury last year. That's also a big reason he has enjoyed such success this year.

"He practices real hard," Sean Walker said. "There are times we'll come out for practice and say we won't work hard, but he ends up giving 150 percent."

The year that Johnson put in on the scout teams paid off when football rolled around again last fall. He had spent part of the offseason learning the wing-T offense that Walker runs, and ended up claiming a starting halfback position. He gained over 700 yards rushing and picked up nearly 200 receiving,

attracting the interest of Oregon, UNLV, San Diego State and others.


"If I had him for one more year he would really be incredible," Jim Walker said. "We might have played him out of position at halfback. He might have been a wide receiver. But he did everything for us, he returned punts and kickoffs, ran the ball and caught it out of the backfield."

A recruiting trip to Eugene, Oregon, in January settled Johnson's college choice. "The recruiters tell you that you'll get a feeling that a school is where you want to go," Johnson said. "I went up there and that was it."

Johnson, who plans to play wide receiver in college, regretted telling the other schools about the decision, especially San Diego State since the new receivers coach at San Diego State, Dino Babers, is related to Johnson through marriage.

The future looks quite bright for Johnson. His grades have improved, the weight of choosing a college has been lifted from his shoulders, he's running free of injury. It appears Pat Johnson has found the fast track.

Said Jim Walker: "This has nothing to do with athletic ability, but I have a son due August 11, and I hope that he is as sincere as Pat is. I hope he has Pat's heart and I hope he has Pat's class."
